DISAPPROVAL OF FIELD BOARD FINDINGS

Field Board Findings received recommending the individual identification of Unknown X-3752, AGRS Mausoleum, Manila, as Pfc. William E. Goodall, 12055037.

Pfc. Goodall was killed in action 5 December 1944 when the troop ship, SS Marcus Daly, on which he was a passenger, was damaged by Japanese bombs. There were twenty-three casualties not accounted for after the raid. A Casualty Roster issued by the 38th Infantry Division, Goodall's outfit, indicated that Pfc. Goodall's remains were recovered. Presumably, identification was lost.

There is only very meager dental information for both Pfc. Goodall and Unknown X-3752 (remains recovered from SS Marcus Daly), so a good comparison of the two is virtually impossible. In comparison of tooth charts of some of the other missing men, two have equally favorable dental and height comparisons with Unknown X-3752. This fact makes it difficult to assure an absolute individual identification.

Based on the above listed points, it is recommended that the Field Board Findings be disapproved.

SUMMARY: Case history surrounding the SS Marcus Daly □

Field Board Findings Received recommending two individual identifications and one group identification. See attached individual status report.

The SS Marcus Daly was damaged by enemy aircraft at 0900 5 December 1944 in area 09.34N - 127.35E and at 0855 10 December in Tarragona Harbor Leyte Gulf. Ship sailed from Hollandia 29 November in convoy for San Pedro Bay, Leyte, P.I., carrying 1211 U.S. Army troops.

As a result of the first attack many of the Army troops were blown or jumped over the side to get away from the intense heat, others were trapped below deck. A Jap plane crashed into the forward section of the ship evidently carrying bombs. The second attack was strafing of the ship and the smaller vessels along side which were in the process of unloading cargo and personnel.

A total of 39 Army personnel were believed to have been killed as a result of the two attacks. Status of individuals follows:

The Unknowns do not all state that they were believed to have been from the Marcus Daly but they all say that the organization was 149th Inf. which coincides with the unit aboard the Daly at the time of the attacks.

It is the investigators opinion that the group identification of eight Unknowns as the recoverable remains of eighteen deceased would be satisfactory provided the non-recoverable findings on ~~HASTINGS~~ Dunbar are cancelled and the non-recoverable findings on Brown are disapproved. Faughender and Goodall would also be in the group. However, if the non-recoverable situation is not cancelled, is it possible to make the remaining eight Unknowns the recoverable remains of the remaining 16 deceased? Also any action taken will require a letter to the Field requesting them to consider the findings of this Office. It appears necessary to clear the situation concerning the two remains which were found during the reprocessing of Jones. If these remains were not CIL, which the investigator doubts inasmuch as one was almost a complete skeleton, there is a possibility that these remains should be added to the group.

Investigator recommends group eight Unknowns (ten if other two not CIL) as the recoverable remains of eighteendeceased be considered by the Field. (non-recoverables should be cancelled and disapproved respectively).

PLACE: Leyte on 5 Dec 1944.

On December 5, 1944, about 1538 hours, or 3:38 P.M., an enemy bomber crashed into #1 hold of this ship. The ship's side, both port and starboard, were blown out, from tween deck to main deck. On December 10 at 1700 hours or 5:00 P.M., while cargo was being discharged, near Tarragona, another Jap plane crashed dived into the port wing of the bridge. Both #2 and #4 life boats were carried away and the gun on the port side of the bridge is gone. The second bomb exploded in the lighter alongside #4 hatch, and bomb fragments punctured the ships side above the water line in many places. SS MARCUS DALY sailed from Hollandia on Dec 31 for San Francisco, and required drydocking and heavy repairs as a result of battle damage.
