1. Reference is made to Proceedings of your Board of Review, dated 20 April 1949, recommending the following identification:

X-700, AGRS Mausoleum Manila (Formerly X-215 USAF Cemetery Manila #2, P.I.) as Cpl. Walter J. Lanphier, 6871335

2. After a thorough analysis of this case. it is considered that the documentary evidence presented is insufficient to establish identification. Records indicate that the remains of Cpl. Lanphier were interred in Plot J, Row 3, Grave 10, Camp O'Donnell Cemetery, however the remains of Unknown #-700 were disinterred from Plot J, Row 4, Grave 11, Camp O'Donnell Cem. Furthermore, the dental and physical comparisons are too meager to establish identification.

3. Board proceedings are returned herewith, disapproved.

SUBJECT: Question of Identity:

TO : Graves Registration Officer, Manila Cemetery No. 2.

1. This afternoon, 8 Dec. 1945 eleven bodies or remains of eleven bodies were removed from a ~~grave~~ listed as having ten bodies. The closeness of bodies and identification tags leads me to believe that either number one man or number eleven man is completely unknown and off record as far as we know. In other words either No. 1 man should be listed as no. one man, or no. 2 man should be no. one. That would shift the names back and forth one man proper shift being undetermined at present.

2. We believe that the extra man in J plot Row 4 could be Joseph Atchie, who was not found in J Plot, Row 1 Grave 4 according to and listed in records given to our personnel. However Robert E. Witt with identification tags No. 36008504 were found in J plot, Row 1, Grave 4.

3. Dental identification officer suggests a check of any one body against records of name listed and one on either side of above named body to confirm shirt of names of Plot J Row 4 as mentioned in above paragraph.

<p>Field Board Proceedings have been received recommending identification of remains of Unknown X-700 as Cpl. Walter J. Lanphier, 6871335.</p> <p>Cpl. Lanphier was a member of Co. G, 31st Infantry Regiment. Casualty Report (Non-Battle - Death) dated 10 May 1945 indicates that Pfc Walter J. Lanphier died at Camp O'Donnell on 26 May 1942 and that his death was due to dysentery. The Casualty Report further indicates that Pfc Walter J. Lanphier was buried at Camp O'Donnell in Plot J, Row 3, Grave 10.</p> <p>A photostatic copy of the Death Register listing American and English deaths at Camp O'Donnell, lists Cpl. Walter J. Lanphier as having died of dysentery on 26 May 1942. An extract from General Hospital Number, Camp O'Donnell, listing Americans who died at that camp, indicates that Cpl. Walter J. Lanphier, 31st Inf., died of dysentery on 26 May 1942.</p> <p>An extract of the Location of Graves in Camp O'Donnell indicates that Walter J. Lanphier was buried in Plot J, Row 3, Grave 10. The Roster of Army and Navy Personnel and Disposition compiled at Cabanatuan POW Camp lists Cpl. Walter J. Lanphier, 6871335, 31st Inf., as having died at Camp O'Donnell on 26 May 1942 and as having been buried in Plot J, Row 3, Grave 10.</p> <p>Investigation of Unknown X-4750, disinterred from Plot J, Row 3, Grave 10, believed to have been Cpl. Walter J. Lanphier, and compared with dental records for Cpl. Lanphier yielded negative results. Dental comparisons were also made</p>				

with remains disinterred from Plot J, Row 2, Grave 10 and identified as Sgt. Harry A. Rattner; remains disinterred from Plot J, Row 3, Grave 9 and identified as Cpl. Don G. Tenorio; and remains disinterred from Plot J, Row 4, Grave 10 and identified as Pvt. John J. Owings, with negative results.

The afternoon of 8 December 1945, the remains of eleven bodies were removed from Plot J, Row 4 at Camp O'Donnell POW Cemetery. Row 4 was listed as having ten bodies. Several of the bodies removed from Row 4, Plot J had identification tags identifying the remains in agreement with prison records. On this basis Unknown X-700 would be the eleventh buried in Row 4.

The remains of Unknown X-700 were disinterred from Plot J, Row 4, Grave 11. The recovery of eleven remains from Plot J, Row 4, where the working diagram indicates only ten burials, proves there was an error in the burial chart. Remains in Row 2, Grave 10; Row 4, Grave 10; and Row 3, Grave 9 have been identified, and these remains were the closest to remains in Plot J, Row 3, Grave 10.

The failure of remains of Unknown X-4750 to compare favorably with Cpl. Lanphier leads to the belief that Cpl. Lanphier was buried in a grave close to Plot J, Row 3, Grave 10, but not in it.

The estimated height for Unknown X-700 is 5' 7". This height compares very favorably with the reported height of Cpl. Lanphier (5' 6 1/4"). The estimated weight for Unknown X-700 also is considered favorable with the reported weight of Cpl. Lanphier.

The dental chart for Unknown X-700 compares favorably with the dental chart for Cpl. Lanphier.

On the basis of the findings from the Field as explained herein, it is recommended that the identification of the remains of Unknown X-700, as proposed by the Field, be approved.

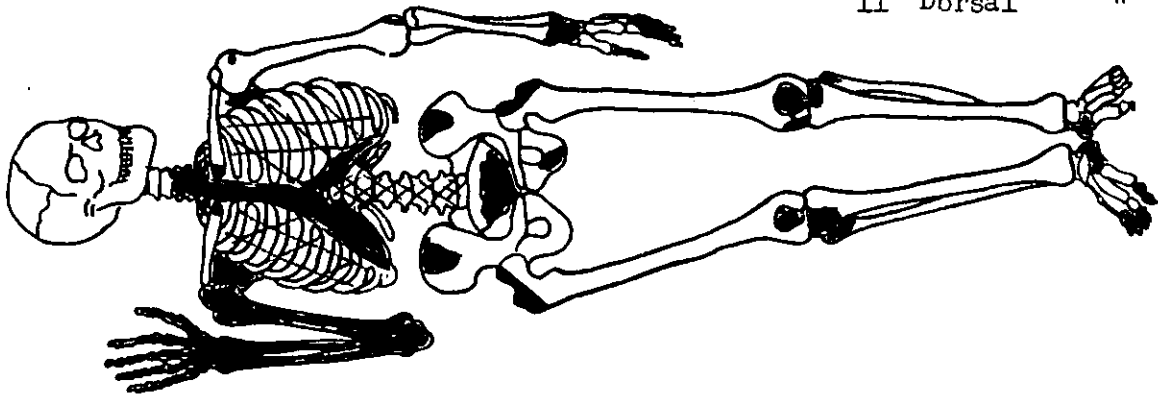

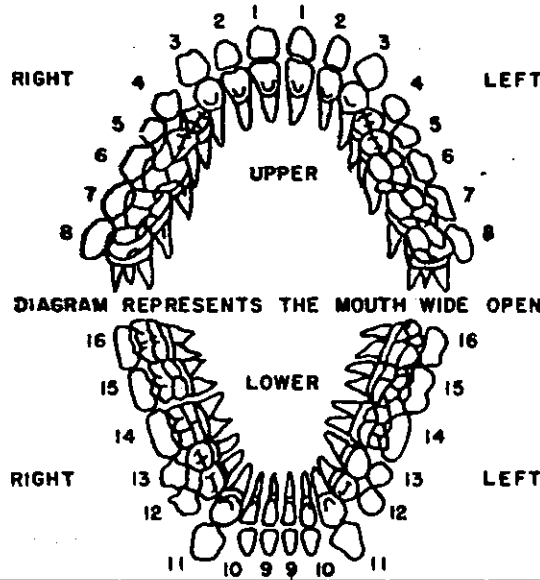

TO : Graves Registration Officer, Manila Cemetery No. 2.

1. This afternoon, 8 Dec. 1945 eleven bodies or remains of eleven bodies were removed from a Row listed as having ten bodies. The colseness of bodies and identification tags leads me to believe that either number one man is completely unknown and off record as far as we know. In other words either No. 1 man should be listed as no. one man, or no. 2 man should be no. one. That would shift the names back and forth one man proper shift being undetermined at present.

2. We believe that the extra man in J plot Row 4 could be Joseph Atchiek who was not found in J Plot, Row 1 Grave 4 according to and listed in records given to our personnel. However Robert E. Witt with identification tags No. 36008504 were found in J plot, Row 1, Grave 4.

3. Dental identification officer suggests a check of my one body against records of name listed and one on either side of above named body to confirm shirt of names of Plot J Row 4 as mentioned in above paragraph.

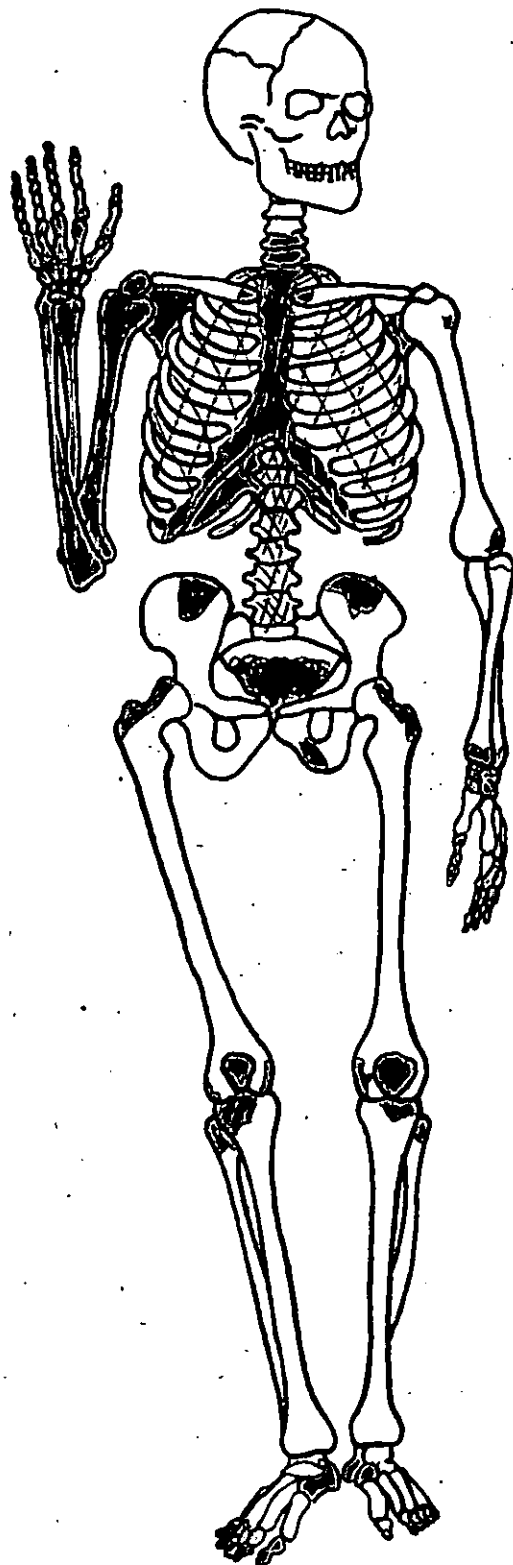

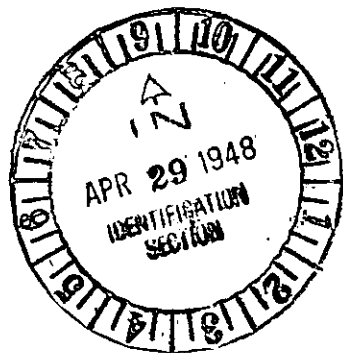
SKELETAL CHART

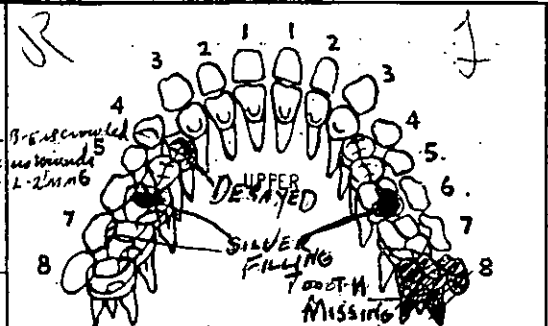
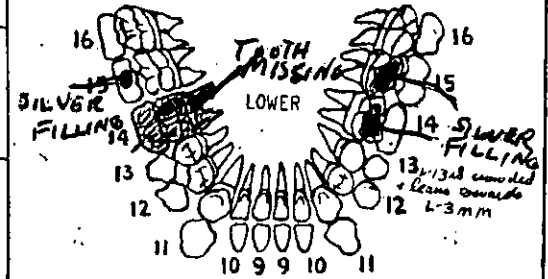
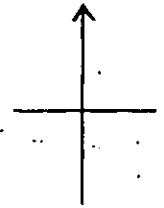


DIAGRAM REPRESENTS THE MOUTH WIDE OPEN
