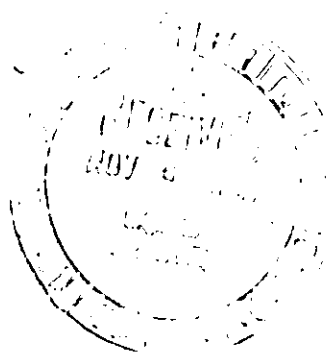



REMARKS: UNKNOWN X-2225 AGRS Mausoleum, Manila, P.I., formerly Unk X-591 USAF Cem Leyte #1, P.I., might be that of Ensign Daniel Boone who was said carrying some keys on a chain before he was killed by the Japs in March 1944, according to previous Report of Interment. However, in the Search and Recovery Report Trip #57 Search #10 and attachment #1 and #2 the identification clue found on grave #1 where subject case was disinterred was a cross with information "CHARLES F. HARRISON, Major C.W.S. 5-22-44".

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

This is to certify that on April 6, 1947, three American Soldiers came inside the Colony asking the place of the crashed airplane and also the American National Cemetery. Being the nearest person available, I was ordered by the Superintendent to escort the said soldiers. I brought them first to the place of the crashed airplane, three (3) kilometers away from the central. We located any possible identification of the plane and also its number. We found on the tail a number bearing 44074, and also in one part of the wing is a letter ROLFE.

The following day, two of the Americans came again and I brought them to the American National Cemetery. I brought with me fifteen (15) men to dig up the graves. We have dug around sixteen (16) graves and found bones of the deceased. Some skulls were missing and in one grave, there was only a pair of gloves without any sign of human bones. All in all there were fifteen (15) graves dug that have human bones though most part of it were missing.

STATEMENT

Iligan, Lanao
April 29, 1947

SUBJECT: American Graveyard at Davao Penal Colony
TO : Lt. Maple

To the best of my memory, the following was the condition of the American Prisoners Graveyard at Davao Penal Colony in May 1944, when we were moved away.

The Cemetery was located about $\frac{1}{2}$ km. east of the main compound and on the south side of the railroad tracks. At the time of our departure, when the camp was closed, there were twenty seven graves, each marked with a gray wooden cross with the men's name carved into the cross. As you enter the Cemetery through the wooden arch and along the pathway, the graves are to the right and left. All of the bodies were of men who died of sickness or disease except two. These two were killed by the Japanese as follows:


Ensign DANIEL BOONE: Small, slim, bald headed with large nose and wore glasses; killed by Japanese when he attempted to escape in March 1944. He was buried in the Cemetery and as I remember, did carry some keys on a chain. His bones would be small and slight.

Major CHARLES HERRISON, C.W.S., (Leesburg, Virginia): Average sized man. He was captured while attempting to escape and was killed by the Japanese soldiers at the guardhouse at Davao Penal Colony, during the night. They claimed he died of his wounds, but that was impossible, because he was not badly wounded when captured. Date of his death was around May 22, 1944.

I do not remember the names of the other men that died there, but all the names that Lt. Maple already has, sound very familiar to me.

This is to certify that on April 6, 1947, three American Soldiers came inside the Colony asking the place of the crashed airplanes and also the American National Cemetery. Being the nearest person available, I was ordered by the Superintendent to escort the said soldiers. I brought them first to the place of the crashed airplane, three (3) kilometers away from the central. We located any possible identification of the plane and also its number. We found on the tail a number bearing 44074, and also in one part of the wind is a letter ROLFE.

The following day, two of the Americans came again and I brought them to the American National Cemetery. I brought with me fifteen (15) men to dig up the graves. We have dug around sixteen (16) graves and found bones of the deceased. Some skulls were missing and in one grave, there was only a pair of gloves without any sign of human bones. All in all there were fifteen (15) graves dug that have human bones though most part of it were missing.

SUBJECT: American Graveyard at Davao Penal Colony

TO : Lt. Waple

To the best of my memory, the following was the condition of the American Prisoners Graveyard at Davao Penal Colony in May 1944, when we were moved away.

The Cemetery was located about $\frac{1}{2}$ km. east of the main compound and on the south side of the railroad tracks. At the time of our departure, when the camp was closed, there were twenty seven graves, each marked with a gray wooden cross with the man's name carved into the cross. As you enter the Cemetery through the wooden arch and along the pathway, the graves are to the right and left. All of the bodies were of men who died of sickness or disease except two. These two were killed by the Japanese as follows:


Ensign DANIEL BOONE: Small, slim, bald headed with large nose and wore glasses; killed by Japanese when he attempted to escape in March 1944. He was buried in the Cemetery and as I remember, did carry some keys on a chain. His bones would be small and slight.

Major CHARLES HARRISON, C.W.S., (Leesburg, Virginia): Average sized man. He was captured while attempting to escape and was killed by the Japanese soldiers at the guardhouse at Davao Penal Colony, during the night. They claimed he died of his wounds, but that was impossible, because he was not badly wounded when captured. Date of his death was around May 22, 1944.

I do not remember the names of the other men that died there, but all the names that Lt. Waple already has, sound very familiar to me.
