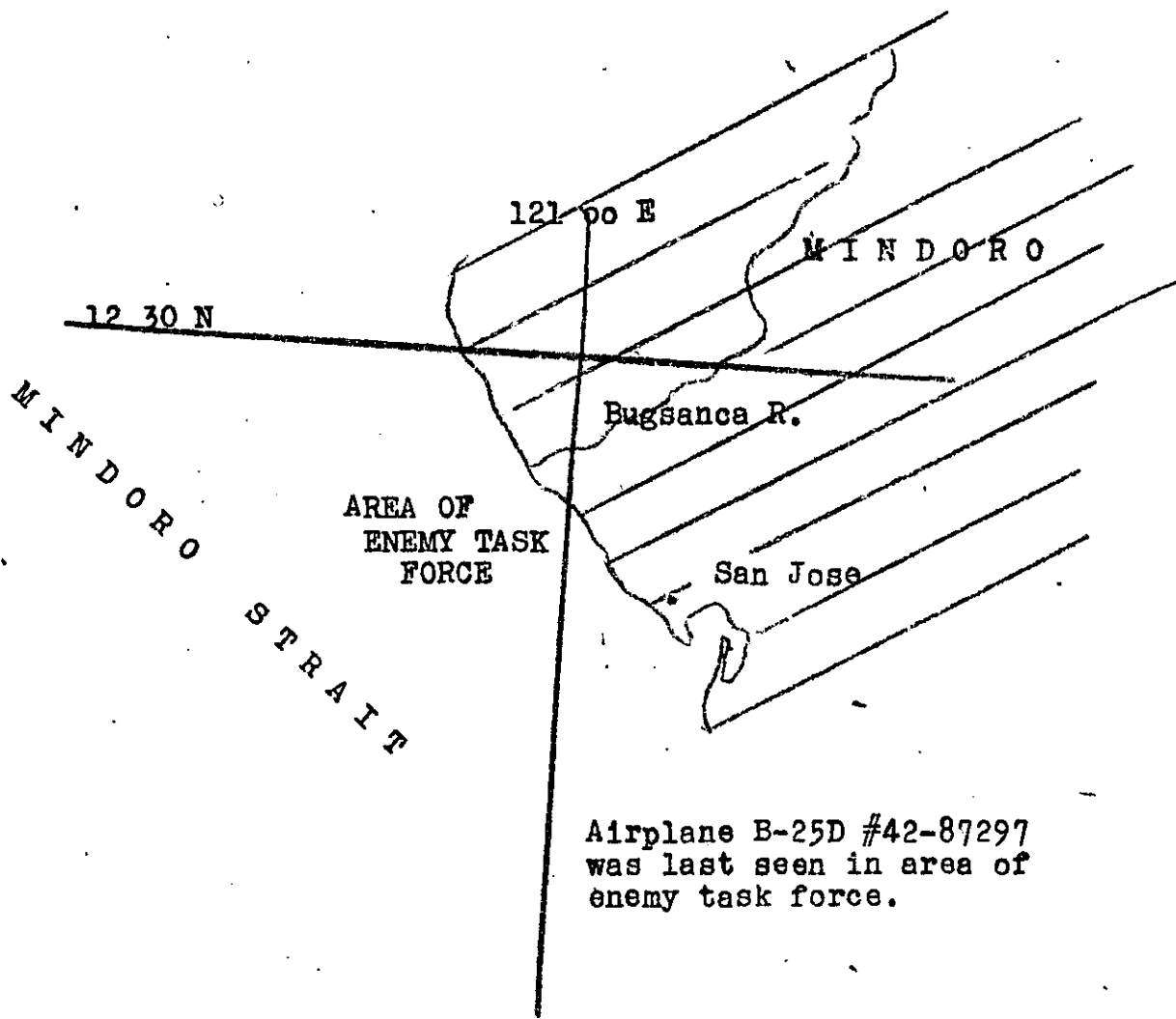
OVERLAY OF AAF AERONAUTICAL CHART NUMBER 735D

S-T-A-T-E-M-E-N-T

On the eve of 26 December 1944, this Headquarters was informed by the 310th Bomb Wing A-3 that an enemy Task Force was rapidly moving into Mindoro Bay.

Major Wise had departed about one and one-half hours prior to this notification leading a flight of eight (8) Rogers, including the plane piloted by Lt. Hatcher, to attack an enemy convoy that had been reported supposedly heading towards Manila Bay. Upon seeing the enemy Task Force heading this way, Major Wise ordered his flight to return to San Jose immediately.

Upon landing, these eight (8) Rogers were augmented with five (5) Rogers and directed to take-off immediately, irrespective of bomb loading, to bomb and strafe target as the situation looked desperate. These thirteen (13) Rogers took off at uneven intervals, each going to the scene of the target, expending all bombs, some of the planes strafed, then returned to San Jose strip for reloading.

Lt. Hatcher and crew in airplane B-25D 24-87297 did not return for reloading after his first attack on convoy. Since the preliminary report was submitted, Lt. Hatcher's body has been recovered in general area of the target which leads to believe his airplane was shot down by enemy Anti-Aircraft fire. It is reported to this Headquarters by the Graves Registration Bureau that Lt. Hatcher apparently did not die from injuries sustained but from drowning. The balance of his crew remain missing in action.

STATEMENT

The losses following the attack on the Japanese Naval Unit off Mindoro the night of 26/27 December were scattered over so much territory that only an area search could be used. This area extended over the supposed route the pilots took on their return to Leyte and extending westward from Mindoro to the spot where the convoy had been attacked.

On 27 December two PBY's, an OA-10 and a Rescue C-47 combed this area. The next day a PBY continued the search. On successive days a Catalina was regularly in the area keeping a look-out.

On none of these searches were there any sightings made that pertained to the case of 2nd Lt. William W. Hatches and crew of B-25 #42-872971.

No information concerning this case was ever forthcoming from friendly ground forces. Aircraft accident report gave no indication possible area of loss.

This area extended over the supposed route the pilots took on their return to Leyte and extending westward from Mindoro to the spot where the convoy had been attacked.

On 27 December two PBY's, an OA-10 and a Rescue U-47 combed this area. The next day a PBY continued the search. On successive days a Catalina was regularly in the area keeping a look-out.

On none of these searches were there any sightings made that pertained to the case of 2nd Lt. William N. Hatches and crew of B-25 #42-87297.

No information concerning this case was ever forthcoming from friendly ground forces. Aircraft accident report gave no indication possible area of loss.

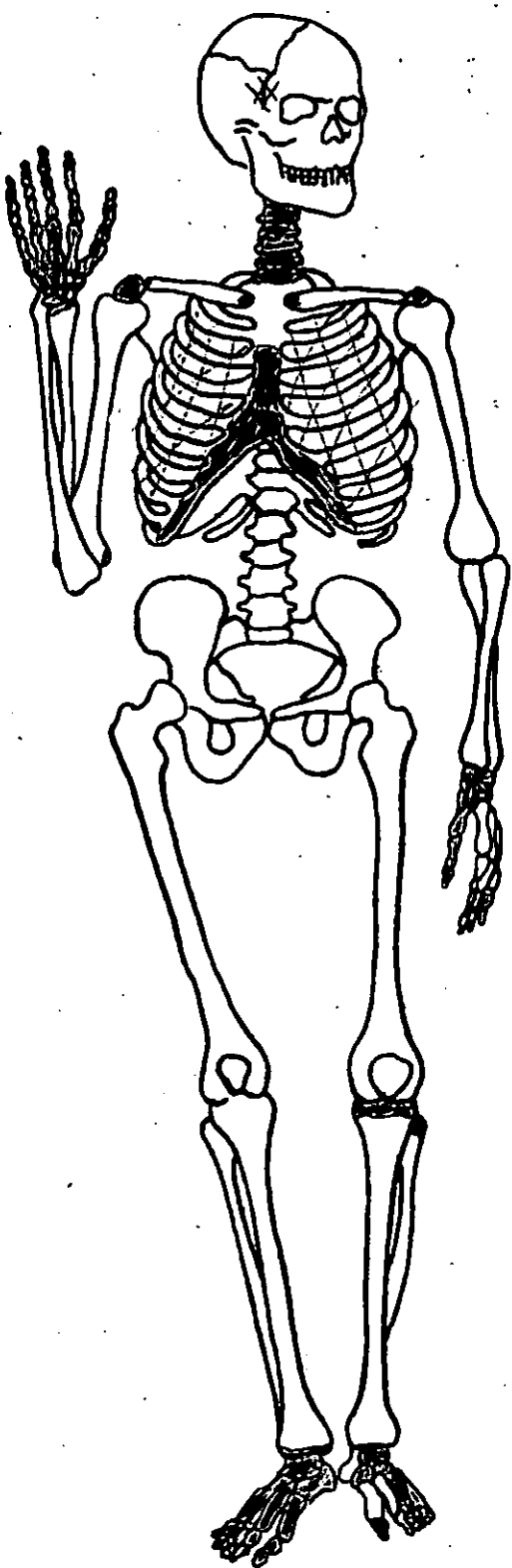
