

Field Board Findings received recommending the individual identification of Unknown X-3728 as T/4 Peter P. Ceccari, 32932314.

T/4 Coccari was killed in action on Dulag, Leyte, P.I., 25 October 1944 when a Japanese bomber scored a direct hit upon an ammunition and gasoline supply dump near which T/4 Coccari and several other men were working. Most of the remains recovered were badly mutilated and burned as a result of the explosion.


When the remains were originally recovered they were designated Unknown X-34 and interred at USAF Cemetery, Dulag #1, P.I., later transferred to USAF Cemetery, Leyte #1, P.I., and redesignated Unknown X-75. Remains are new stored at Manila Mauseleum as Unknown X-3728.

The time, place and cause of death of T/4 Coccari are in agreement with information for Unknown X-3728. Physical and dental information of Unknown X-3728 and T/4 Coccari were compared with all other decedents killed by the explosion with negative results.

It is recommended that the identification of Unknown X-3728, as proposed by the Field, be approved.





Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or carines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found.
