- l. Information contained in the following paragraphs was derived by Language Officers of this command from interrogation and signed statements of Prisoners of War. All prisoners interrogated were stationed at SAN JOSE, PANAY, during March, 1945. When the officers whose statements are appended in enclosures above were first interrogated they told a complicated lie. The truth was elicited only after much cheeking and reinterrogation. It is believed that the statements of facts in papagraphs 2 and 3 are an accurate, if general, picture of the actual proceedings.
- 2. On or about 15 March, 1945, two P-61 airplanes recommended the area of SAN JOSE, PANAY. One crashed due to engine trouble, one of its occupants being killed instantly and the other severely injured about the head. The injured man, name unknown, is described as weighing about 152 pounds and being about 5 ft. 4 in. tall. The dead man was probably a Second Lieutenant. The injured man was a non-commissioned officer. Their plane was based on MINDORO. The wounded man was discovered by the ISHIDA URIT, whose duty was guarding the airfield at SAN JOSE, and was handed over to the YOSHIOKA Guard Company which garrisoned SAN JOSE. He was given medical treatment and interrogated several times. 1st Lieut. YOSHIOKA, Commanding Officer of the SAN JOSE Guard Company, informed Headquarters of the TOZUKA Battalion, in ILOHIO, that he had this prisoner and requested information as to disposition. He was informed that a boat would be sent from ILOHIO to pick up the prisoner and return him to BATTALION Headquarters. Due to the American landing on PANAY, the boat never arrived. On 19 or 20 Earsh, at the direct order of 1st Lt. YOSHIOKA, Cpl. MIYAJI and Pfo. SATO

took the prisoner to a spot beside the church at SAN JOSE. Pfc. WATANABE and 2nd Class Pvt. OTA dug a grave at this spot. NIYAJI then attempted to behead the prisoner, but had to order SATO to stab him in the heart with a bayonet before they succeeded in killing him. OTA and WATANABE then buried him on the spot.

BXTRACT

STATEMENT OF 1st Lt. YOSHIOKA

On the 15 or 16 March, at about 1000, i heard an explosion which indicated an apparent erash of an airplane north of the San Jose Airfield. Immediately the ISHIDA Unit (T.N. Lt. Ishida's platoon) spent about an hour in a sereh but reported it could not discover anything. Consequently it was planned that my company too would search after lunch, but just then the ISHIDA Unit brought back an American pilot covered with blood. I tried to interrogate him, but he had a large lacerated wound above his ear on top of his head, which was gushing forth blood. Since his skull apparently had been fractured. I had a corponan apply treatment. Afterwards I questioned him, but I could not get anything satisfactory. All I could make out was "I flow from an air field in MINDORC and I was asking a recommissance of the SAN JOSE area." Accordingly I had him hospitalized the ward where he was given daily treatment, but he had no appetite and found walking difficult, lost weight, and his health declined.

I think it was on 18 March that Sgt. KUMAGAI seme and once more (we) attempted to interrogate. However we could understand almost nothing and there was nothing we could do but end the interrogation after about ten minutes.

On 19 March at 1430 in an exchange of communications I received a dispetch stating that the American forces had arrived at ILOILO and were engaged in battle. The company and all platoons were engaged in preparations for battle and at the same time were preparing for the withdrawal from SAH JOSE.

At that time the Officer of the Day came up and inquired "We can't take along the American pilot. What shall we do?"

"Dispose of him as you think best," I ordered. Whatever happened after that I don't know elearly. Whether he is dead or what, I don't know but I think that he is buried in the rear (T.N. of the Company area).

- l. I have forgotten the date, but while I was on a detail Cpl. MIYAJI was passing and ordered me to some along because the execution was about to take place.
- 2. I went along with Cpl. MIYAJI to the guard house and we led him (TH: the American) to the scene of the execution.
- 3. At the scene of the execution Pfc WATAMABE AND 2nd Class Private OTA were finishing the digging of a hole.
- 4. The execution was performed by Cpl. MIYAJI with a Japanese sword.

#### STATEMENT OF 2nd Lt. KAI

on about 15 March, 1945, after 1100, two F-61 planes flew in from the direction of the seacoast near SAN JOSE, and passed over the airfield on a course parallel to the coastline. One of the planes lost speed and its engine made an odd racket. Two or three times it circled the field and finally we heard a noise that sounded like a plane crash. Above it, the other plane circled several times.

after 1200 I waw 2nd Lt. SUGIYAMA of the ISHIDA TAI bringing the American and four or five soldiers to the guard unit by truck. They arrived while all the officers were at lunch. According to 2nd Lt. SUGIYAMA'S story, five or six soldiers of the ISHIDA TAI had brought him in after finding him collapsed on the road near the ISHIDA TAI gate, while they were carrying lunch to a patrol, and had brought him in. I could see he had evidently hurt his head upon crashing and was wounded on the forehead. He was taken immediately to sick bay and I saw him given first aid by Medical Corpsman ISHIDA. Then the treatment was finished, lst Lt. YOSHIOKA asked him his name and place of birth, etc. He was a gunner and an officer candidate (sic). At that time 2nd Lt. OKUDA, Warrant Officer NAKANO, 2nd Lt. KIKUCHI, I, and others were present.

I was in my quarters at the time, but on the afternoon of the 20th about 1700, I saw the man in charge of the sentries with two men go behind Guard Unit Headquarters, leading him (TN: The prisoner). Because I saw it from a distance, I don't know who the Officer In Charge was, but according to the story among the troops it was Cpl NIY.JI. Col. MIYAJI executed the prisoner and buried the body, it is said.

In accordance with the orders of Squad Leader Alyadi, I went with ife. allawable and dug a hole beside the church, having been ordered to do so, in as much as Squad Leader Miyadi, ife. Antholds, and I were to kill the american at that time.

The american was escorted by Squad Leader FIYAJI, AND Profsato.

Equad Leader MIYAJI decapitated the prisoner. Pfc. EATO stabled the prisoner's stomach with a bayonet.

In accordance with the orders of Squad Leader FIYAJI, rfc. WATANABE and I buried the executed American in the hole we had dug, and then returned.

The American to be executed was made by Equad Leader EIYAJI to sit on the side of the hole.

I have forgotten the day on which the american was executed. I taink the time of day was about 1500.

The case of Flight Officer Lally is very clearly traced up to the point of taking custody of the remains by personnel of the 40th Division, Lt. Kramer (Krammer) and Sgt. Slate (Slake), see Incl. 3 et al. There is little doubt that the remains recovered by them reached IloIlo.
- 2. Par. 3, 2nd W/Indorsement, largely explains why this case has not been solved. Desire information on the current status of these records and if not yet received, desire an outling of the steps taken to date.
- 3. These records may not actually name F/O Lally, but a beheaded corpse of a very small man with fractured skull above the ear are better clues than average.
- 4. Reference par. 4, 2nd W/Indorsement, the allusion to the two Navy remains should not be allowed to confuse the search for Lally. There is excellent evidence (Incl. #4) that Lally's remains were recovered. Tooth charts of the available unknowns are not considered by this headquarters the only means available for identity, as stated. More careful investigation is recommended to enable this case to be closed.

In view of the fact that the dates of death and geographical location concerned agree precisely and association of plane numbers would seem to be implied this headquarters submits these two (2) Casualty Reports with the hope that further investigation by higher headquarters may establish the identification of these unknowns.
  - 3. Remarks on original report of interment arer
  - a. The remains consisted of but charred bease and it was thus impossible to determine data listed above or to take fingerprints or a tooth chart (teeth not found).
  - b. Japanese prisoner states that this is the body of the pilot of P-61-592. According to some POW "Gunner (S/Sgt) of this piene was executed by Japanese but the whereabouts of his body is unknown. Note: Plane in which Lt Armstrong was flying at time of crash was P-61 42-5592.
- 4. Paragraph 3 and 4, of 2nd Indorsement referring to investigation and recovery of remains of Lt Armstrong reads: (Par 3) From all information available (i.e.-statements from Japanese POWs and natives) it is my belief that the remains exhumed are the remains of the pilot of the plane 2nd Lt Donald H. Armstrong, 0-773925. (Par 4) One native states that he waw the body shortly after the crash and states further that one or two of the limbs were dismembered.
- 5. The 4th W/Indersement describes the remains interred as Unknown I-370 and as 2nd Lt Armstrong as follows:
  - a. The remains of Unknown I-370, Leyte, P.I. consist of only a charred hip bone.
