
A Board of Officers appointed by paragraph 1, Division Order No. 22, dated 25 July 1946, convened at 1000 hours, 4 March 1957, and after consideration of the following factors, approved the identification of Unknown X-6348B as unidentifiable.


The remains of Unknowns X-6348, X-6348A, X-6348B, X-6349, X-6349A, X-6349B, X-6350, X-6351 and Evac #12612 were recovered from hill 139, grid coordinates CT 079084, Map Sheet 6528-II, along with a few bone fragments designated CIU parts, during recovery operations extending over a period from 8 - 17 August 1956.


Identification data of all unresolved casualties lost in this area was compared with that of unknowns listed above which resulted in Unknowns X-6348 being identified as Pvt Louie D. Walker, 1306413, USMC, X-6349 as Cpl Daniel L. Welch, 1123600, USMC, X-6350 as Pfc Omar E. Wooldridge, 1244946, USMC, X-6348A, X-6349A, X-6349B and X-6351 as unidentifiable. An attempt to associate Unknown X-6348B with Cpl Joe E. Whitten, 1053722, USMC, could not be substantiated due to the lack of distinctive identifying data and the extremely fragmentary condition of the remains. Unknown X-6348B is approximately 90% missing. According to the anthropological narrative, dated 7 February 1957, the mandible which had been placed with the remains cannot be associated with any of the other skeletal remains so it was placed with X-6348B since no anthropological basis existed to prove or disprove this action. Racial determination of caucasoid was made from the mandible because of the many caucasoid characteristics. Cpl Whitten's race is negroid so, based on racial determination alone, this association could not be substantiated.

Evac #12612, previously determined to be Asiatic mongoloid, will be returned to the Korean Government and the CIU parts will be disposed of in accordance with applicable regulations.

In view of the lack of identifying media and the major portion of the remains being missing, it is determined that Unknown X-6348B is unidentifiable.



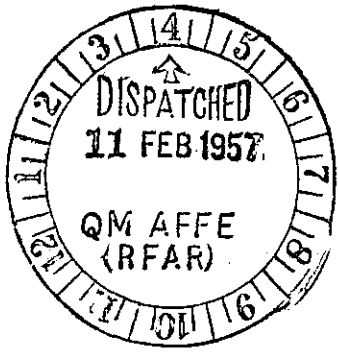

Subject remains were reprocessed for explanation about basis for race determination as Caucasoid and anthropological explanation how the mandible was associated with the infra-cranial skeleton.

During initial examination of the group remains, S&R 1499 through 1507/293, it was found that the remains received as S&R 1499/293 were commingled skeletons, and the remains were temporally segregated into five (5) remains as follows:

- a. Basic skeletal portions of Unk X-6348
- b. Major skeletal portions of Unk X-6348-A
- c. Major skeletal portions of Unk X-6348-B
- d. The parts associated with Unk X-6350
- e. The parts designated as CIU PART # Y-1

The age and stature of (a), (b) and (c) are as follows:

	<u>AGE</u>	<u>STATURE</u>
Unk X-6348	18 - 20	5'11 5/8", 6" (tall)
Unk X-6348-A	24 - 26	5'8 1/2"
Unk X-6348-B	20 - 25	Short (The shortest of 3 remains based on relative size of vertebrae and ribs)

The parts (d) associated with Unk X-6350 are portions of a young (19-21) individual and have no possibilities of association with the subject mandible.

The parts (e) designated as CIU PART # Y-1 are unidentical with the subject mandible and infra-cranial skeleton based on the difference of relative size, age, bone-texture.

The mandible and the infra-cranial skeleton of Unk X-6348-B cannot possibly be associated with any other remains of this group based on the difference of size, age, articulation and bone-morphology and/or duplication of the parts.

The identity of the mandible and the infra-cranial skeleton of Unk X-6348-B can neither be proved nor disproved. Therefore, there are no positive anthropological basis to separate the mandible from the infra-cranial skeleton.

Based on the above mentioned fact the mandible and the infra-cranial skeleton were left together without being segregated.

The following characteristics are the basis for race determination of the subject mandible of Unk X-6348-B as being Caucasoid.

- Relatively small size
- Narrow breadth
- Medium length
- Large ramal angle
- Narrow ramus
- Sharp, thin coronoid process with deep mandibular notch
- Prominent chin eminence
- Low symphyseal height
- Shrunken alveolar border
- Indicative of orthognathous face
- Parabolic alveolar arch
- Light general impression as a whole

The following are the characteris normally to be expected from the Negroid mandible, however, from the subject mandible of Unk X-6348-B observed characteristics were negative result.

- Closer, denser and ivory-like texture
- Alveolar prognathism
- Poor developed chin
- Long and narrow alveolar arch
- Square corners of alveolar arch
- Prominent ridges of lingual side of alveolar process
- Relatively large teeth (Macrodont)
- Space between teeth and behind third molars
- Distinct root of third molar
- Increasing size of molars from front to back
- Fifth cusp of lower second molar
- Large canine

The subject mandible has many Caucasoid characteristics and has no expected Negroid characteristics. Therefore, the mandible was determined to be Caucasoid.

Six photographs of the subject mandible have been taken.

The following is the supplemental statement for some conception of "race" on the standing point of physical anthropologist engaged in skeletal identification:

Genetically in case of racial mixture, such as Mulattoo and/or mixture from intra-marriage of Mulattoo, the phenotype or observed characteristics sometimes differ from the genotype, that is some Mulattoo shows Caucasoid physical appearance and other one shows Negroid physical appearance.

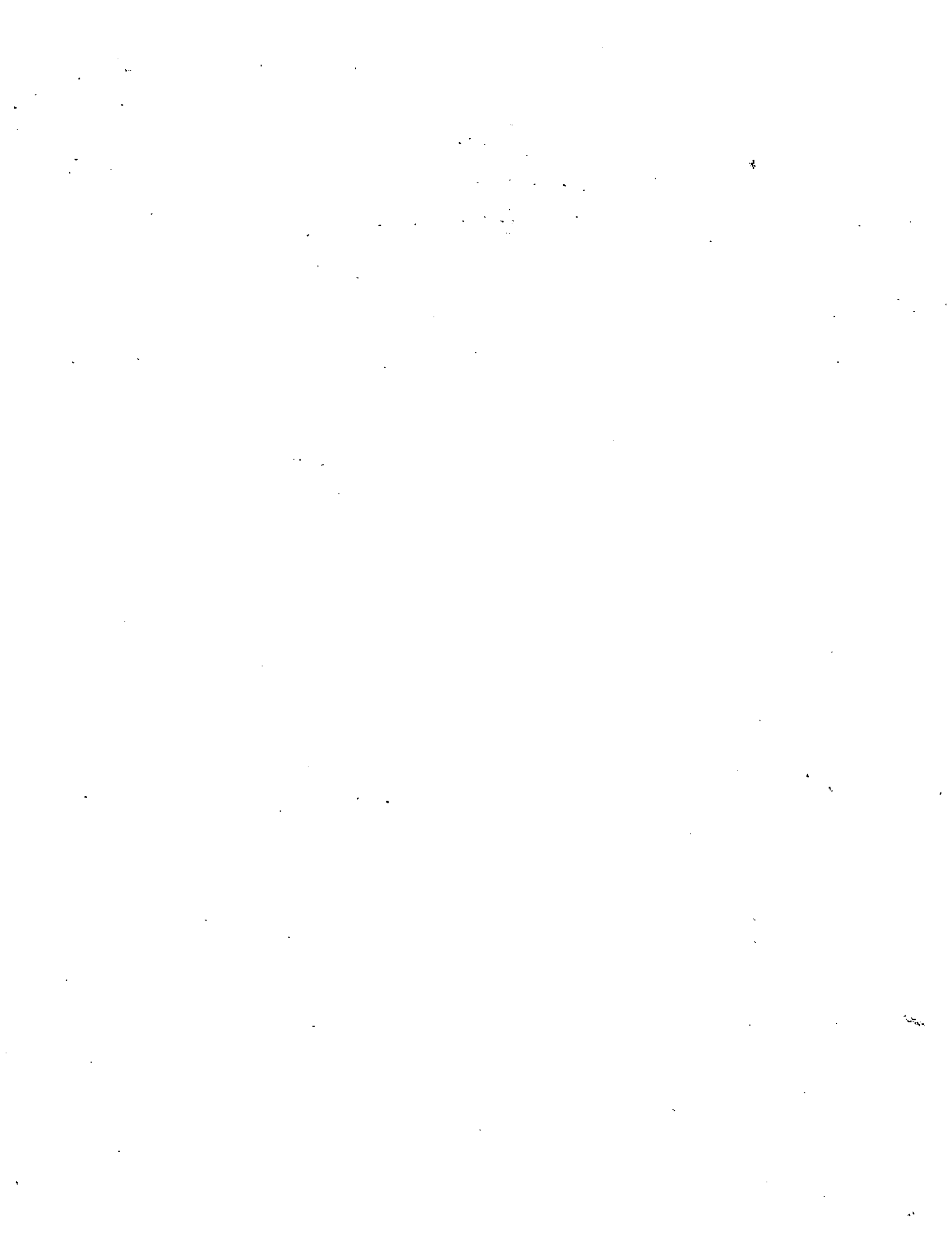
In such unusual case the determined race based on the phenotype and the genetical race and commonly used sociological "race" might naturally be different from each other.

S&R 1504/293 TEAM LEADER REPORT

At 0500 hrs 17 August 1956 we left the 293D QM Co (GRREG). We arrived at UNC/MAC Base Camp at 0800 hrs. We drove from Base Camp to the DMZ for the purpose of continuing the S&R operations that we had started on Hill 139 8 August 1956. Hill 139, located on Majon-ni Map Sheet 6528 II, grid co-ordinates CT 076086 was the site of recovery. I was in charge of S&R 1504/293. Engineers from the 3rd Engr Bn, 24th Inf Div had been in the area and cleared it of mines and other dangerous explosives.

The grave sites were two bunkers, which had apparently been blown up. The bunkers and all the immediate area was dug up and several pieces and fragments of clothing and equipment were recovered. After having thoroughly combed the area, the grave site was closed out.

My team was composed of Sp-3 Uzzle, PFC Dunaway and myself, all of the 293D QM Co (GRREG) SPO 971.

S&R 1499/293 TEAM LEADER REPORT

On 8 Aug 1956, I SFC RUSSELL ADAMS, RA 17 241 363, was notified by M/Sgt. Welch that I was to take an S&R team to UNCMAC and report to Lt. Col. Dobson. I reported to Col. Dobson at the appointed time, 1000 hrs. 10 Aug 1956.

A party composed of Lt. Col. Dobson, Lt. Col. Van Hook, two interpreters, and my S&R team left Base Camp at 1130 hrs., our mission to recover some unidentified skeletal remains from the communist side forward of the DMZ. We arrived at the DMZ and was escorted by communist Officials to the grave site (1499/293). *near*

The grave site was approximately 1,200 yards inside the DMZ located on hill 139, grid coordinates, CT-079084, map sheet 6528. There were a lot of shell fragments and 30 cal. ammunition in the immediate area. One left boot and some bones were visible on the surface. The hill apparently had several bunkers on it, which had been badly shelled.

We started digging into the grave site, screening every bit of soil. We immediately decided that there were *more* than one body in the shell beaten bunker, thus, we declared it a group recovery. Two boots were recovered, also fragments of clothing and field gear.

We left the grave site at 1600 hrs., to return to base camp for the night. Col. Dobson and Col. Van Hook made arrangements with communist officials for us to continue our S&R 11 Aug 1956, since new remains had been discovered. Lt. Col. Dobson telephoned Lt. Perkins and asked for one more S&R team to aid us since we had discovered more remains.

11 Aug 1956, 0730 hrs. with the second S&R team we returned to the DMZ. Arriving at the grave site we had worked on the previous day (1499/293), the team continued their work while I showed the next grave site to the other team.

The team working on S&R 1499/293 sifted out more bone and various pieces of clothing and a steel helmet. The grave site was then closed out.

A sign was found thirty feet down the slope from the grave in a gully. The interpreter told me the sign read: Two US bodies plus one foot. Two boots were found just below the sign but could not be recovered because the area was mined.

Personnel of the S&R team were SP-3 Cook, Pfc Mann and Pvt Dunaway, all of the 293D QM Co (ORNEG).

S T A T E M E N T

I, Cpl BOBBY J. W. LUCAS, RA 19 562 926, make the following statement:

From July 1952 until 9 February 1953 I was attached to the element of the 1st Marine Division, USMC. The units in action against the Chinese were as follows: 1st Regt (Inf), 5th Regt (Inf), 7th Regt (Inf), 11th Regt (FA). The Marines used a rotating system, two regt. on the line with one regt. in reserve. From the reserve the regts. relieved each other in the following order: first month; 1st and 5th on line, 7th in reserve. Second month; 7th and 5th on line, 1st in reserve. Third month; 7th and 1st on line, 5th in reserve. Fourth month; 5th and 1st on the line and 7th in reserve. Since I do not know what month the marines were killed, it is impossible to say what unit they were in. I left in Feb. 53 and I believe the 5th Regt was in reserve at that time, therefore the Marines would have been in the 7th or 1st Regt. From the ID tag, SN 1244____, I believe by the first four digits, that the Marine entered the service in June or July of 52. He was either Regular or Reserve, no draftees were taken after 51. Combat boots were issued to us in July or August of 52, prior to this we wore "Boondockers", that is low half-boots.

The above is a true and correct statement to the best of my knowledge and belief.
