Following are excerpts from a letter written by AGO to the widow of T/4 Teachey, 19 April 1946

"With Company B, 350th Infantry Regiment . while his organization was engaged in taking an objective near Santa Cecilia, Italy, about 14 miles northeast of Bologna . . . they were advancing on the objective . the two lead platoons were caught in cross fire by enemy machine guns about 300 yards northeast of Santa Cecilia.

His company was forced to withdraw when the company was again formed, a roll call was taken and it was found that your husband was missing. He has not been heard from or seen since that date. "

Excerpts from a letter to the widow from AGO, dated 10 Sep 46

"I wish to advise you that a report was received which discloses that T/4 Teachey was killed in action 18 April 1945 in the Mediterranean Area.

"The report was received from the Commanding General of the Mediterranean Theater of Operations. The report of death was based upon information received from the Graves Registration Service, regarding the reinterment of the remains of your husband. No further information was given regarding the circumstances surrounding his death."

Casualty Br, AGO, furnished the following information from letters written by AGO to the widow of Teachey on 19 April 1946 and 10 Sep 1946

"Was with Company B, 350th Infantry Regiment

His platoon was caught in cross fire 300 yards N. E. of Santa Cecilia, Italy, about 14 miles northeast of Bologna, Company withdrew and took roll call, at which time T/4 Teachey was missing - 18 April 1945."

"Report of death, received from the Commanding General, MTO, was based upon information received from the GRS regarding the reinterment of the remains of your husband."

Army Map Service (Mrs Warro)

Could not locate a "Santa Cecilia" in the vicinity of Bologna. However, found a Santa Cecilia, 36 miles northwest of Monzuno

Board on Geographic Names (Miss Stokes)

Could not locate a Santa Cecilia northeast of Bologna, however, found "Santa Cecilia", a church, in Bologna, which is 14 miles northeast of Monzuno, where the body was found

In view of the differences in location of Santa Cecilia on map, as compared with the location given by AGO, and in the estimated date of death as compared with the date Teachey was KIA, it is requested that all information on Teachey and on the 350th Inf Regt from Sept 1944 to May 1945, be forwarded to aid in clarifying these discrepancies

STATEMENT

I, Capt. Lloyd W. Fisher, O-1290922, Company "B", 350th Infantry, hereby certify the following facts pertaining to Technician Fourth Grade Phillip Teachey, 34113535, Company "B", 350th Infantry who has been missing in action since 18 April 1945.

On 18 April 1945, at about 0030 hours, the company was giving orders to take three objectives. The first and second objectives were taken and the company was moving on the third when approximately eight (8) enemy machine guns opened up and caught the two lead platoons in cross fire. This action took place about 300 yards N.E. of San Cecilia, Italy and forced the company to withdraw. When the company was again formed, a roll call was taken and it was found that T/4 Teachey was missing. He has not been seen since 18 April 1945 and no other information has been received concerning same.

REGIMENTAL

HISTORICAL NARRATIVE - 18 April 1945:

The 349th was meeting with determined resistance but have succeeded in moving to Le Braine. Total prisoners captured for activity of 15th, 16th, and 17th more than 100. As the fourth day of this offensive started, "A" Company advanced swiftly down the ridge to the Northwest. The remainder of the battalion followed and continued in the direction of Sasso Bolognese. "A" Company in the valley on the left along the 8258 Westing, and "B" and "C" in the hills on the right. "B" Company and the 1st Battalion C P moved through the valley road about 2000 yards South of "A" Company and "C" Company went forward to clean up the ridge South of Mt Mario. The second Battalion at 0035 hours, was being heavily mortared and could not move - casualties were increasing even though we were firing all our counter-mortars. At 1000 hours, the 361st Regiment was reported on Mt. Adone. With this, the highest peak in the sector captured, the right flank of the Second Battalion was secure and it was able to continue its move forward. At 0800 hours, "E" Company had moved out in the attack on C di Mazza and at 1000 hours, they were reported in C di Mazza and S Lucia. The enemy had withdrawn and the battalion was ordered to attack in platoon column and follow the trail that led around the Western edge of Mt. Adone. The company moved to Vale di Fasse and when it was found unoccupied, it pressed forward to Quercia. Twenty prisoners were captured and one platoon was given the mission of mopping up several small pockets that had been by-passed. Six more prisoners were captured and an 88mm gun was captured at (836314). Continuing to clear the area between Quercia and the river, eight more prisoners were captured. By 1400 hours, enemy resistance was broken and the regiment moved forward in a column of companies, one company of the first battalion, reported at RP 72 (Tassimano) was to move to RP 7 (Lama), along the highway to RP 36 and then to RP 65. The remainder of the battalion was selected to move from RP 59 (Quercia) to RP 44 (Tegginola) along the trail. The second battalion at this point was at RP 77 (Campione) and was to proceed to Aldoni (RP 15) and then to Badola (RP 20) and then to RP 88. The forward regimental C P. was moved to Di Sotto and afterwards to Vale di Fasse (RP 26). By 1600 hours, the second battalion had reached the 34th Northing, and were moving along the 835 Easting to La Pranazza. "E" Company moved forward to seize Hill 474 (RP 52 at 841341). The route followed a West to Southwest direction to (838355) and attacked cross-country to Tre de Barto (83953380). After capturing this feature, the battalion ("E" Company) established contact with the 91st Division on the right at (842337). No Casualties in this action and no P W's. Second Battalion C P was set up at Badola and in a fire fight at Pranazza, fifty-five casualties were sustained. "A" Company, in their march forward, captured 166 prisoners and occupied seven RP's. While proceeding towards RP 42 (8136) the company was fired on by snipers. In leading one section of the company in the search of these snipers, First Sergeant Plank was killed. Then, with the assistance of three tanks, the houses were cleared and final preparations were made to attack RP 54 (8137). Although a bridge was blown out by the enemy the troops proceeded on foot and captured the ob-

jective and twenty-four prisoners Three KIA and three WIA were sustained "B" Company moved to RP 65 on Highway 6428 and captured thirty prisoners At 1730 the Regimental C P. was at Badola Prisoners captured to date. 261 The third battalion still in regimental reserve Movement now is rapid and the enemy are retreating rapidly There was no movement during the night and companies dug in and held their gains Much close-quarter fighting was the order of this day's advance. Prisoners were increasing and some of those interrogated claimed that they would have held out longer but for the fact that our artillery prevented supplies and ammo from reaching them This battle to breach the Bologna defenses has produced some of the fiercest fighting of this war. The fanatical "hold or die" spirit of the enemy resulted in innumerable casualties and our troops continued to drive relentlessly onward.

BATTALION HISTORICAL NARRATIVE:

17 April 1945 Encountering no small arms fire, but heavy mortar and artillery fire, "C" company moved up onto Di Sopra and secured the objective. "B" company followed and made contact "C" company then turned north to attack the cemetery and main Monterumici ridge line. Their attack had to be along the narrow ridge and it was then that they were brought under a withering crossfire from machine guns in Di Sotto, and emplacement near the cemetery, and also from a gun to their rear. Capt Lynch moved all available automatic weapons and rifles of his company into a position to lay down an effective base of fire. Just at first light he led his company in the assault of the cemetery. In spite of an extensive schu-mine field on the right and intensive automatic weapon fire "C" company took the ridge. Capt Lynch was killed just short of the objective. The orders to continue the attack were received later in the day after "A" company cleaned out Di Sotto. "A" company attacked on the ridge and "B" company on the trail to the right past La Torre. "B" company ran into a serious ambush with over 40 casualties and was forced to retire to vicinity of La Torre while "A" company met little opposition and consolidated gains farther up the ridge. When "B" company tried to advance the Germans had let a good part of the company pass before opening up with crossfire from over five machine guns.

18 April 1945 M. Adone, taken by the 91st Infantry Division, and everything on Monterumici ridge cleared, "A" company advanced swiftly down the ridge branching to the northwest. The rest of the battalion followed swiftly on their heels and the forward advance continued in the direction of Sasso Bolognese with "A" company on the left in the valley and "B" and "C" companies in the hills on the right. "B" company and the Bn. CP moved down through the valley road about 2000 yards south of "A" company and "C" company went forward to clean up the ridge south of M. Mario.

19 April 1945 "A" company moved up to the vicinity of Sasso Bolognese meeting opposition from snipers and self-propelled guns. "B" company remained in the vicinity of the Bn. CP.

COMPANY "B" HISTORICAL NARRATIVE

17 - 18 April 1945 - Received orders to attack, moved forward at dusk thru Di Sotta and La Torre. 1st Objective S. Cecilia, 3rd platoon took objective with no casualties 2nd objective, La Mandris. Ran into stiff opposition, necessary to commit the 1st platoon. Unable to take objective Unable to take 3rd platoon in for reinforcement and company withdrew to La Torre On Battalion Commander's order went to assembly area 400 yards east of Di Sopra for reorganization. 2 officers WIA, 14 EM WIA Afternoon of 18th moved from assembly area to Casa Rolla

18 - 19 April 1945 - Status - assault company 3rd platoon moved forward at approximately 1300 hours When 3rd objective had been reached Company "C" moved thru us and Company "B" was ordered to occupy objective 65 on Highway 6428 During this operation we took 30 (or more) prisoners.
