











This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. See reverse side for illustrations.

<p>MISSING TEETH... All teeth missing through previous extraction (not those fractured or displaced by recent wounds) should be "X" 'd out and labeled, thus :</p>	 
<p>CROWNED TEETH... Block in solid the crown of tooth (label gold, porcelain, Silver or gold and porcelain), thus :</p>	 
<p>BRIDGE WORK... Block in solid the crown of tooth (label gold bridge, gold and porcelain bridge), thus :</p>	 
<p>FILLINGS: Draw filling on tooth as accurately as possible (block in and label gold, silver, cement), thus :</p>	 
<p>CARIES (CAVITIES) Outline location and size of cavity, shade in thus :</p>	 

DENTURES (PLATES)... Draw diagram of relative size and shape of plate, block in teeth attached and indicate retaining clasps on natural teeth with the word "clasp."

ADDITIONAL SPACE FOR FURTHER REMARKS

L-1 (upper left central incisor) is missing but it was possibly lost while exhuming, the remains of the socket is entirely open. ✓

L-2 (upper left lateral) is missing, but the ridge is well healed and no remains of the socket can be seen. ✓

L-3 (upper left cuspid) is missing, but as in the case of L-1 it probably was lost while exhuming.

L-4 (upper left first bicuspid) and L-5 (upper left second bicuspid) are both in good form and no fillings or defects.

L-6 (upper left first molar) is missing. It has been extracted for a long time because the ridge is well healed and no remains of the socket can be seen.

L-7 (upper left second molar) has no fillings or defects. It is tilted slightly to the mesial and covers about one-half of the space left by the removal of the first molar.

L-8 (upper left third molar) never erupted fully. The highest point on this tooth only erupted as far as the cervical region of second molar. ✓

R-1 (upper right central incisor) is missing, but the socket is open and I feel that it was lost while exhuming.

R-2 (upper right lateral) has a silicate filling on the labial surface. The tooth is well formed and the lingual fossa is well defined.

R-3 (upper right cuspid) is well formed but well on the lingual surface.

R-4 (upper right first bicuspid) and R-5 (upper right second bicuspid) are both well formed, but the occlusal surfaces are well worn.

R-6 (upper right first molar) has an amalgam pit filling in the distal fossa of the occlusal surface.

R-7 (upper right second molar) has an amalgam pit filling in the mesial fossa of the occlusal surface.

R-8 (upper right third molar) has a large amalgam filling on the disto-occlusal-buccal surfaces. The distal and buccal portion of the filling has broken out.

L-9 (lower left central incisor) is missing, but due to the condition of the socket, I believe it was lost while exhuming.

L-10 (lower left lateral) is slightly rotated distally and the distal corner is lingual to the mesial incisal angle of the cuspid. The tooth is in lingual version.

L-12 (lower left first bicuspid) has well defined and well developed lingual cusp. There is a definite mesial and distal fossa on the occlusal surface. The buccal surface is slightly about two millimeters, rotated to the distal.

L-13 (lower left second bicuspid) has been inclined slightly to the lingual and the buccal surface is rotated mesially about one millimeter.

L-14 (lower left first molar) has a pit on the occlusal surface. The cavity is in the groove between the two lingual cusps.

L-15 (lower left second molar) is missing and the ridge is well healed.

L-16 (lower left third molar) is mesially inclined and the mesial buccal cusp is about one millimeter from the distal surface of the first molar.

R-9 (lower right central incisor) is well formed.

R-10 (lower right lateral) is well formed but lingual to R-9 and R-11. It is rotated slightly to the distal. Its incisal angles are lingual to the incisal angles of the neighboring teeth.

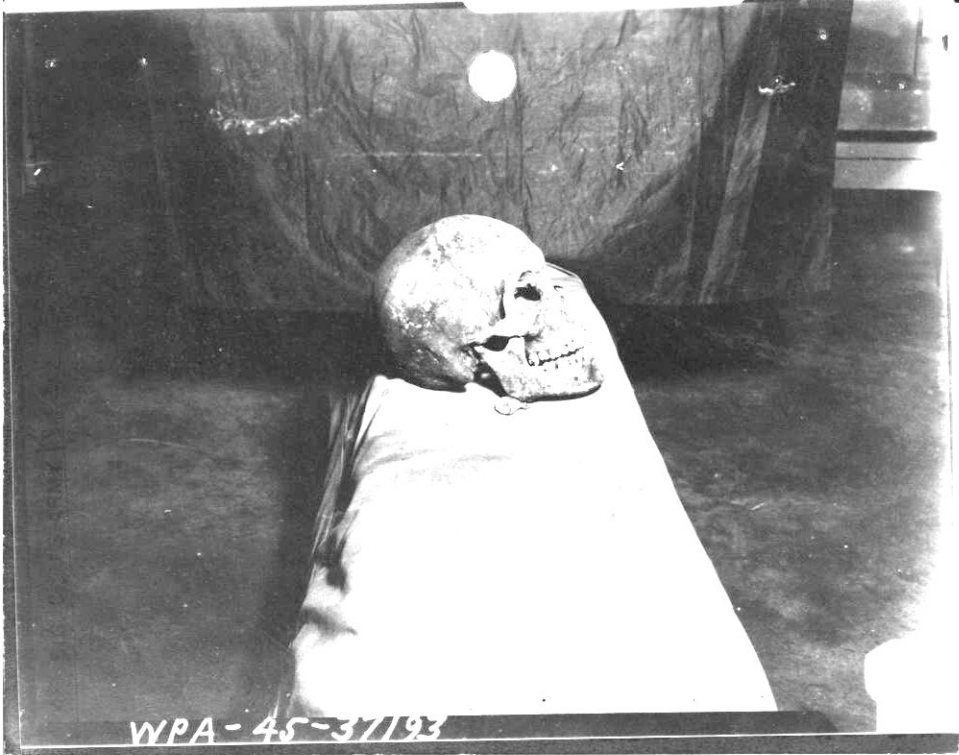

L-1 (upper left central incisor) is missing but it was possibly lost while exhuming, the remains of the socket is entirely open.

L-2 (upper left lateral) is missing, but the ridge is well heeled and no remains of the socket can be seen.

L-3 (upper left cuspid) is missing, but as in the case of L-1 it probably was lost while exhuming.

L-4 (upper left first bicuspid) and L-5 (upper left second bicuspid) are both in good form and no fillings or defects.

L-6 (upper first molar) is missing. It has been extracted for a long time because the ridge is well heeled and no remains of the socket can be seen.

L-7 (upper left second molar) has no fillings or defects. It is tilted slightly to the mesial and covers about one-half of the space left by the removal of the first molar.

L-8 (upper left third molar) never erupted fully. The highest point on this tooth only erupted as far as the cervical region of second molar.

R-1 (upper right central incisor) is missing, but the socket is open and I feel that it was lost while exhuming.

R-2 (upper right lateral) has a silicate filling on the labial surface. The tooth is well formed and the lingual fossa is well defined.

R-3 (upper right cuspid) is well formed but well worn on the lingual surface.

R-4 (upper right first bicuspid) and R-5 (upper right second bicuspid) are both well formed, but the occlusal surfaces are well worn.

R-6 (upper right first molar) has an amalgam pit filling in the distal fossa of the occlusal surface.

R-7 (upper right second molar) has an amalgam pit filling in the mesial fossa of the occlusal surface.

L-16 (lower left third molar) is mesially inclined and the mesial buccal cusp is about one millimeter from the distal surface of the first molar.

R-9 (lower right central incisor) is well formed.

R-10 (lower right lateral) is well formed but lingual to R-9 and R-11. It is rotated slightly to the distal. Its incisal angles are lingual to the incisal angles of the neighboring teeth.
