1. Give all information and description on dental chart as nearly correct as the condition of the body will allow. There are 32 teath to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws the teath are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting) teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars(principel chewing teeth), an examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridgework, fillings, caries (caulties of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found.


