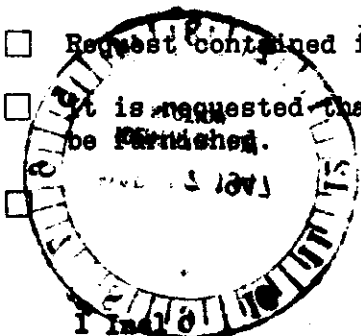

The body was buried at a depth of four feet, with bamboo cross at the head. No identification was found in the grave or on the cross. One lower leg bone was broken. Burial was made by Estanislao Ylan, 3rd Lt., Bluetail Guard. A Mr. Leonacio Madreo at Pintuyan, who took papers from the body, turned them over to a Lieutenant Tanis Smith, 14 Platoon, 574 Signal Air Corps. Time of burial was about January 1945.

It is requested that this Bureau be furnished all available information regarding this burial, including the deceased's name, if known, and disposition of papers.

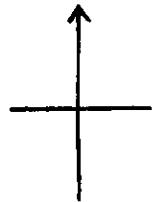
