

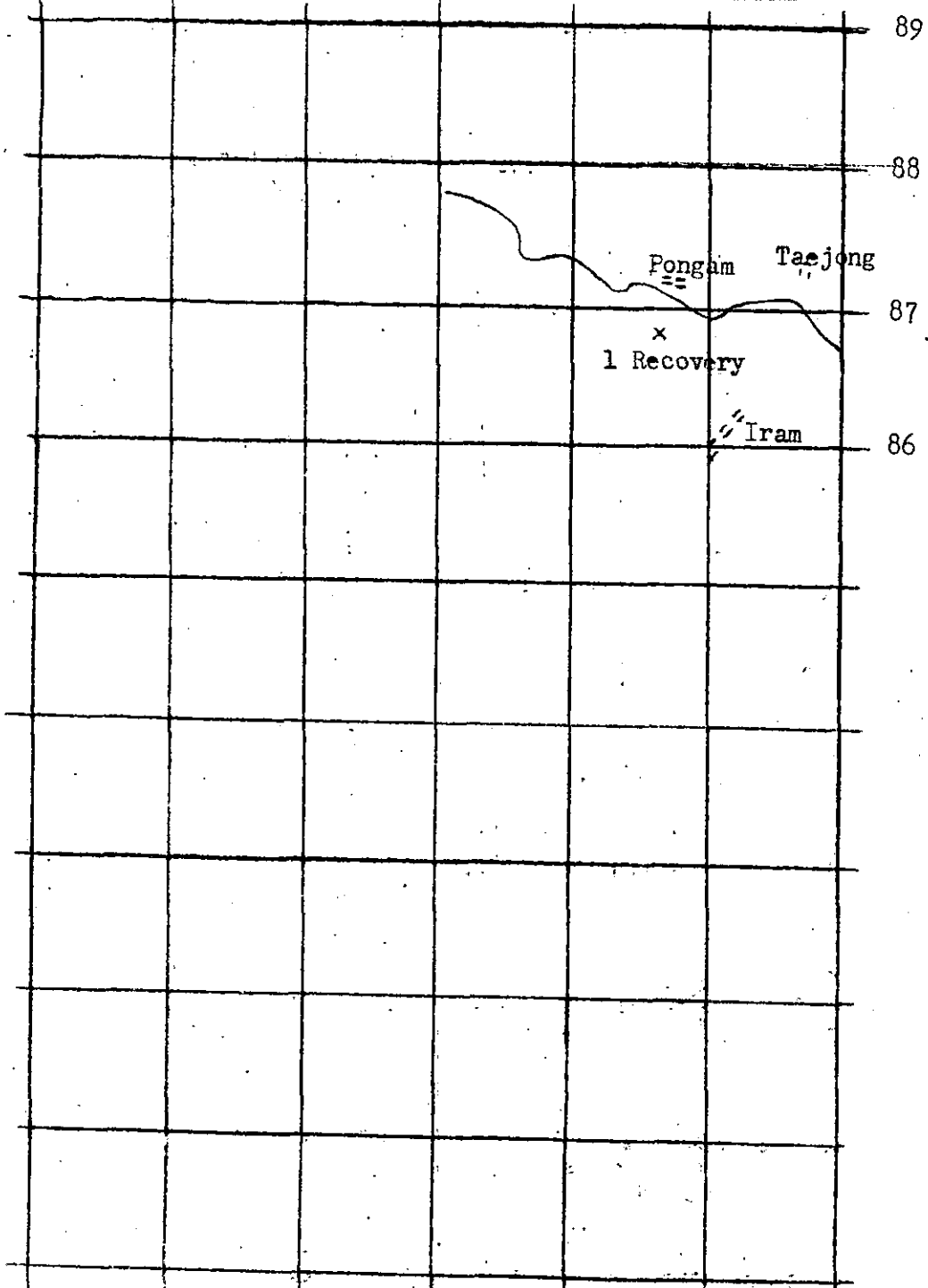
REMARKS: Remains recovered in skeletal state from grave approx 400 yards south-southwest of Pangam-ni village; approx 1000 yards north-northwest of Iram-ni village and approx 1100 yards west-southwest of Taejong village. A Korean stated that he had seen some bones in his wheat field on 5 October 1951 and that he covered them up. He did not know if the remains were American or Korean. The people of Pangam village buried the remains. Mr. Ku Hae Kong stated that Kim Yong Dae, now in Pusan, address unknown, buried the remains about the middle of November 1950. There had been fighting in the Pangam village area on the 6th and 7th of August 1950. Later, American personnel come to this village and found two (2) American remains on the mountain in this area. Soil from grave sifted and thorough search conducted over large surrounding area but no identification media found.



In the middle of November 1950, Kim Tae Yong, who lived in the village of Pongam-ni, buried the remains lying around the corn field, whose owner is Kim Hae Bok, on the mountain in front of this village.

On or about 6 August 1950, there was heavy fighting on that mountain. I believe the above remains was killed in the action. Later, some American soldiers came to this village and discovered two (2) remains of American dead on that mountain.



On or about 7 August 1950, there had been heavy fighting in this village area and I believe that the remains was killed in this action.
