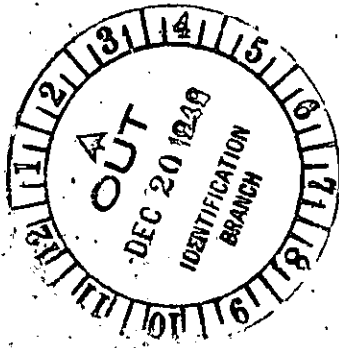

2. After a thorough study of this case, it is considered that the evidence presented is insufficient to establish identification. Dental records for Unknowns X-620, X-627, X-631, X-634, X-637, and X-639, AGRS Musoleum, Manila, recovered from the same locality, compare equally well with available Army dental and physical characteristics recorded for 21 Lt May. In addition, Army records for this officer indicate an old fracture of the right ulna. A recent re-examination of the remains of Unknown X-626 by your headquarters for evidence of this fracture has proven negative.

3. Board Proceedings have been disapproved for the reasons outlined above and are returned herewith.

2. After a thorough study of this case, it is considered that the evidence presented is insufficient to establish identification. Dental records for Unknowns X-620, X-627, X-631, X-634, X-637, and X-639, ACERS Mausoleum, Manila, recovered from the same locality, compare equally well with available Army dental and physical characteristics recorded for 2d Lt May. In addition, Army records for this officer indicate an old fracture of the right ulna. A recent re-examination of the remains of Unknown X-626 by your headquarters for evidence of this fracture has proven negative.

3. Board Proceedings have been disapproved for the reasons outlined above and are returned herewith.

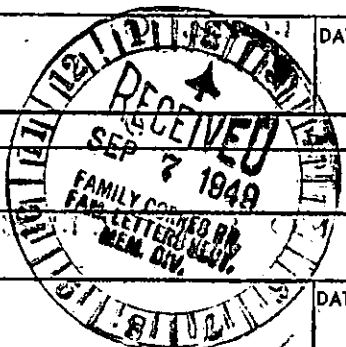

1. Reference is made to our 1st Indorsement, dated 1 April 1949, to your letter, file QMGMT 293, X-620, AGRS Mausoleum, Manila, Formerly X-132, USAF Cemetery Manila #2, subject: Identification of Unknown Deceased, copies of which are enclosed herewith.

2. A further investigation in an effort to obtain additional substantiating data necessary in the identification procedure has been completed with negative results.

3. A research of available records pertaining to the 31st Infantry Regiment disclosed that the said outfit operated in Hacienda Abucay and Mount Samat, Bataan. On the other hand, the remains of Unknown X-620 were recovered from US Army Cemetery #2, Mariveles, Luzon, P. I., which could not have been the most logical place in burial of casualties from the 31st Infantry Regiment.

4. In view of the above findings, the case of 2nd Lt. Estep is currently under study as non-recoverable, while the remains of UNKNOWN X-620 are being reprocessed as an Unidentifiable.

2. It is requested that this Headquarters be furnished any available information regarding the localities where the 31st Infantry was operating during the hostilities in Bataan Area and up to the day of surrender.
3. The remains of Unknown X-620, AGRS Mausoleum, Manila, P.I., recovered from the U. S. Army Cemetery #3, Mariveles, Bataan, were recommended by the Board of Review, AGRS-PHILCOM Zone, to be identified as the remains of 2nd Lt. Allen J. Estep, O-890412, a member of Company "D", 31st Infantry. However, the place of death furnished for subject officer was Philippine Islands. This gives rise to a question as to whether the said outfit was operating in the vicinity where the unknown remains were recovered.

1. Estimated time, place, and cause of death of 2nd Lt. Allen J. ESTEP, 31st Inf Regt, O-890 412, in agreement with those of UNKNOWN X-620. (See Incls 1 and 2).
2. Estimated height and weight of UNKNOWN X-620 in agreement with those of 2nd Lt. Allen J. ESTEP. (See Incls 1 and 4, page 2).
3. Dental Chart for UNKNOWN X-620 in agreement with that of 2nd Lt. Allen J. ESTEP. (See Incls 1 and 3).
4. According to information furnished by decedent's widow (see Incls 6 and 7), Lt. ESTEP was last seen alive at Bataan prior to the surrender of the USAFFE forces in April 1942. However, nothing was gathered as to whether Lt. ESTEP survived the battle of Bataan, thereby leaving a possibility that he could have been KIA thereat and buried in any one of the U. S. Army cemeteries there.
5. The GI type dress buckle, U.S. made, found with remains of UNKNOWN X-620, indicates that the deceased was a member of the ground forces.
6. A check of all ROI's for all other Unknowns recovered from Mariveles Cemetery and vicinity gives only negative results.
7. It is recommended, therefore, that remains of UNKNOWN X-620, Hangar 801, Bay D, Crypt 927, AGRS Mausoleum, Manila, Luzon, P.I., be designated as those of 2nd Lt. Allen J. ESTEP, 31st Inf Regt., O-890 412.

Although maxilla and left half of mandible of X-620 are missing, the extraction of R-16 indicated on Form 1045 is identical with that shown on Form 371 for Lt. ESTEP.

R-15 of X-620 is indicated with an amalgam filling (occlusal) and a cavity (facial). This can be attributed to lapse of time from 12 Dec 39 (date of chart on Form 371) to date of death of Lt. ESTEP presumably in 1942, during which period the filling could have been made and the cavity could have developed.

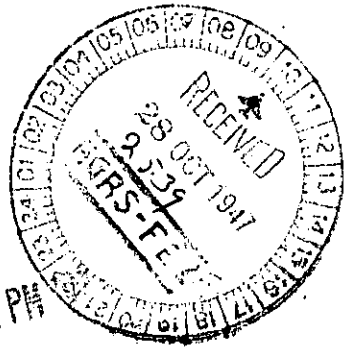

SUBJECT: Report of Findings

TO : Chief, Search and Recovery Section

1. Trinidad Teston Estep, wife and legal next of kin of subject deceased, 2nd Lt. Allen J. Estep, O-890 412, was contacted at her residence at No. 758 Dart Street, Paco, Manila, in an attempt to obtain information that might lead to the recovery of the remains of subject decedent.

2. Interview with the next of kin disclosed that a boy named Ramon, who used to work for the 31st Inf Regt camp, stated that he saw 2nd Lt. Allen J. Estep alive somewhere in Bataan, when the hostilities between the USAFFE and the Japanese forces was still in progress, presumably in 1942 prior to the surrender of Bataan. That was the last time subject deceased was seen alive, but the next of kin cannot ascertain whether subject deceased was killed in action or taken prisoner later on, as she have not received any other information other than what the boy stated.

3. An attempt to contact the boy for possible information concerning subject decedent proved futile, due to the fact that the next of kin does not know the present whereabouts of the informant.

THAT, I am the wife and legal next of kin of 2nd Lt. Allen J. Estep, O-890 412, Company D, 31st Infantry Regt., U S Army;

THAT, according to one Ramon, a boy at the camp of the 31st Inf Regt., he saw my husband the late 2nd Lt. Allen J. Estep, alive sometime in 1942, during the Battle of Bataan;

THAT, since that time, said informant never knew what happened to my husband, neither does he know where my husband died, however he assured me that he left my husband somewhere in Bataan, when the hostilities were still in progress;

THAT, I have not received any other information from other source regarding the death of my husband, except from a letter dated 11 July 1946, received from the War Department, The Adjutant's General Office, Washington, D. C., informing that my husband was reported missing in action upon the fall of the Philippines, 7 May 42, and setting the presumed date of death as 1 Feb 45;

THAT, I cannot give any other information that might lead to the recovery of the remains of my husband.

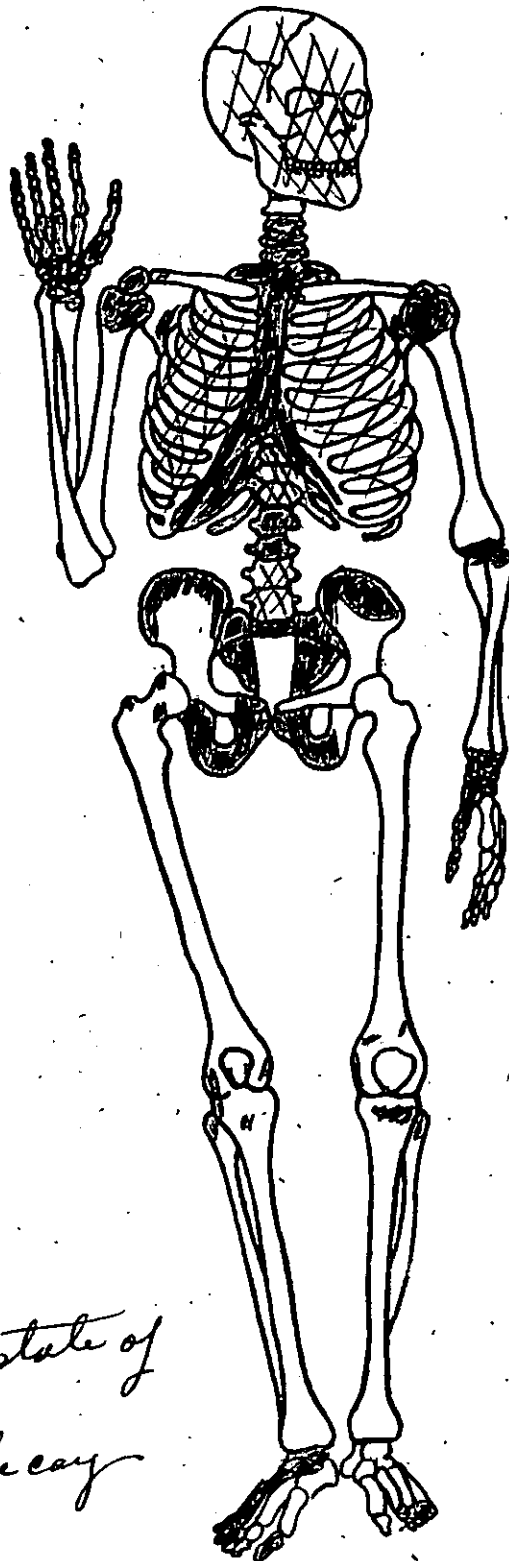

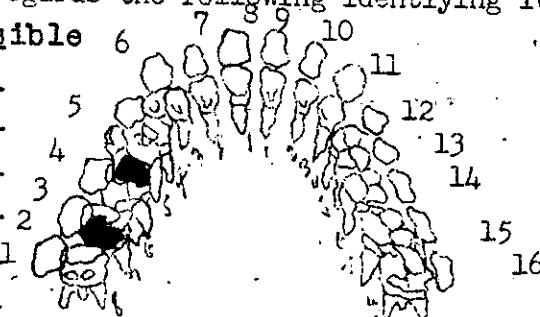
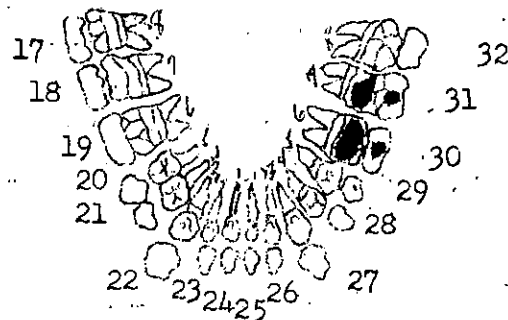


Diagram represents mouth wide open
