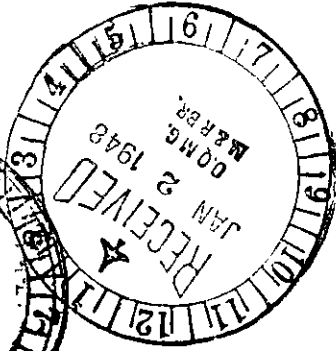
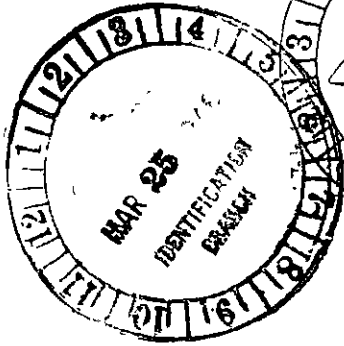
In reply to your letter dated Dec. 22, 1941 regarding QM & MU 293, Unknown X-282, (Castelfiorentino) Italy, the only information that I can give concerns Sgt Steve Mitchell; also of Co. K, 370th Infantry C.T.

He was reported killed during an attack on Mt. Casala, in Nov., 1944, at the time I lost my helmet liner. He and I were not very far apart during the fighting but I did not see him killed. To my knowledge he never came back to the company and his body was never recovered. He was carried as missing in action and far as I know he was the only member of our unit that hadn't been accounted for.

Hoping that I have been helpful.

Dear Mr. White:

This office is conducting an investigation to determine the identity of an Unknown American Serviceman who was killed on Mt. Canala, in the vicinity of Seravezza, Italy.

With the remains was found a helmet liner, on the inside of which were two letters postmarked September, 1944, and addressed as follows:

Pvt. Hampton C. White, 36 887 794
Company K, 370th Infantry, C. T.
APO 5743

It will be of the utmost value to this office if you can furnish the name of any person or persons likely to have had possession of it at the time of death, which is estimated to have occurred during the period from September 1944 to April 1945, while troops of the 92nd Infantry Division were engaged in combat in that area. This Unknown soldier is one of several unknowns recovered in this area, and any information you can furnish, such as names, dates, location or circumstances surrounding the death of any of your unrecovered comrades, even the smallest detail, may be a clue which will aid us in identifying one or more of these remains.

We will greatly appreciate your cooperation in giving this important inquiry your prompt attention and are inclosing a self-addressed envelope, which requires no postage, for your convenience in replying, and to expedite delivery.

SUBJECT: INVESTIGATION OF "BELIEVED TO BE" WHITE, HAMPTON C.

TO : COMMANDING OFFICER

1. Submitted herewith is a field report of investigation from this office covering "BELIEVED TO BE" WHITE, HAMPTON C. whose remains were recovered on the surface of the earth in the vicinity of Seravezza, Italy, on Mt. Canala. Coords. (96.0-96.0) Sheet 104. Map reference 1/100,000.

2. FACTS:

A. Investigation team led by T/5 Tadashi Ishida proceeded to above mentioned coords after receiving information from an Italian civilian who was working on Mt Canala removing mines. The civilian claimed to have seen the remains on several occasions.

B. The remains were found on the surface of the earth with helmet liner facing downward and the remains were around said liner.

C. The remains of "BELIEVED TO BE" WHITE, HAMPTON C. were found about forty (40) feet from UNKNOWN AMERICAN SOLDIER X-271.

D. The area was covered with mines which made passage very difficult and dangerous.

3. FINDINGS:

A. After thorough investigation of the area the only remains that were recovered of "BELIEVED TO BE" WHITE, HAMPTON C. were as follows:

LEFT SECTION

One radius
One femur
Five ribs

RIGHT SECTION

One radius
One femur
Five ribs
One ilium
One tibia
One humerus

One cervicle vertebrae
One lumbar vertebrae

B. Part of occipital bone was recovered and also the mandible.

C. A partial tooth chart was taken.

D. Remnants of OD clothing found but did not reveal any laundry markings or other identification.

E. Two letters found inside helmet liner addressed as follows:

Pvt. Hampton C. White 3688219
Co. K, 370th Inf. C. T.
APO 5743

F. The area was thoroughly searched but no other identification could be found near the remains or in the nearby vicinity. Civilians were also questioned but no facts pertaining to "BELIEVED TO BE" HAMPTON C. WHITE, could be revealed.

G. It is estimated that "BELIEVED TO BE" HAMPTON C. WHITE was about 5' 1" and weighed about 195 lbs.

4. COMMENTS:

In all probability the remains of "BELIEVED TO BE" WHITE, HAMPTON C. are that of a colored soldier due to the fact that other remains recovered in this area were those of colored troops. This area had been occupied by elements of the 92nd Infantry Division.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS:

A. It is recommended that the partial tooth chart of "BELIEVED TO BE" WHITE, HAMPTON C. be checked with dental records of WHITE, HAMPTON C.

B. We are carrying remains of WHITE, HAMPTON C. until further identification can be obtained.

C. Our ground forces casualty files have been thoroughly checked and have revealed no positive identification.

6. CONCLUSIONS:

The remains of "BELIEVED TO BE" WHITE, HAMPTON C. are now interred in Plot 2-J, Row 92, Grave 4839 at the UNITED STATES MILITARY CEMETERY at CASTELFIORENTINO, ITALY and QMC FORM #1 GRS will be forwarded to your headquarters.

1. The remains of Unknown American X-282 were recovered on the surface of the earth in the vicinity of Seravazza, Italy, on Mt. Canala, Grid Coords: 96.0-96.0, Sheet 104, Map reference 1/100,000, and interred in U.S. Military Cemetery, Castelfiorentino, plot 2J, row 92, grave 4839, on 2 July 1946.

2. Estimated date of death for X-282 is given as September 1944. Troops of the 92nd Infantry Division were engaged in combat in this area from September 1944 to April 1945.

3. Listings indicate no unrecovered 92nd Division casualties, for one month previous estimated date of death for X-282. Inasmuch as estimated date of death is September 1944, a list of unrecovered casualties up to 10 October is submitted:

Letters were found inside helmet liner addressed to Hampton C. White, 36 887 794, 370th C.T., Co. K., APO 5743. A check of records indicates that Hampton C. White returned to the United States.

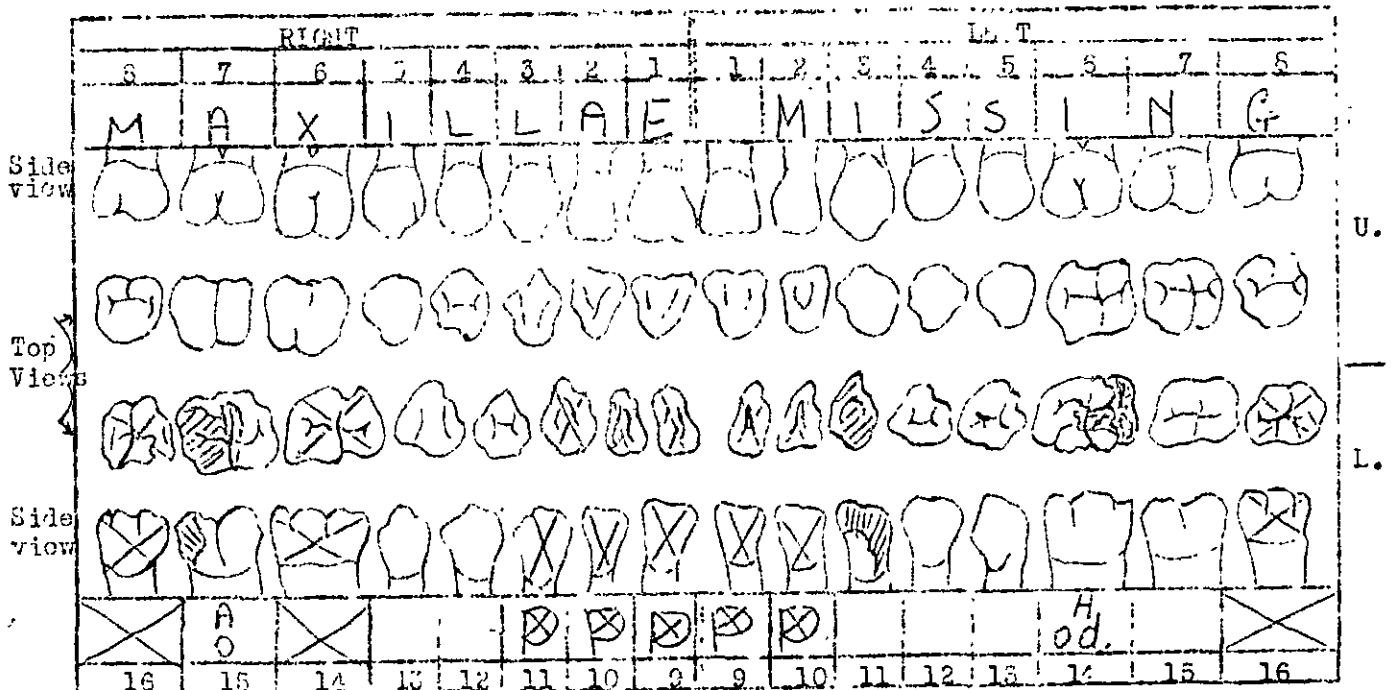

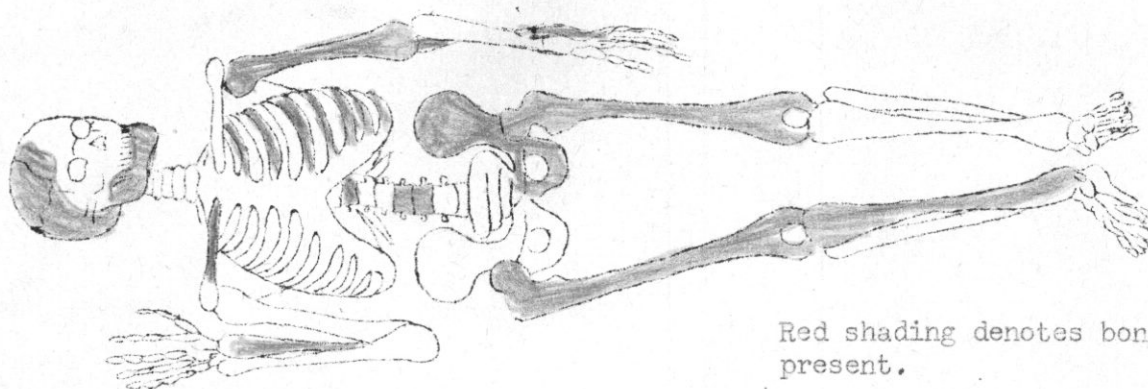
