A Board of Officers appointed by paragraph 1, Division Order No. 22, dated 25 July 1956, convened at 1000 hours, 24 January 57, and after consideration of the following factors, approved the identification of Unknowns X-6348A, X-6349A, X-6349B and X-6351 as unidentifiable.

The remains of Unknowns X-6348, X-6348A, X-6348B, X-6349, X-6349A, X-6349B, X-6350, X-6351 and Evac. #12612 were recovered from hill 139, grid coordinates GT 079084, Map Sheet 6528-II, along with a few bone fragments designated GIU parts, during recovery operations extending over a period from 8 - 17 August 1956.

Identification data of all unresolved casualties lost in this area has been compared with that of these unknowns, resulting in Unknowns X-6348 being associated with Pvt Louis D. Walker, 1306413, USMC, X-6348B with Pvt Joe L. Whitten, 1053722, USMC, X-6349 with Cpl Daniel J. Welch, 1123600, USMC, and X-6350 with Pfc Omar E. Wooldridge, 1244946, USMC, based on a favorable comparison of dental and physical data. Board proceedings recommending the identification of these four casualties and unidentifiability of the other four unknowns are being submitted simultaneously. These four remains could not be conclusively associated with any unresolved casualties because of the similarity of identifying data of many of the unresolved casualties lost in this area and the lack of outstanding identifying data of the unknowns. Evac. #12612, previously determined to be Asiatic Mongoloid, will be returned to the Korean Government and the GIU parts will be disposed of in accordance with applicable regulations.

In view of the above, it is determined that Unknowns X-6348A, X-6349A, X-6349B and X-6351 be declared unidentifiable.

S&R 1507/293 TEAM LEADER REPORT

On the morning of 17 August 1956, after JOT Team #2 had escorted us to hill 139, I was assigned by Sfc Adams NCOIC as team leader to head a team which was to disinter the grave site of S&R 1507/293 which lies approximately 20 to 30 feet South from S&R 1504/293.

The grave site was located at CT 076086 Majon-ni Map Sheet # 6528 11, 1:50,000. Investigation revealed a shallow, surface type grave which was unmarked. However, visible above the surface of the ground we found (1) one scapula and a portion of a humerus. The grave site looked to have been a well fortified bunker as heavy timbers were strewn over the immediate area.

Upon digging and sifting the soil we found the following equipment; portion of a Browning Automatic Rifle, US Model of 1918 A-2, Manufactured by Winchester SR 83323. One (1) Trigger assembly and portion of mechanism of weapon bearing rear sight and the following inscription; US Rifle caliber 30 M-1 Springfield Armory SR 1951746. There was numerous pieces of expended and non-expended rounds of ammunition of various caliber, and also handgrenades of both UN Forces and Communist Forces.

At varying intervals we found portions of the remains (see Grave Site-Sketch) imbedded in the roots of the grass that covered the grave site and at varying depths in the ground. I also observed in the general vicinity (2) two different water cans with the following markings on the side (1  $\diamond$ 7) and (3  $\diamond$ 7) in yellow paint. A complete coverage was made of the area but no further portions or evidence of other burials on hill 139 could be found. The grave site was closed out under the supervision of Sfc Adams.

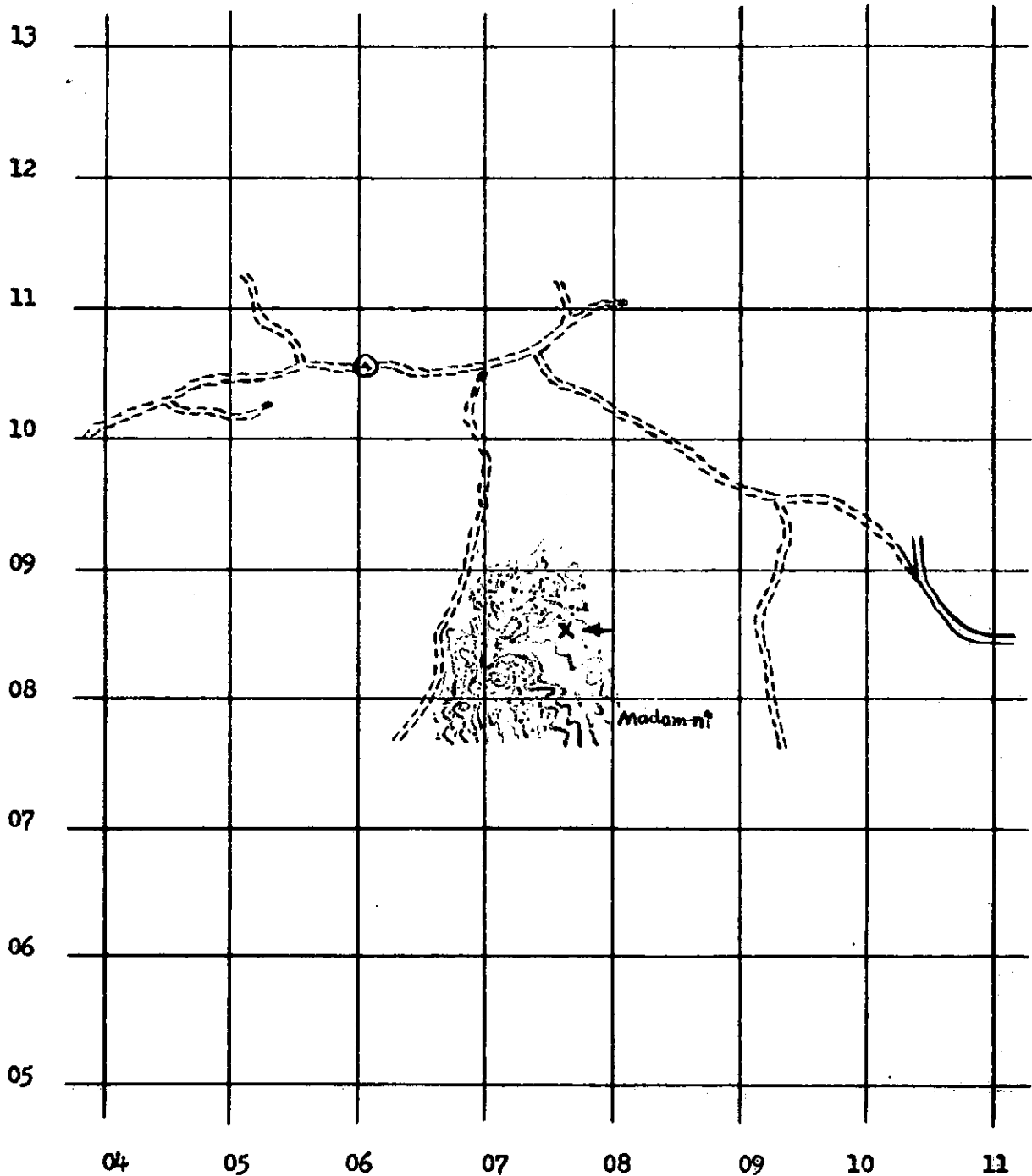
