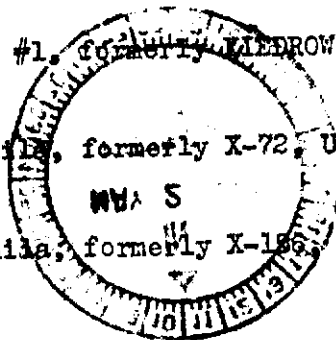

The records of this Office indicate that QMC Forms 1042 are not on file for these Unknown Deceased, therefore, it is requested that Reports of Storage be forwarded as soon as practicable.

4. Findings of Unidentifiability, your headquarters, dated 6 December 1949, for Unknown X-342, Grave 1162, USAF Cemetery, Finschhafen #5, have been suspended. The records of this Office indicate that a QMC Form 1042 is not on file for this Unknown Deceased. A further search of records indicates that Unknown X-342, Grave 1460, USMC Finschhafen #5, formerly X-2701-A, AGRS Mausoleum Manila, and previously interred as X-94, Finschhafen #5, was approved as Unidentifiable by letter this Office, dated 16 September 1949. In view of the above, it is requested that your headquarters conduct an investigation to clarify the above.

1. In connection with the three (3) decedents mentioned in basic communication, our records reveal that investigations relative to subject cases have been completed resulting in the following recommendations:

a. Unknown X-3724, AGRS Mausoleum, Manila, P.I., has been recommended to be identified as Pvt. Orville E. Bundy, 39 142 485. (Board Proceedings dated 21 March 1949).

b. Unknown X-3725, AGRS Mausoleum, Manila, P.I., has been recommended to be identified as Pvt. Ernest G. Von Gruenigen, 37 700 779. (Board Proceedings dated 5 May 1949).

c. The remains of Pvt. Sherman F. Kerr, 38 567 625, have been recommended to be considered non-recoverable inasmuch as no Unknown could be associated with the decedent. (Board Proceedings dated 7 May 1949).

2. The Board Proceedings for the above mentioned cases were already forwarded to your office.

3. In compliance with paragraph 4 of basic letter, a final review of the cases has been made and it has been determined that no other Unknown recovered from the decedents' place of death could be associated with anyone of the three (3) decedents.

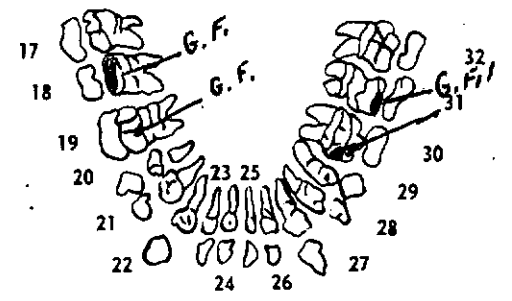
