



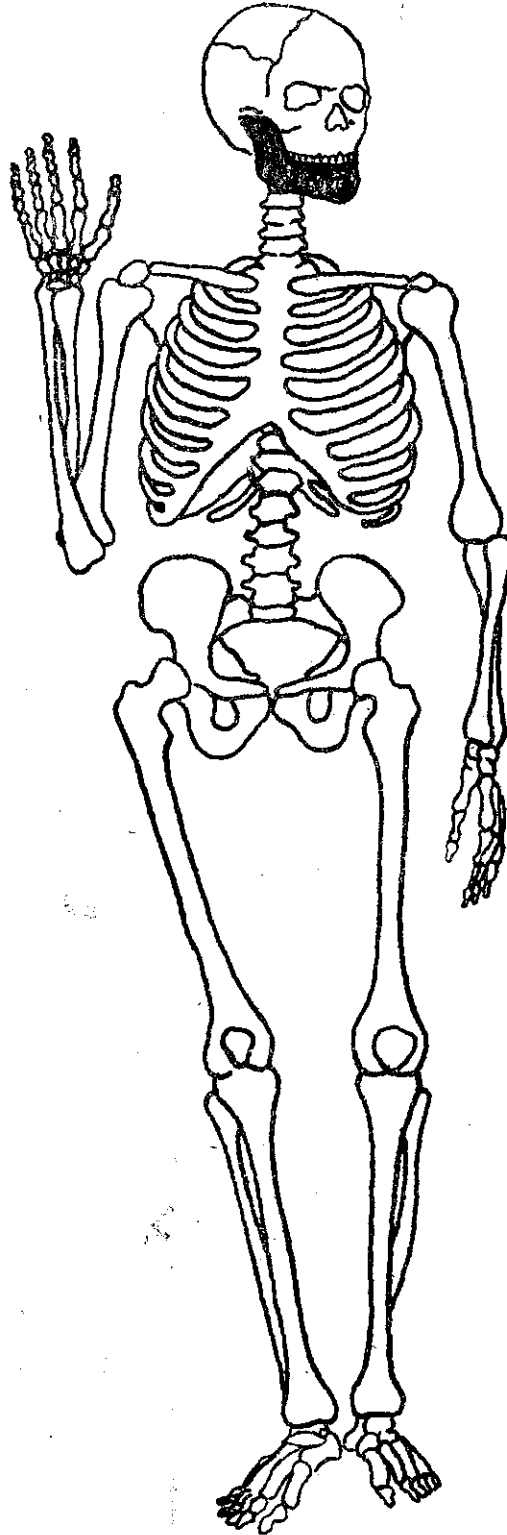

Report

Saturday, the 4th November 1944.

After information this day had been received by the Chief of Police in Kristianopels Police District, about an unknown dead man who had been found at Ungskär in Torhamns Police District, the undersigned ordered investigation for identification of the dead.

From the investigation the following can be determined:

The body was found by Anders Kurt, Oskar Nilsson, Ungskär, who found the body in the water near the beach on the eastern side of Ungskär. The local people had anchored the body to the beach and informed the Police.

During the examination of the body, in which the beach-caretakers G.A. Johannson, F.H. Ellis and G.E. Colliander, all from Tornhamn, were present, the following was found out:

It was a body of a man (175 cm, nearly).  
The body was in an advanced state of decomposition with nearly all flesh on the head and on the hands and breast gone.

It was dressed in underwear, green coveralls and a jacket of brown skin (leather), on the left sleeve a badge in yellow and red. His brown leather-boots with black rubber-soles were on his feet.  
Over his clothing was found;

- a belt for fastening the parachute.
- remains of an oxygen apparatus, and
- a pistol.

in a pocket was found a small pocket-knife with the following inscription; " U.S. Army Forces Atlantic City N.J. "

Any identification marks or other things to give information, who the dead was, were not found.

In the remains of the parachute was found the letters; U. S. A.

Considering the inscription of the knife, the remains from the parachute, the badge on his left arm, we believe that the body is an American flyer.

The body was placed in a coffin and brought to the cemetery at Tornhamn for the funeral.

X-1 was recovered from the Baltic Sea in November 1944. The deceased was found in the water near the beach at Ungskar, Sweden. The remains were then interred at the cemetery of Ostra Kirkagaard, Malmö, Sweden.

Deceased was wearing a leather flying jacket marked "Happy Daze" on back with drawings of 13 bombs. Subject jacket was traced to belong to Lt/Col Earle J. Aber Jr., O-437946 on evidence given by a returned crew member (S/Sgt. Fred W. Thomas, 33440803), however, comparison of tooth chart for X-1 with tooth chart of Lt. Col. Aber proved negative. Comparison of tooth chart for X-1 with tooth chart of 2/Lt Harper who was the only other casualty from Col. Aber's crew, also proved negative.

The tooth chart for X-1 has been compared with tooth charts for all unresolved casualties from Sweden, Denmark, North Sea and English Channel washed ashore cases with negative results.
