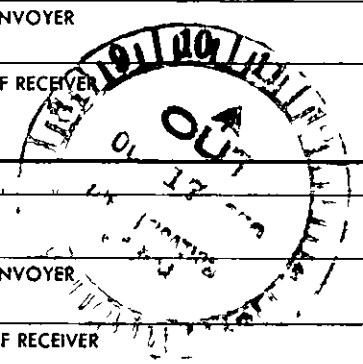

1. The scattered bones of Unknown American X-269 were found in a small crater in the vicinity of Seravazza, Mt. Canala, Italy, Grid Coord 97.2-97-2, Sheet 104, reference 1/100,000, Map of Italy, and were interred in U S. Military Cemetery, Castelfiorentino, Italy plot 2-J, row 92, grave 4837, on 2 July 1946.
2. The listings of Unrecovered Casualties for this area have been processed to eliminate all casualties from Units which were not in the vicinity of Seravazza, Italy.
3. Records on file, this headquarters, and review of casualty listings indicate that casualties were sustained by the 92nd Infantry Division in both October 1944 and April 1945. These specific dates were based on recovered identified casualties, in the same area, and the same division. It is assumed that date of death of Unknown American X-269 could have been either October 1944, or April 1945.
4. Subject remains were found within a small crater which was possibly the result of a mine explosion.

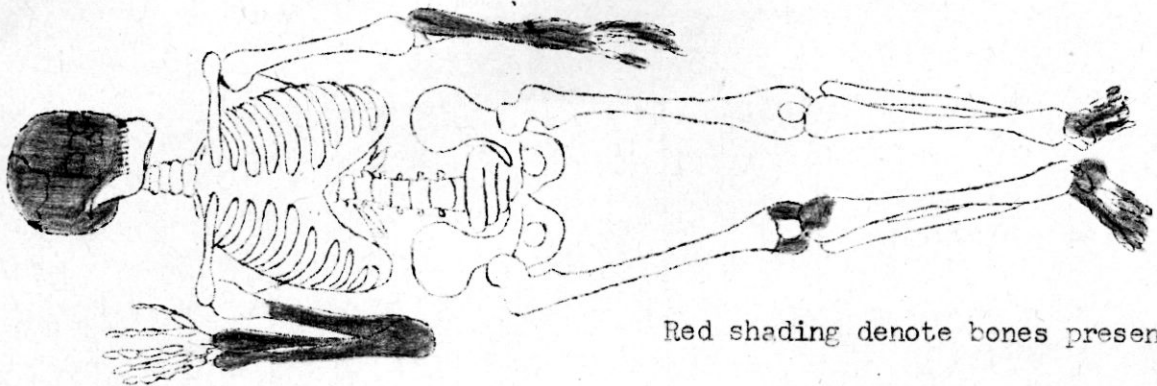



MANDIBLE MISSING

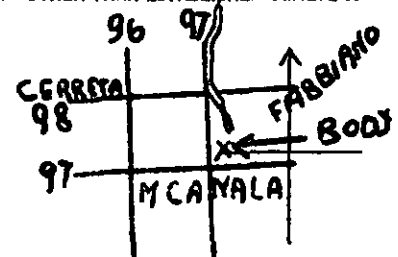



1. Submitted herewith is a field report of investigation from this office covering UNKNOWN AMERICAN SOLDIER X-269, recovered from a dangerous site on Mt. Canala in the vicinity of Seravezza, Italy. Coords.: (97.2-97.2) Sheet 104 Map Reference 1/100,000.

2. FACTS:

A. Investigation team led by T/5 Tadashi Ishida went to the above Coords. to recover UNKNOWN AMERICAN SOLDIER X-269. The site was found with the aid of an Italian civilian living in the locality of Mt. Canala.

B. Remains were found in a small crater possibly that made by a mine.

C. The area was covered with mines making passage very difficult and dangerous.

3. FINDINGS:

A. The only remains found of UNKNOWN AMERICAN SOLDIER X-269 were as follows:

LEFT SECTION

RIGHT SECTION

One lower part of Radius and Ulna	Right Femur (shattered)
One lower part of Humerus	Parts of Humerus (shattered and burned)
One Rib (shattered)	

B. Skull was found and a partial tooth chart was taken. The Maxilla showed L- 1-2-3-8 and R-1-2-3 missing after death. The Mandible was missing.

C. Skull showed a bullet hole on Right cheek (frontal) presumably that of a German rifle.

D. It is estimated that UNKNOWN AMERICAN SOLDIER X-269 height was about 5' 8" and weighed around 170 lbs. and was possibly 24 years of age.

E. Area was thoroughly searched but no other leading evidence conclusive of identity were found. Civilians were questioned but no evidence pertaining to the UNKNOWN were revealed.

4. COMMENTS:

A. During combat the battle scarred terrain was held by troops of the 92nd Infantry Division. In all probability the remains of UNKNOWN AMERICAN SOLDIER X-269 are of a colored soldier due to the fact that other remains recovered in this vicinity were those of colored troops.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS:

A. Request that the Dental chart (partial) of UNKNOWN AMERICAN SOLDIER X-269 be checked with those of personnel missing in action in this area. Our files reveal no positive identification of said UNKNOWN. The above mentioned remains will be buried as UNKNOWN AMERICAN SOLDIER X-269 until any positive identification can be had.

6. CONCLUSION

A. The remains of UNKNOWN AMERICAN SOLDIER X-269 are now interred in Plot 2-J, Row 92, Grave 4837 at the UNITED STATES MILITARY CEMETERY at CASTELFIORENTINO, ITALY and OMC FORM #1 GRS will be forwarded to your Headquarters.

Busetti Adams, the civilian guide, would
not give any signed statements, but the
information he could give was the location
of the bodies.
