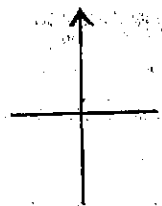

NARRATIVE OF DISINTERMENT *M*

On 10 July 1950 the undersigned and Mr. PARTZOLD were dispatched from this Detachment to SATTENHAUSEN, Germany (L-52/C-62), to excavate a plane crater which presumably contained the remains of the pilot.

Upon our arrival at Sattenhausen, we made the necessary arrangements for laborers and equipment and started the excavation on 11 July 1950.

The crater which had been partly opened previously by two (2) un-employed German civilians for the purpose of selling scrap metal, was opened to a depth of six (6) to seven (7) meters and to a width of approximately six (6) meters, until untouched ground was hit.

Between the armor plate which covers the pilot's seat from the rear and the foot pedals the following was found:

- One (1) complete left leg from foot to hip;
- One (1) right hip bone;
- One (1) right foot;
- One (1) rib bone;
- One (1) hand;
- One (1) vertebra.

A final check of the crater did not reveal any additional remains of the pilot; however, among the heavy clay and muck which covered the bottom of the crater, we were able to locate a first Lt. bar and a wrist watch with the following inscription:

The remains found in this crater are BTB additional remains of Wiley. NME GRIZZLE, ASN O-2056952; they were wrapped in the proper manner and were assigned Evac. # SR 28/

The crater was closed and a Notice of disinterment was left at the Burgermeister's Office.

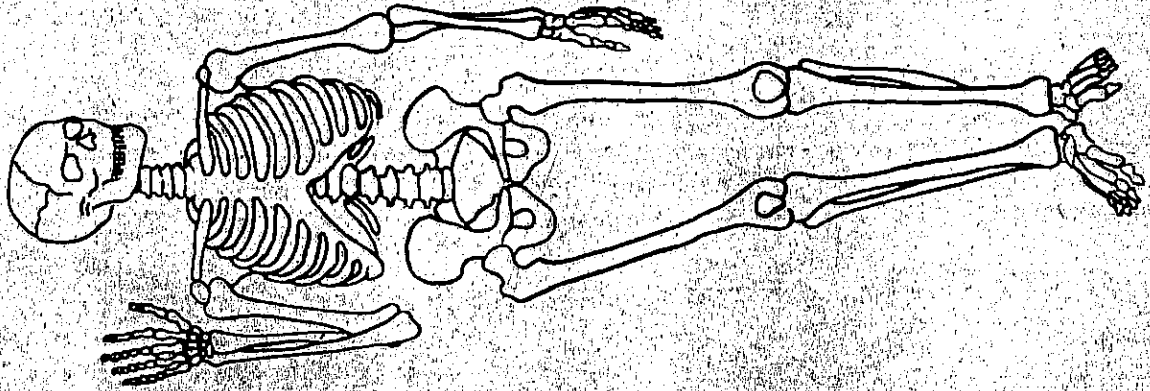

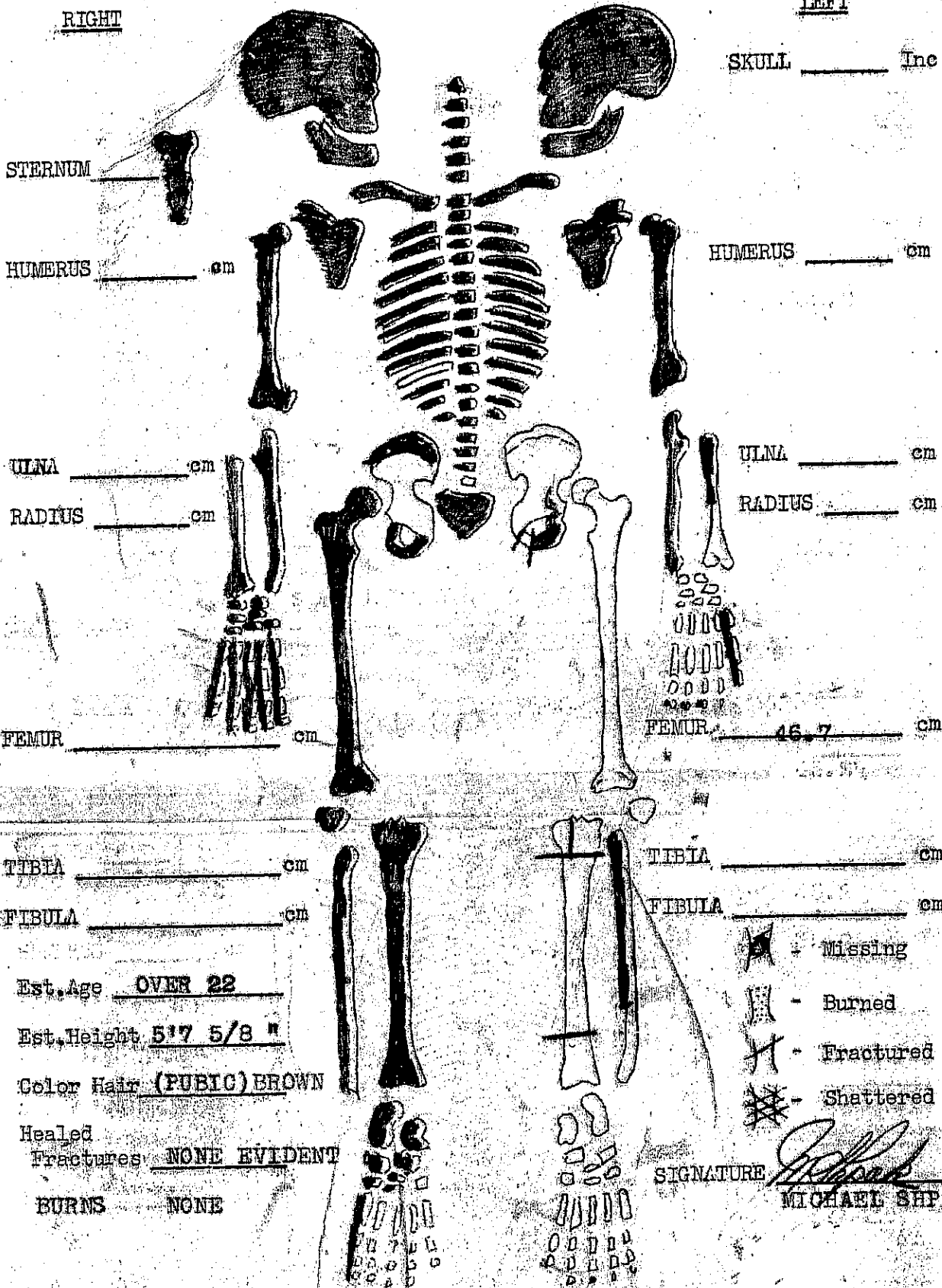
SKELETAL CHART




