Zone Headquarters, American Graves Registration Service Group, 8204th Army Unit, APO 3,  
CS, convened at 0800 hours 12 March 1954, and after consideration of the following  
identifying factors, approved the identification of Unknown X- 30, UNMC INCHON,  
Korea, Plot E, Row 7, Grave 655, S&R Evacuation No. \_\_\_\_\_ as

UNIDENTIFIABLE

Identifying factors were:

Unknown X-30 Inchon was disinterred from Plot E, Row 7, Grave 655  
UN Military Cemetery, Inchon, Korea. The remains were flesh-  
covered, completely charred, with major portions (head, arms,  
legs) missing.

Report of Interment reveals that Unknown X-30 was interred in UNMC  
Inchon on 19 Nov 50. Organization of decedent is shown as 24th  
Inf Regt, 25th Inf Div. There is no information available as  
to date and place of death. Current listings available this  
headquarters show that there are 63 unresolved casualties suffered  
by the 24th Inf Regt, prior to 19 Nov 50. The estimated age of  
the remains (17-19), which is the only obtainable physical charac-  
teristics, is comparable to many of the casualties.

In view of the number of unresolved casualties suffered by the 24th  
Inf Regt, the paucity of the remains and almost complete lack of  
identifying media, which precludes conclusive association, Un-  
known X-30 Inchon is determined to be UNIDENTIFIABLE.



The following information is submitted in connection with the research for missing segments of the above reference remains.

DATE OF SEARCH: 14 Jan 53 DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF SEARCH AND FINDINGS:

On 14 January 1953 I, Cpl James T Schuller, and three enlisted men of this company carefully searched the original site of grave 655, row 7, plot E, of the former Inchon UN Military Cemetery (CS952477) for additional segments of remains X 30.

A copy of the original layout of the cemetery was used to determine the size and general position of the plots. The drawing, however, gave no indication as to tie-ins for the cemetery or individual plots.

The area previously used as the cemetery site had since been cultivated and farmed by nearby villagers. The original position of the graves could not be seen but small depressions of the earth which resembled the original rows where the ground had settled were visible. The rear of plot F, which was shown on the drawing to lie directly behind plot E, had not been disturbed. The location of the original graves could be seen. (See attached sketch, Incl 4).

The dimensions of the plots according to the layout plan were 36' by 108'. Thus beginning at the rear left (northwest) corner of plot F which could be easily seen, a distance of 221' (2 x 108' = 216' plus 5' aisle = 221') was chained from said corner southward along the west side of lots (over)

DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF SEARCH AND FINDINGS (contd)

F and E to a point thus established as the lower left hand (southwest) corner of said plot E. From said southwest corner of plot E a distance of 58.5' ( $108' \div 12 = 9'$  per row;  $6\frac{1}{2} \times 9' = 58.5'$ ) was chained north along the west edge of said plot E to a point on the centerline of row 7. Grave 655 being the seventh grave from the west edge of the plot, a distance of 19.5' ( $36' \div 12 = 3'$ ;  $6\frac{1}{2} \times 3' = 19.5'$ ) was chained in an eastwardly direction perpendicular to the west side of said plot to a point locating the center of grave 655, row 7, plot E. The rows of graves which could be seen by the settlement of the ground, were also counted from this point, the centerline of row 7, plot E, to the rear of plot F and 18 rows were counted, this serving as an added check. All distances were carefully measured by means of a steel tape and chaining arrows.

About the point previously described as the center of grave 655, an excavation was made. After breaking through the frozen top soil, the unpacked earth beneath clearly showed the location of a previous grave. The grave soil was removed to a depth of five and one-half feet to where the undisturbed soil marked the bottom of the original excavation. An additional six inches of earth was also removed. The excavation was enlarged one foot beyond the original head and foot of the grave and three feet to each side to include the graves adjacent. The earth was carefully screened as it was removed during the entire operation. No remains portions were found.

No burial bottles were found in the graves. Nearby villagers who had gathered at the site stated that they had helped to disinter the cemetery and that no burial bottles had been placed in the graves.

The results of the investigation were negative.

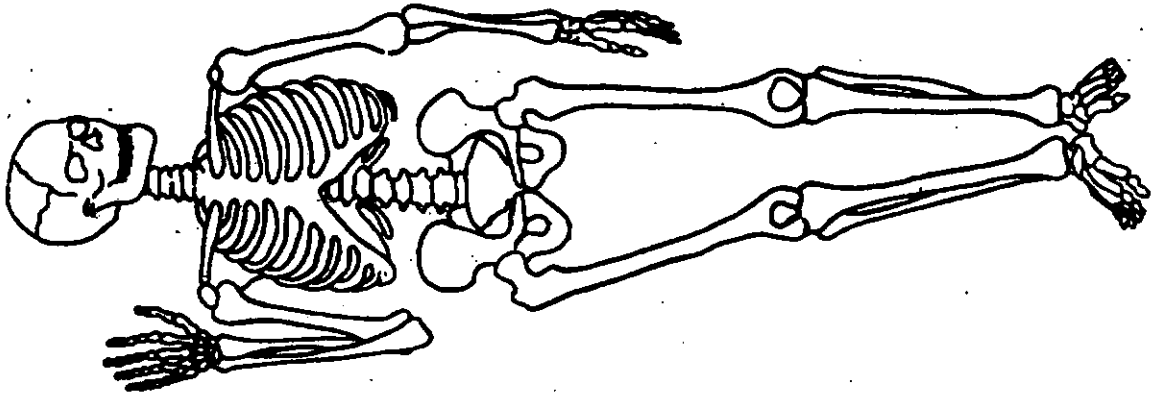

REMARKS

Board Findings recommending that the remains of Unknown X-30, UNMC Inchon, Korea, be declared Unidentifiable, have been received in this Office.

Pertinent information on the original recovery is unavailable; however, the Report of Interment, dated 19 November 1950, indicates that the remains of Unknown X-30 were recovered from Plot E, Row 7, Grave 655, UNMC Inchon, and at time of disinterment were flesh-covered, completely charred, with head, arms and legs missing.

Paucity of remains and almost complete lack of identifying data preclude association between the remains and any unresolved casualty. The remains represent an individual whose estimated age is 17 - 19 years.

RECOMMENDATION:

In view of the lack of identifying data, it is recommended that the remains of Unknown X-30, UNMC Inchon, be declared Unidentifiable.



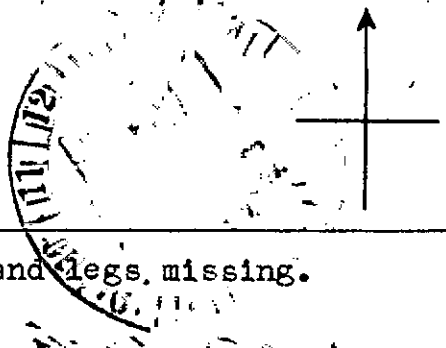
