1. Reference is made to Proceedings of your Board of Inquiry, dated 26 April 1945, concerning individual identification of Unknown X-10, AMB Kamukawa, Manila, P.I. (Unknown X-3, USAF Company Manila 24, P.I.) as the victim of Pvt Elmer E. Johnson, USMC 244.

2. A letter dated 22 February 1945 from English Officer J. Ross to the father of the deceased, states that Pvt Johnson was originally interred in La Mesa Cemetery. However, all available information on the remains of Unknown X-10, AMB Kamukawa, Manila, P.I., indicates that these remains were first identified as Unknown X-1 in the USAF Company, Manila 24.

3. Records for Unknown X-10 also indicate another individual represented by those remains and of record at the USAF Co. 24 Station, Manila, P.I. However, Capt Kent G. Gilbert, Commanding Officer, USA Cavalry, forwarded information to the Adjutant General's Office on the 17th of February 1945 that the remains were identified as a result of enemy machine gun fire.

4. After an extensive study of this case, it is considered that conflicting evidence precludes a positive correlation of remains for Pvt Johnson with those for the remains of Unknown X-10. Therefore, Board Proceedings have been discontinued and are returned herewith.

DISAPPROVAL OF BOARD FINDINGS

9 February 1950

Field Board Proceedings recommend individual identification of Unknown X-346, AGRS Mausoleum, Manila, P.I. (formerly X-2, USAF Cemetery Manila #2, P.I.).
Pvt. Glatas R. HOBGOOD, 35 729 353

1. Summary:

Unknown X-346 was recovered from a single grave in Manila #2 Cemetery, Grave 498, Plot 1, Row 4.

2. Reasons for Disapproval:

a. Pvt. Hobgood was originally interred in La Loma Cemetery, according to a letter by Chaplain Charles R. Ross, 8th Cavalry dated 16 Feb 45 to Pvt. Hobgood's father. There is nothing to prove X-2 Manila #2 was ever interred in La Loma.

b. Attached 3rd Ind to letter dated 10 Jan 46 indicates only 5 Unknowns remain from La Loma, and all five have been subsequently identified. This seems to indicate there has been a misidentification since Hobgood was definitely buried in La Loma. This also indicates X-2 was not disinterred from La Loma Cemetery.

c. Unknown X-2 Manila #2 was disinterred from Grave 498, Plot 1, Row 4, Manila #2. The men in Grave 496, Grave 497 and Graves 499 and 500 were originally interred directly into Manila #2 and were not reburials.

d. Original Reports of Interment do not state X-2 was a reburial but indicate X-2 was an original burial in Manila #2.

e. The report of Disinterment for Identification indicates X-2 Manila #2 was buried directly into Manila #2 for it has the prefix for Reburied x'ed out indicating X-2 was buried directly into Manila #2 at 2000 hours 1 May 1945.

f. Unknown X-2 had a waist 36 and length 31. Hobgood was 6' and weighed 171. Waist of 36 and length of 31 would hardly be a good fit for Hobgood.


g. Place of death for Unknown X-2 is 3rd Bn. Aid Station, Luzon, P.I. However, Captain Mont G. Calvert, Jr., 8th Cavalry, Commanding, in a letter dated 17 February 1945 to Pvt. Hobgood's father stated: "He was killed instantly by enemy machine gun fire and did not suffer".

3. Recommended Action:

a. That the Board Findings be disapproved

b. That Board Findings be returned to the Field with the notation that evidence presented in this case is insufficient to establish positive identification.

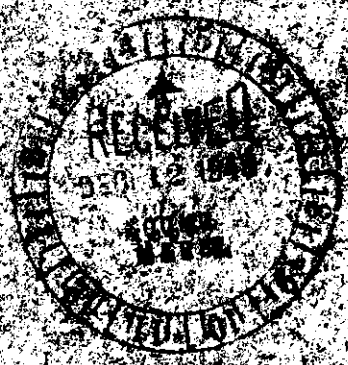

1. Reference is made to Proceedings of your Board of Review, dated 20 April 1948, recommending individual identification of UNKNOWN 2-24, AMIS Makuluwa, Manila, P.I., (Unknown 2-24, USAF Cemetery Manila 24, P.I.) as the remains of Pvt Charles E. Kellogg, 28 728 288.

2. A letter dated 14 February 1948 from Captain Charles E. Ross to the Father of the Deceased, states that Pvt Kellogg was originally interred in La Mesa Cemetery. However, all available information for the remains of Unknown 2-24, AMIS Makuluwa, Manila, P.I., indicates that these remains were first interred as Unknown 2-8 in the USAF Cemetery, Manila 24.

3. Records for Unknown 2-24 also indicate that the individual represented by these remains died of wounds at the "Red In Aid Station, Luzon, P.I." However, Capt John S. Calvert, Commanding Officer, 8th Cavalry, furnished information to the Subject part of his on the 17th of February 1948 that the deceased died instantaneously as a result of enemy machine gun fire.

4. After an extensive study of this case, it is considered that conflicting evidence precludes a positive association of records for Pvt Kellogg with those for the remains of Unknown 2-24. Subsequent Board Proceedings have been discontinued and are returned herewith.

1. A further search of available records does not reveal any report on file concerning the date and site of the recovery of Unknown X-346, AGRS Mausoleum, Manila (formerly X-2, USAF Cemetery Manila No. 2). However, the place of death shown on the original report of Interment is "3rd Bn. Aid Station, Luzon, P.I." From this information, it could be assumed that the remains were recovered from the vicinity of the aforementioned aid station.

2. With reference to the date of recovery, it is the opinion of this Headquarters that subject remains were recovered shortly before 1 May 1945 (date of burial) inasmuch as burials were being made as soon as remains were received at the cemetery.

1. Reference is made to Proceedings of your Board of Review, dated 29 April 1949, recommending that the remains of Unknown X-346, AGRS Mausoleum, Manila, P.I. (formerly Unknown X-2, USAF Cemetery Manila #2, P.I.) be identified as those of Pvt. Cletus R. Hobgood, 35 729 353.

2. AGO records indicate that Pvt. Hobgood was killed in action on 3 February 1945. In a letter to the next of kin in this case, dated 16 February 1945, Capt. Charles R. Loss, Chaplain, 8th Cavalry, stated that Pvt. Hobgood was killed in Manila on 3 February 1945 and interred temporarily in the La Loma Cemetery three days later.

3. The original report of interment for Unknown X-346 indicates that these remains were interred as those of Unknown X-2 in the USAF Cemetery Manila #2 on 1 May 1945. The date of death is not known. Because of the discrepancy in the dates noted in this case, it is requested that this Office be furnished a statement concerning the date and site of the recovery of these remains.

4. Further action in this case has been suspended pending the receipt of the information requested above.

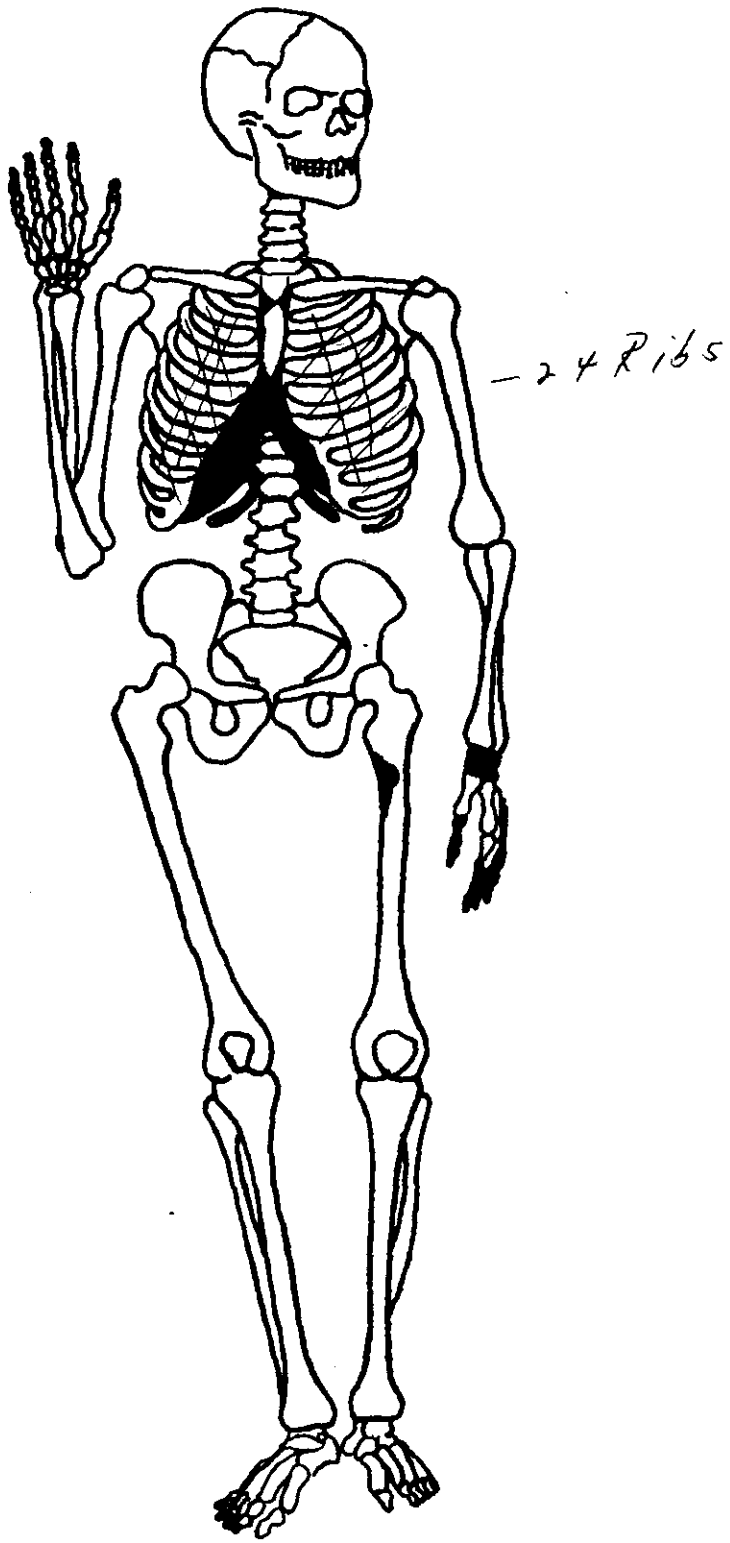

SKELETAL CHART

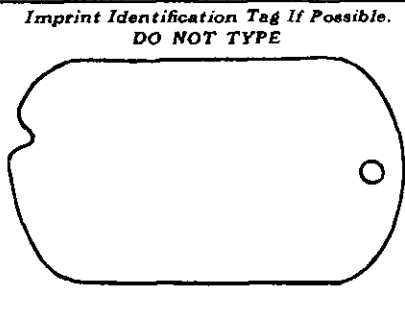

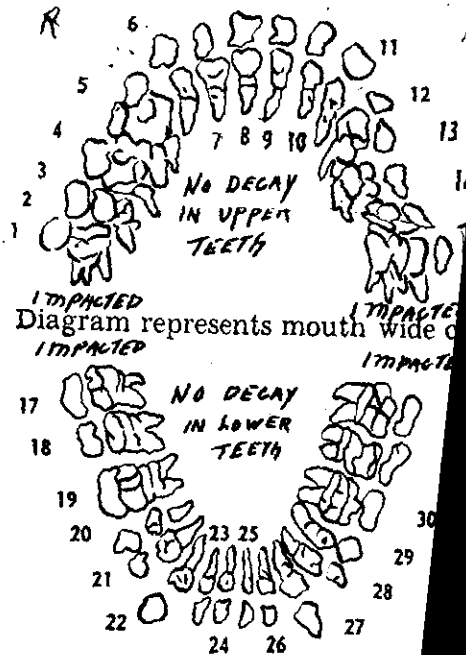
