- when the transport 35 Mathew P. Deedy was attacked by an enemy suicide airplane while anchored in Tacloban May, Leyto, P.1. The complete casualty list as prepared by 430 21 May 1945 is believed to be accurate, however, it does not agree with the number of desumities reported by the U. S. Navy 15 June 1944. It is quite possible that other deceased still carried as missing in action were casualties aboard this ship.
- 5. In the two individual identifications recommended the identifications are basedentirely on the available army dental records of the deceased. Under the circumstances which surround the entire incident it is considered that this basis does not warrant conclusive individual identifications.
- 4. Two Havy personnel, S 1/C John L. Corbell, 8860299, and S 1/C Robert W. Loller, 8716295, were declared missing in action after the bombing of the Deady. Remains have never been recovered and identified as being those of these decodents. Forms 371 for the two deceased are included herewith.
- 5. As stated in pargraph #2, above, there is some doubt as to the actual number of casualties from this incident. Furthermore, it is known that some personnel aboard the Deady jumped overhoard in an attempt to save themselves. It is quite possible that bodies washed up on the shore after the incident were, in fact, deceased from the Deady.

SUBJECT: Summary of Statements by Survivors of the SS MATTHEW P. DEADY, American Freighter, 7176 G.T., owned by War Shipping Administration, operated by American-Hawaiian Steamship Co

- 1. The MATTHEW P. DEADY was damaged by Japanese aircraft at 2135 GC 2 Nov 1944, while at anchor in Tacloban Bay, Leyto, P.I., having sailed from Hellandia 23 Oct in convoy, arriving at San Podro Bay Leyte, P.I., 29 Oct; loaded with approximately 900 U.S. Army troops as passengers and a carge of approximately 5560 tens consisting of the troops goar, drums of gaseline, trucks, acetylene tanks, sulphuric acid and general military stores. On 2 Nov convoy moved anchorage to Tacloban Bay. Vessel did not sink and returned to Hellar dia under her own power.
- 2. Ship was at anchor, crow at general quarters, completely blackout. The sky was clear with scattered clouds, wind West force 2-3,
 visibility limited, about 10-15 ships in sight of about 100 ships in
 harbor. Moon, which was almost full, had just gone down and it was
 just before daybreak.
- 3. At about 2125 an air raid alort consist ng of 3 star shells from shore, w as observed by lookoutsl General quarters was called and immediately thereafter several planes were heard in the harbor area At 2135 a Jap plane was sighted approximately 1000 yards away, appr hing ship' 2 points on the starboard quarter. Thank dropped a stick of bombs about 100 yards astern and then started strafing ship with machine gun file. Ilane, strafing continually, swerwed over ship's storn, passed to port and flow alongside, then sworved back and cra into the #2 gun tub, which is situated abreast #1 hatch on the port sido. Plane was taken under fire by #9 - 2m mm gun, as seen as it was sighted. Tracers from this gun showed that gunner was making direct hits, and a small flame was noted under the plane as it pass over the stern. Plane was thenfired on by #2 gun which also made direct hits and which kept firing until the plane crashed into it. is the plane crashed into #2 gen tub there was an immediate explosi set fire togaseline, acetylene and exygen taks stored under and forward of #2 gun tub while the flash of the seconde xplosion set f to the remainder of the forward deck load, constitute of gasoline range fuel for the Army rass stoves and approximately 300 acetylone and oxygon tanks. The terrific heat produced caused 20 mm armunits in the #2 roady boxes to explode, spraying the entire ship with fra ments. Flamos spread forward to the bow and throatdneed to engulf 3" 50 ammunition magine and roady boxes of the #1 gun. Master ord abandon ship stations in order to assemble his crew, and from these stations he ordered crew to fire stations. Armed Guard stood by to guns in case of further attack, while members of the merchant ereplayed water over the the entire area forward of #3 hatch and three a wall of water around the gasoline, acetylene and exygen tanks. Water was kept on the forward gun tub and ready boxes and the area of the forward ragazine. Fire was brought under control within an hour.

SS MATTHEW P. DEADY

There was a hole l' square in hull on standeard side aft just below aft ammunition magazine about 10 above water line and 40 forward of screw, believed to run. No. 2 gun and tub completely domolished and #1 gun position dans and luc to fire and excessive hear Deck buckled downward near #2 gun where plane hit; bulwark bent out-ward at that point; 2 small holes about 32 in diameter burned in dock as a uppor strakes forward damaged as result of fire and heat. Cargo gear, booms and doc-machinery for #1 and #2 burned and woakened. Interior of #1 hatch burned and #1 hatch covere beards destroyed. Main engines were not damaged. Machinery damaged restricted to deck goar such as booms and winches on #1 and 2 hatches. At about 2150 five Jap dive bembers came in over ship and the immediate area, dropp anti-personnel bombs and strafing the ship and personnel in the water who had been blown over the side or had jumped to escape the fire. One of those planes was s het down by 20 mm guns aboard ship, and a soword planaryasrlasted as probably destroyed as it was smaking heavily when last seen. No information available regarding disposition confidential codes but it is assured that they were retained on on board.

- 4. Ship was not ordered abandoned but some of the personnel was bloverboard by the explosion or jumped everboard to escape the fire. Total complement on board was 72. including 37 merchant spam, 27 Armed Guard and approximately 680 U.S. Army troops as passengers. Entire merchant crow survived. Two Armed Guard missing from 72 gun tub, 25 survived. Of the Army passengers, 22 were killed, 35 missing and unknown number injurally, 4 of whom subsequently died. About 220 troops had been discharged the previous day. Most of the Army casualties were the result of the initial crash and explosion. Army personnel sleeping on the main dock, port side, were burned by the first flash of the explosion, some were blown everboard and other jumped everboard to escape the fire. Fragments of the plane and bursting ammunition injured several, some were hit by strafing and a few were injured by 20 mm shells expleded by heat.
- 5. The Jap plane was described as having a single motor, four blade propelle and resembling an "Oscar". Survivers were of the opinion that Jap pilets were out to do as much demage as possible before going into their final dives. During ther stay in port numeroud attacks we witnessed with planes usually making a bembing run on one ship, strafing a second and finally crashing into a third. Nearly all divewere made at steep angles of 45° to 70°, and in most cases planes appeared to be undamaged prior to their final dives. In describing the tactic carried out by the ap dive squadrens, survivers stated that at about 0930, 12 Nev, 2 groups of Jap planes ampeared at about 3000; one group consisting of 7 planes and the other of 6 planes. No air raid warning had been given by shore authorities. Two Jap planes were shet down by P-38's. The rest began circling and pooling off preparatory to diving on ships. Of the 11 planes, 5 were seen crash into vessels while 6 missed their targets and crashed into the bay.

6. On 12 Nov 44, white anchored about & rile off Dulag, Loyte, 1.1., ship was again under attack. Because of the suddeness of this second attack, survivers were unable to give a full description of what happed. Three single-engine/apanese planes (probably Zeroes) were seen coming in from the West. It was later learned that no air raid warni signal was given as the plane had followed in from the West seme U.S army C-47's which were preparing to land. The planes immediately bendiving upon and attacking 3 ships lying about 800 - 260 yards North and West of the MAFTHEW P. DELDY. One of the planes came in on the starboard beam attempting to strate ship. No. 9 gun took plane under fire at 300 yards. These was elseved to eatth fire. If drift od slightly upward and, eversheeting the ship's superstructure, carried away the radio aerial and foll harmlessly into the water on the port side.

Survivors made the following comments and suggestions:

Military personnel carried as passengers on Liberty-type ships should be taken off immediately upon reaching the battle zenes. Jap planes appear to a ingle out for attack ships crowded with troops.

The air raid warning system ashere on Leyto is apparently not adequate, as ships were often under attack before the crow was aware an air maid was under way.

Barrage Lalkeens should be used to combat the Jap dive planes.

U.S. Army troops should be provided with life jackets as many men were lost as they were unable to swim after being bluwn over the side. The Armod Guard crow passed out all spare life jackets available, but did not have nearly enough to take care of the number men aboard.

sions occurred and the forward part of ship caught fire immediately. Troops and crewmen who were forward had to abanden ship by jumping over board. While these menwers swimming, Jap planes were strafing the water and dropping anti-personnel bombs. Two members of the U.S. Navy Armed Guard went over the side without life jackets to escape the fire and swam to another ship about 500 yards off the starboard beam. 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
