 NARRATIVE OF DISINTERMENT
 AT KELLENBACH, (K-50/L-83), GER.

2 September 1950

A report received by the Wiesbaden S & R Teams, from the 3rd French Gendarmerie in SIMMERN, Germany, on 29 August 1950, disclosed the findings of an American remains at the crash site of an American aircraft near KELLENBACH, Kreis SIMMERN, by two German civilians on 26 August 1950. This team proceeded to SIMMERN to recover the remains taken into custody by the French authorities.

The remains consisted of shattered dry bones representing various parts of the body. The ID tag on chain found at the same site bears the following inscription: GLENN R. BILLINGSLEY, O-807666.

Interviewing the two Germany civilians, Mr. JOSEPH BAUER, Simmerstr. #511, Kirchberg and Mr. FRANZ RUDE, Hauptstr. # 148, Kirchberg, it was learned that during their excavation of the crash site, located 2300 meters east of KELLENBACH, in the search for metal scrap still imbedded in the ground, they had first discovered the ID tag on chain in the soil and ashes, 1 to 2 feet below the surface, upon starting to excavate at the lower end of the incline. Working up-grade from this spot to the point where formerly the middle section of the fuselage had lain they found human remains amidst ashes and small metal parts under the ground. Working up-grade $1\frac{1}{2}$ meters farther they also recovered a ring with red stone bearing the initials: "G.R.B." This ring is also being submitted with ID tag and remains. Sensing the importance of this find, they immediately reported this to the French Gendarmerie in SIMMERN, making sure that no further remains were overlooked in the area excavated by them.

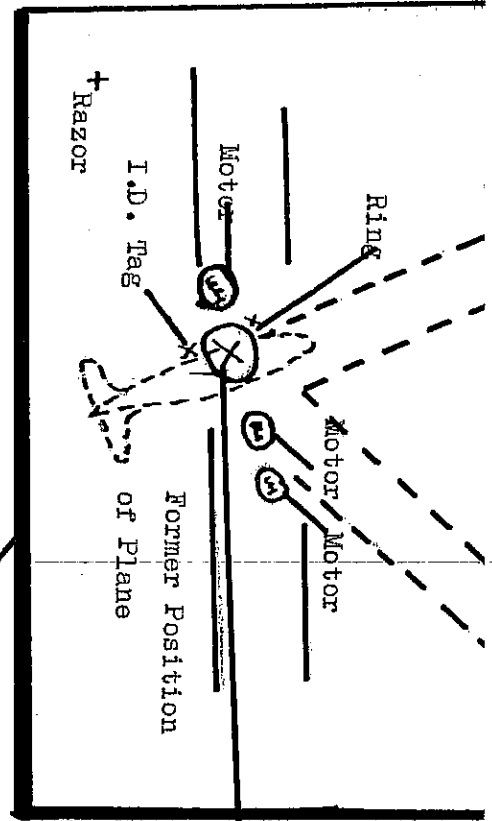
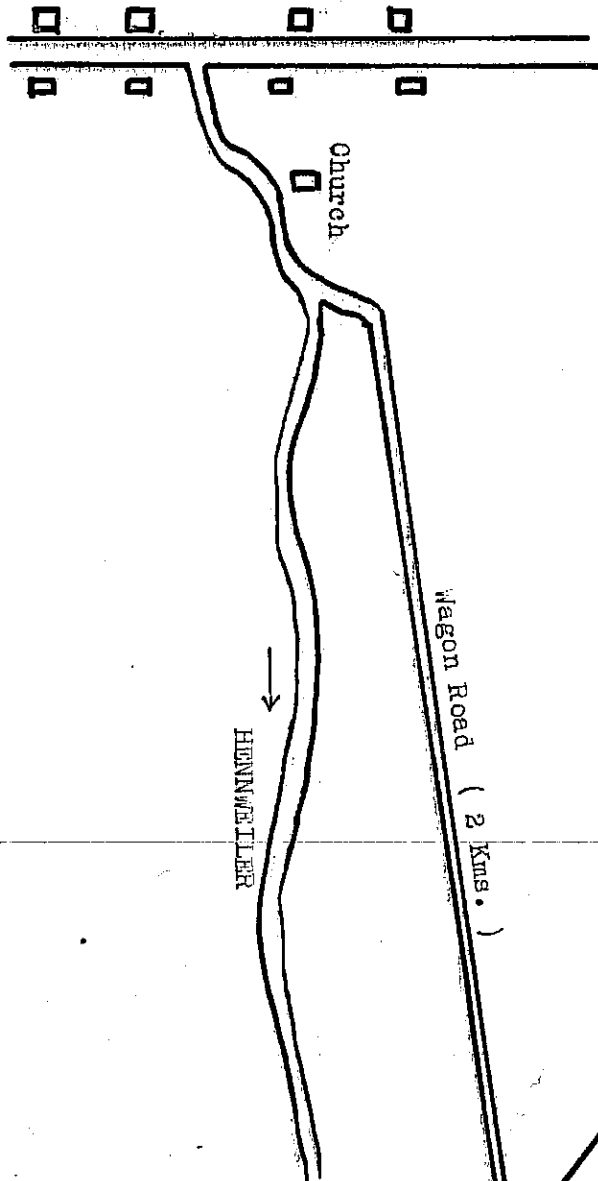
Information obtained indicates that some American deceased from the subject aircraft (which appears to be a B-17) had previously been removed from KELLENBACH by American forces.

Since sufficient remains have been uncovered to conclude the presence of an overlooked deceased this remains is being submitted as SR-229 for further examination in order to associate it with GLENN R. BILLINGSLEY, or any other crewmember of this aircraft as yet not accounted for.

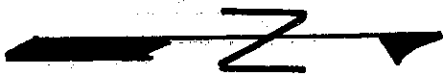
Present officially at the site of excavation to insure the proper and thorough search for further remains (soil was thoroughly sifted) were Mr. ZERFASS, Burgermeister of KELLENBACH and policeman MACRE, of the German Gendarmerie in GIMMENDINGEN, Kreis SIMMERN.

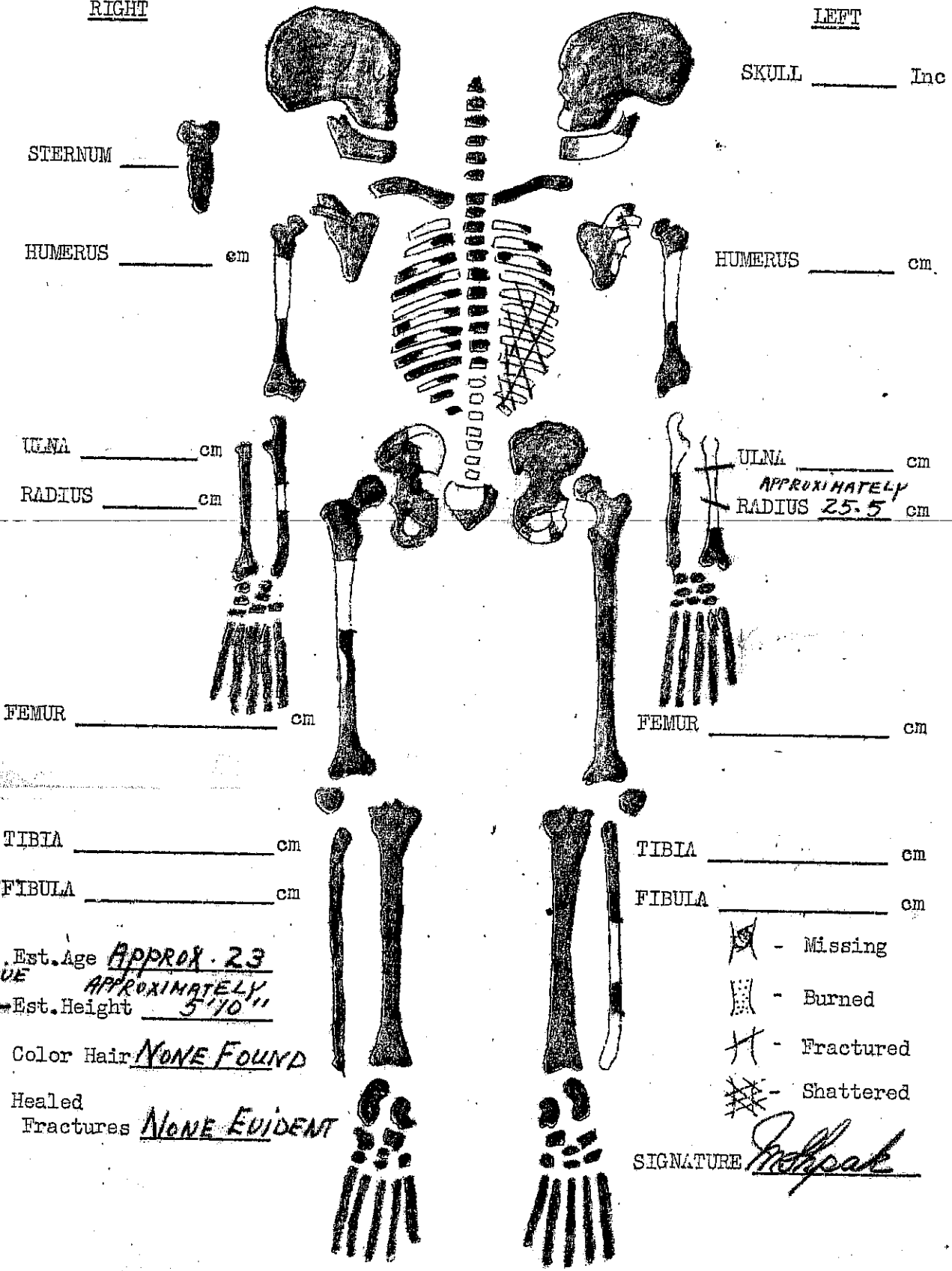



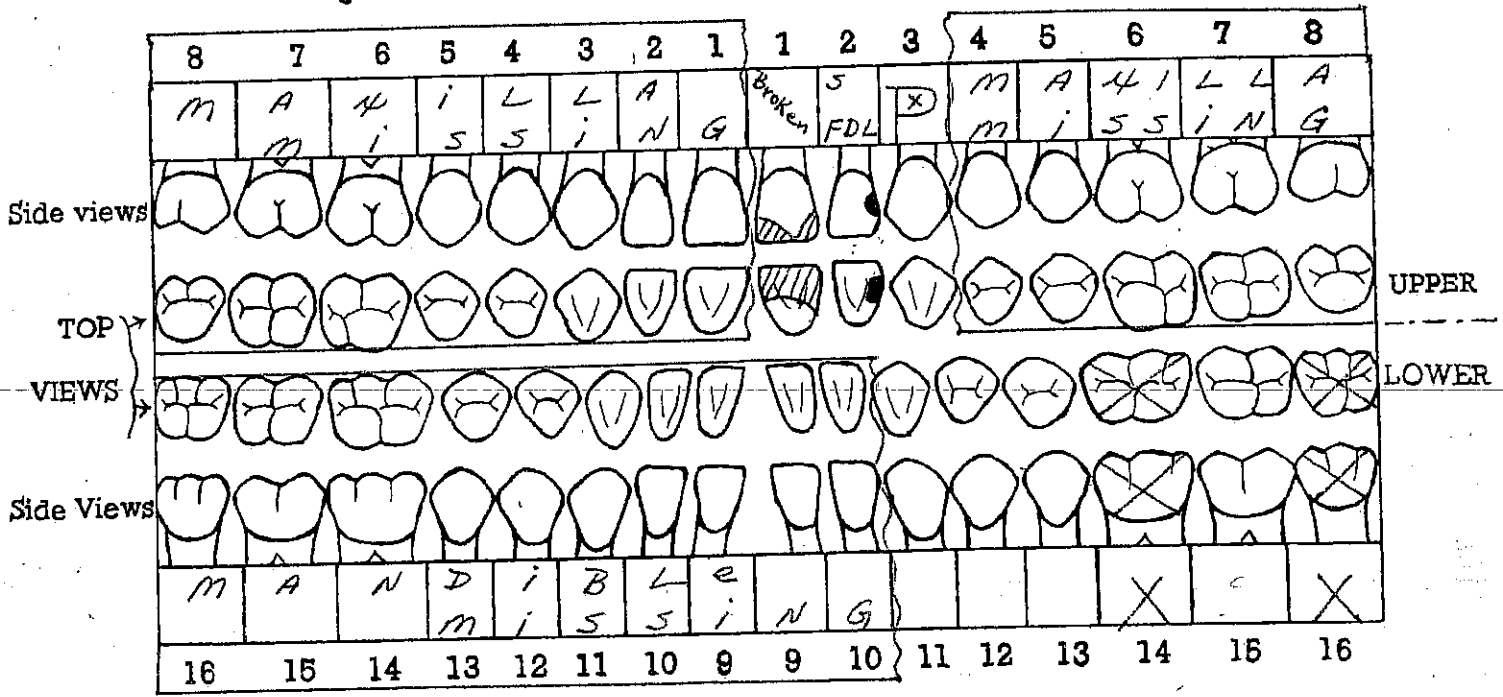

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. TO: Chief, Army Effects Bureau

1. As a result of a survey recently conducted at the Army Effects Bureau by a representative of the Memorial Division, it was found that there are approximately 200 cases of World War II Unknowns for whom personal effects are stored at the Bureau. All information pertinent to identification has been extracted from these effects and a complete inventory has been furnished the Identification Branch of all such effects.

2. Since the World War II Unknown personal effects will be of no further value to the Memorial Division for identification purposes, authority is hereby delegated to the Chief, Army Effects Bureau, to render administrative determinations on disposition of personal effects for World War II Unknowns.

3. A certificate signed by the Chief, indicating reasons for disposal of the property will be placed in the case folder and the case closed.

Teeth recovered are in comparison with Form 371 for Billingsley. No articulation of mandible with the skull or the skull with the vertebral column is possible due to absence of skeletal parts. Height estimation was based on measurement of fragment of the left radius, using the Krogman system of fragmentary evidence. The remains is homogeneous.

Portion of mandible recovered does not agree for Guion. No articulation is possible due to absence of skeletal parts. Only skull fragments and piece of the right pubic symphysis are present. Weight and height estimation is impossible due to missing skeletal parts.

No teeth have been recovered and no articulation is possible throughout these remains due to the presence of only a few skeletal parts. Characteristics of the bone fragments indicate that this decedent was light built and of short stature.

Cause of death: Characteristics of the bone fragments indicate either plane crash or some sort of explosion.

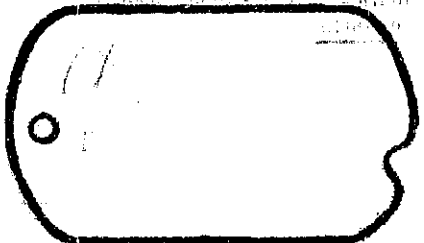
