





#### ALL TIMES GOT

SUBJECT: Summary of Statements by Survivors of the SS MATTHEN P.

DEADY, American Freighter, 7176 G.T., owned by War Shippin Administration, operated by American-Hawaiian Steamship Co

- 1. The MATTHEW P. DEADY was damaged by Japanese aircraft at 2135 GC 2 Nov 1944, while at anchor in Tacloban Bay, Leyte, P.I., having sailed from Hellandia 23 Oct in convey, arriving at San Pedro Bay Leyte, P.I., 29 Oct; leaded with approximately 900 U.S. Army troops as passenders and a carge of approximately 5560 tens consisting of the troops goar, drums of gaseline, trucks, acetylene tanks, sulphuric acid and general military stores. On 2 Nov convey moved anchorage to Tacloban Bay. Vessel did not sink and returned to Hellar dia under her own power.
- 2. Ship was at anchor, crow at general quarters, completely black-out. The sky was clear with scattered clouds, wind West force 2-3, visibility limited, about 10-15 ships in sight of about 100 ships in harbor. Moon, which was almost full, had just gone down and it was just before daybreak.
- 3. At about 2125 an air raid alort consist ng of 3 star shells from shore, w as observed by lookoutsl General quarters was called and immediately thereafter several planes were heard in the harbor area At 2135 a Jap plane was sighted approximately 1000 yards away, appl hing ship'2 points on the starboard quarter. Thank dropped a stick of bombs about 100 yards astern and then started strafing ship with machine gun file. Tlane, strafing continually, swerwed over ship's storn, passed to port and flow alongside, then sworved back and cra into the #2 gen tub, which is situated abreast #1 hatch on the port. side. Plane was taken under fire by #9 - 2m mm gun, as seen as it was sighted. Tracers from this gun showed that gunner was making direct hits, and a small glame was noted under the plane as it pass over the stern. Plane was thenfired on by #2 gun which also made direct hits and which kept firing until the plane crashed into it. is the plane crashed into #2 gun tub there was an immediate explosi set fire togaseline, acetylene and exygen taks stored under and forward of #2 gun tub while the flash of the second explosion set f to the remainder of the forward deck load, consisting of gasoline range fuel for the Army mass stoves and approximately 300 activlene and oxygon tanks. The terrific heat produced caused 20 mm ammuniti in the #2 roady boxes to explode, spraying the entire ship with fre ments. Flames spread forward to the bow and threatdneed to engulf 3" 50 ammunition magine and roady beass of the #1 gun. Master ord abandon ship stations in order to assemble his crow, and from these stations he ordered crow to fire stations. Armod Guard stood by t guns in case of further attack, while members of the merchant eron played water over the the entire area forward of #3 hatch and three a wall of water around the gasoline, acetylene and exygen tanks. Water was kept on the forward gun tub and ready boxes and the area of the forward magazine. Fire was brought under control within an hour,

#### SS MATTHEW P. DEADY

There was a hole 1' square in hull on starboard side aft just below aft ammunition magazine about 10' above water line and 40' forward of screw, believed to run. No. 2 gun and tub completely demolished and #1 gun position damaged his to fire and excessive heat Deck buckled downward near #2 gun where plane hit; bulwark bent outward at that point; 2 small heles about 32' in diameter burned in deck as a upper strakes forward damaged as result of fire and heat. Carge goar, beens and dec-machinery for #1 and #2 burned and weakened. Interior of #1 hatch burned and #1 hatch covere beards destroyed. Hain engines were not damaged. Machinery damaged restricted to deck goar such as beens and winches on #1 and 2 hatches. At about 2150 five Jap dive bembers came in ever ship and the immediate area, dropp anti-personnel bembs and strafing the ship and personnel in the water who had been blown ever the side or had jumped to escape the fire. One of these planes was a het down by 20 mm guns aboard ship, and a second plane-was-listed as probably destroyed as it was anothing heavily when last soon. No information available regarding disposition confidential codes but it is assured that they were retained on on board.

- 4. Ship was not ordered abandoned but some of the personnel was bloveverbeard by the explosion or jumped everbeard to escape the fire. Total complement on board was "And including 37 merchant spam, 27 Armod Guard and approximately 680 U.S. Army troops as passengers. Entire merchant crow survived. Two Armod Guard missing from "2 gun tub, 25 survived, Of the Army passengers, 22 were killed, 35 missing and unknown number injural, 4 of whom subsequently died. About 220 troops had been discharged the previous day. Most of the Army casualties were the result of the initial crash and explosion. Army personnel sleeping on the main dock, part side, were burned by the first flash of the explosion, same were bloom everbeard and other jumped everbeard to escape the fire. Fragments of the plane and bursting ammunition injured several, some were hit by strafing and a few were injured by 20 mm shells expleded by heat.
- 5. The Jap plane was described as having a single motor, four bladed propelle and resembling an "Oscar". Survivers were of the opinion that Jap pilets were out to do as much damage as possible before going into their final dives. During ther stay in port numeroud attacks we witnessed with planes usually making a bembing run on one ship, strafing a second and finally crashing into a third. Nearly all divewere made at steep angles of 45° to 70°, and in most cases planes appeared to be undamaged prior to their final dives. In describing the tactic carried out by the "ap dive squadrons, survivers stated" that at about 0930, 12 Nev, 2 groups of Jap planes appeared at about 3000, one group consisting of 7 planes and the other of 6 planes. No air raid warning had been given by shore authorities. Two Jap planes were shot down by P-38's. The rest began circling and poolir off preparatory to diving on ships. Of the 11 planes, 5 were soon crash into vessels while 6 missed their targets and crashed into the bay.

6. On 12 Nov 44, while anchored about ½ raile off Dulag, Leyte, F.I., ship was again under attack. Because of the suddeness of this second attack, survivors were unable to give a full description of what happed. Three single-engine/apanese planes (prehably Zerees) were seen coming in from the West. It was later learned that no air raid warni signal was given as the plane had followed in from the West sene U.S. Army C-47's which were preparing to land. The planes immediately begaining upon and attacking 3 ships lying about 800 m 300 yards North and West of the MATTHEW P. DEADY. One of the planes came in on the starboard beam attempting to strate ship. No. 9 gun took plane under fire at 300 yards. Thene was elserved to eatch fire. If drift ed slightly upward and, eversheeting the ship's superstructure, carried away the radio aerial and fell harmlessly into the water en the port side.

Survivors made the following comments and suggestions:

Military personnel carried as passengers on Liberty-type ships should be taken off immediately upon reaching the lattle zeros. Jap planes appear to a ingle out for attack ships crowded with troops.

The air raid warning system ashere on Leyte is apparently not adequate, as ships were often under attack before the crow was aware an airmaid was under way.

Barrage balloons should be used to combat the Jap dive planes.

U.S. Army troops should be provided with life jackets as many men were lost as they were unable to swim after being bluwn ever the side. The Armed Guard crow passed out all spare life jackets available, but did not have nearly enough to take care of the number men abeard.

le The following information has been received by the Office of Naval Intelligence in a report dated 7 November 1944 regarding the SS MATTH W 1. DEADY (US), which was bended, strafed and crashedived by Japanese planes 3 November 1944, while at anchor in Tacaloban Bay, Leyte, P.I.:

sions occurred and the forward part of ship caught fire immediately. Troops and crewmen who were forward had to abanden ship by jumping over board. While these meny ore swimming, Jap planes were strafing the water and dropping anti-personnel bombs. Two members of the U.S. Navy Armed Guard went ever the side without life jackets to escape the fire and swam to another ship about 500 yards off the starboard beam. They towed an Army man who had been severely burned and could not swim to this ship. The Army man was alive when taken abourd but his name could not be ascertained. This fact can be verified by Captain Mullins, 768th Engineer Dump Truck Co., Base K, Leyte, T.I. As result of the attacks, U.S. Army casualties were: 22 killed, 125 injured, 4 of whem have died, and 35 missing.


