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

#### REPORT OF EXAMINATION OF UNIDENTIFIED BODY

1. Body of male brought to morgue 12 September 1946.

2. Gross appearance: Overall length: 164 cm.

Length: Acromion to fingertip: 73 cm. Length: Ilian crest to heel: 87 cm.

Body had been buried. Overall appearance one of beginning decomposition from moisture and soil contact. Furtherest amount of decomposition was on face where the greatest portion of flesh had disappeared. Left shoulder suffered considerably as well. Maggot infestation here. Remainder of body was rigid and moist with superficial slouth and greenish discoloration of all tissues. Rigor mortis marked. Estimated period of death from the amount of deterioration would be placed at 10 days to 2 weeks.

Body unclothed except for pair of size 38 cotton shorts. 3rd Division ring on left hand. No identifying scars, tattoos, marks. Small puncture wound left side of abdomen paraumbilically. Length of bailing wire around neck above larynx tightly twisted posteriorly cutting into neck tissues. Scrotum greatly distended with edema.

Gives impression of a powerful build with-muscular extremities, long trunk, broad shoulders. Estimated weight 165 to 170 lbs. Arms long.

Head: Hair judged as brown, moderate in amount. Face elmost completely destroyed by deterioration, but skull shows sign of injury about face. X-ray reveals the following: Seperation by elevation of galea from calvarium, revealed to be due to sub-galeal hemorrhage. No calvarial fracture. Teeth knocked out of place. One filling in one upper molar and one in lower tooth, unidentifiable. Multiple teeth have been smashed from the upper jaw. is a fracture line extending upward from the right upper jaw paranasally into the antrum, and probable continuing superiorly since the lower border of the right orbit medially is also fractured and from its medial border a fragment is displaced medially. Bicuspid and an incisor or canine have been displaced upward into the sinus. One molar lies inferior to the fracture out of its socket. right zygoma shows separation at its suture lines both temporally and at the maxilla. The nasal septum is deviated to the left inferiorally. The mandible is not fractured, but lower incisors and bicuspids are knocked from their alveoli and displaced.

4. Neck: Bailing wire about the neck has cut the skin deeply above the larynx. Dissection reveals complete rupture of the trachea at this point. No evidence of cervical soine fracture can can be definitely gleaned by X-ray although there is a suspicious area at the base of the odontoid.







Government property is not to be included in personal effects but is to be turned in to Salvage Collecting Point.
