1. Field Board Proceedings, dated 26 April 1949, recommending that the remains of Unknowns X-2253, X-2338, X-2346 and X-2353, AGRS Mausoleum Manila, P.I. (Formerly Unknowns X-559, X-458, X-456 and X-457, USAF Cemetery Leyte #1, P.I.), be identified as a Group Burial, are returned herewith disapproved for the following reasons:

a. When remains were recovered, no means of identification were found and reprocessing by the Central Identification Laboratory revealed no identifying data upon which to base an identification.

b. The extreme fragmentary condition of the remains precluded the obtaining of sufficient dental and physical data for comparison with corresponding data of the decedents involved in the proposed group identification.

c. In view of the fact that many casualties were sustained by the 40th Infantry Division, as well as other units that fought in this area, no identification, either individual or group, could be justified without very substantial identifying data.

d. Documentary evidence used in the association of these Unknowns with crew members of aircraft concerned is insufficient to establish an identification.

2. It is requested that further investigation be conducted in an effort to establish the identification of subject Unknowns.

STATEMENT

On 26 March 1947 I have examined the remains interred in graves 5152, 5153 and 5154 interred in 131st Cemetery Ieyte RI, with the following results:

Unknown X-456 grave 5152 - In my opinion there are in this grave the remains of more than one body. There is in addition to the two known Femurs the head of a third. Also a bone resembling a third Femur without either articulating surface intact. Beside the two definite Radii there is also a shaft of a third. All other bones in this grave seem to be correlated to each other in pairs or groups. 3

Unknown X-547 grave 5153 - The remains of this grave constitute more than those of one person. Besides matching femurs - coccyx and radii there are 2 Femurs, 2 knee articulations, 2 Tibias one coccyx, and the articulation from a Fibula. All other bones appear to be those of one person.
