S T A T E M E N T

Per basic letter from DOTA, OQMG, Wash., 25, D.C., file QMGMU 293, UNKs X-422 thru X-427 (Manila #2, P.I.), dated 3 Dec 47, Subj: "Burial Information".

Remains of six (6) unknowns previously disinterred from San Fernando Municipal Cemetery, Luzon, (Grave, Plot or Row not designated) and reinterred in Manila Cemetery #2, in Plot 2, Row 14, Grave # 1797, 1801, 1802, 1803, 1804, and 1805 were processed by the CIP Laboratory. In processing these remains on 17 Oct 47, it was determined that there were portions of ten (10) remains. Segregation was made in Manila Mausoleum, UNK Nos. X-888-A, X-888-B, X-888-C, X-889-A, X-889-B, X-890, X-891, X-892 X-893-A and X-893-B were assigned.

Upon request to reprocess these remains in conjunction with known remains of Eugene L Specht, Deenah Rue McCurry, Wendell E Swanson, Alexander E Keegan, UNK X-3575, (Formerly Lloyd E Wagner, Lt Col Dwight D Edison, Cleris S C Raymond and William F Glaab, it was determined that these were minor bone discrepancies in all cases and that cases X-888-C and X-893-B were portions of these known and unknown remains. After careful analysis of bone structure, therefore X-888-C and X-893-B were segregated into these remains without changing any major bone structure.

Per letter from Headquarters, 3 Mar 48 instructed to reprocess Manila Mausoleum, UNK X-1335 and X-1336 in conjunction with all the knowns and unknowns of this group. Upon reprocessing, it was determined that the small portion of skeletal remains of UNK X-1335 could be consolidated with UNK X-888-B and X-1336 and consolidation was performed.

One extra I.D. tag of "MARTIN L JOHNSON, 6273044 BX" was found with the remains of "EDISON, DWIGHT D". It is suggested that Martin L Johnson could possibly be one of the unknowns in this group.

CONCLUSION: Cancellation of Unknown cases X-888-C, X-893-B and X-1335..
Corrected forms 1042, 1044, 1044-A and 1044-B on all the formerly processed unknowns. Instead of a total of fifteen (15) remains as stated in ltr DOTA, OQMG, Washington 25, D.C., dated 3 Dec 47, file QMGMU 293, or seventeen (17) remains as stated in attached copy of Report of Investigation Division, Legal Section, GHQ, SCAP dtd 16 Sept 46; there are eighteen (18) remains; eight (8) knowns and ten (10) unknowns.

REPORT: re - Recovery of Two Bodies, presumably American, in the grave in the Municipal Cemetery, San Fernando, Pampanga, Luzon, from which the bodies of Wendell F. SWANSON and fourteen others were recovered in December 1945.

1. Junsaburo TOSHINO, a former Japanese Officer now confined in the Sugamo Prison, Tokyo, Japan, has admitted witnessing the execution of fifteen American Prisoners of War in the San Fernando Municipal Cemetery in December 1944. He has drawn a map to indicate that position of the spot where the execution took place in the cemetery and where the Prisoners of War was buried.
2. Federico SALES, caretaker of the Municipal Cemetery, San Fernando, Pampanga, has pointed out the grave described by TOSHINO. SALES states that four Americans were buried in the grave in December 1944 but that some fifteen bodies were recovered from this grave in December 1945.
3. On the basis of the details related in the above paragraphs it seems possible that the above-mentioned grave might contain a total of some nineteen bodies.
4. According to the Report of Interment of Wendell F. SWANSON, only fifteen bodies were recovered from this grave.
5. Therefore, on 13 September 1946, this grave was reopened by a gravedigging detail under the supervision of a Master Sergeant from the Graves Recovery Team Field Headquarters at Bacolor, Pampanga, and this officer.
6. The grave yielded one complete skeletal remains and one skeletal remains less the skull. These remains are not those of a Filipino and are therefore believed to be those of an American. No means of positive identification of the bodies was located.
7. It is most possible that there are not more remains to be recovered from the above-mentioned grave.

REMARKS:

Cup enclosed with remains with writings on it, but cannot be deciphered.

The Japanese prison ship ORYOKU MARU carrying Prisoners of War from Bilibid Internment Camp, P.I., left the harbor at Manila at 4:00, 14 Dec 44, and between 0800 and 1700; between 0800 and 1200 the following day, 15 Dec 44, 320 American planes raided this ship and she received approximately 30 hits. At 1230 on 15 Dec 44 she sank off Olongapo, Subic Bay. At the accident 400 POWs were dead. The survivors who came ashore were taken by cars from Olongapo to South Fernandos, two days later they were sent to North Fernando by train. On 27 Dec 44 at 0700 the ENOURA MARU left the harbor of Pollo, carrying POWs. Then she entered the harbor at Takao, Formosa on 1 Jan 45. On 9 Jan 45 she was air-raided by 5 American planes. Approximately 300 POWs were dead with bomb explosion. On 14 Jan 45 at 1200 hours, the BURAJIRU MARU left Takao carrying the survivors and arrived at Moji harbor Japan on 31 Jan 45. The surviving POWs, 580 were all transported to Fukouka POW Camp on 30 Jan 45. In addition to those killed in the two ship incidents, many others died of illness or other causes aboard the ship. Shortly after the sinking in Subic Bay of the ORYOKU MARU, a list of names was compiled at Bilibid Prison by prisoners in the record office from a list of names brought in by the Japanese. This list is believed to represent those who became casualties in the first sinking. Another list, believed to represent those who were killed in the Takao disaster, was prepared from Japanese Prison records. Other reports indicate the Japanese Prison Ship, BRAZIL MARU was sunk enroute from Takao, Formosa to Moji, Kyushu, Japan.

NAVY REPORT:

At approximately 1115 on 13 December 1944, 1619 American, British and Dutch prisoners departed from Bilibid Prison and were put on board a ship at Pier 7 Manila to be transported to Japan.

The prisoners were put below in three holds. There they were in such crowded quarters that they could neither stand nor lie down. No ventilation or lights were provided, other than from the hatches. Lt. George Karl PETRITZ, 97128, USNR, a survivor of the disaster, has reported that many prisoners in the after-hold, in which he himself was carried, suffocated due to lack of ventilation.

At approximately 0730 on 14 December 1944, the ship was bombed by American planes when located in the China Sea at approximately 120°15'E 14°60'N. Two additional bombing attacks followed at intervals of about three hours on the same day. These bombings resulted in slight damage to the ship and no casualties among the American prisoners.

Proceeding to Olongapo, Subic Bay, Philippine Islands, the ship was bombed for the last time on the morning of 15 December 1944. During the attack, serious damage was inflicted upon the ship. Numerous fires started. As the ship began to settle, all Japanese abandoned her. A near-hit on the afterhold caused a beam to fall down the hatchway on prisoners who were in the hold directly below. During the bombing attacks, some prisoners attempted to escape and in each instance ten prisoners were shot in the arm for each one who tried to escape. Lt. Petritz has estimated that this final bombing killed about 30 prisoners.

As fast as the prisoners reached shore, they were recaptured by the Japanese, information was obtained from Japanese sentries by KENTNER, Robert William, 234-06-01, PhMlc, USN, serving at that time in a clerical capacity in the office of Bilibid Prison, that the recaptured prisoners were

taken to San Fernando, La Union, on the Bataan Coast, hence they were shipped to Japan. The sentry further informed Kentner that this shipment was again bombed by United States planes off the coast of Formosa and many casualties ensued.

Information received

On or about 23 December 1944 at San Fernando, Pampanga, P.I., the accused Risaku ~~Kimura~~ Kobayashi, did, in conjunction with other persons, willfully and unlawfully cause the deaths of: Lt. Dwight D. Edison, Lt. John W. Elliot, Lt. Col. Samuel W. Freeny, Cpl. Martin L. Johnson, Pfc Doenah R. McCurrey, Lt. Col. Ulysses J.L. Peoples, 2d Lt. Norman W. Sherman, Pfc. Lewis Q. Steel, Van T'wel, American and allied Prisoners of War and four other unidentified American and Allied prisoners of war by stabbing and decapitating them.

Survivors of ORUOKU MARU stated that following American Prisoners of War died and were buried on 26 December 1944 in a shallow grave at a spot near a school house on the beach at San Fernando, La Union, P. I.:

Lt. Col. Howard J. Edmunds
A private from the 31st Inf. Regt.

Following were supposedly taken from San Fernando, Pampanga, to Manila by Japanese soldiers on 22 Dec 44, but never arrived in Manila and were never seen again by their comrades who remained in San Fernando:

Lt. Col. Samuel W. Freeney, USME
Lt. Col. Ulysses L. J. Peoples, Jr.
2d Lt. Herman V. Sherman
Ensign John W. Elliott.

All information uncovered during the investigation of this case indicates that the four named above were executed in the evening of 22 Dec 44 and buried in the same grave with Wendell F. Swanson in the Municipal Cemetery, San Fernando

Eight knowns and 10 Unknowns found in San Fernando Municipal Cemetery. Records indicate that these men were executed by the Japanese and buried in a common grave. It was originally believed that there were 6 unknowns in this grave, but reprocessing in lab. revealed actually 10 remains. Three can be associated with men believed to have escaped from prison ship after sinking. Two were Navy and Marine Corps personnel.

SHERMAN, Hyman V.

2d Lt. 0406495 - Associated with X-891, Maus, Manila (Formerly X-425, Manila #2) Tooth chart has same extractions R-8,16, L-16. Body found buried Catholic Cemetery, San Fernando. One of six remains found in unmarked grave. Reprocessing revealed actually 10 remains. unknowns. 8 knowns in same grave.

PEOPLES, Ulysses J.L. Jr.

Lt. Col. 0-15214 -Associated with X-892, Maus, Manila (Formerly X-426, Manila #2, and X-5 San Fernando Municipal Cemetery) Dental chart good. One of six remains found in unmarked grave. Height good. Reprocessing revealed actually 10 remains in grave? Eight knowns in same grave

EDISON, Dwight D.

Lt. Col. 0-18786-Associated with X-888-A, Maus, Manila (Formerly X-422, Manila #2 formerly X-1 Sanfernando Mun. Cem.) Originally identified by ID tags, but found to be in error. Remains originally identified as EDISON redesignated X-~~42~~4979, Maus, Manila. One of 15 Americans executed at San Fernando and buried in common grave. Reprocessing revealed 18 remains in grave, 10 unknowns and 8 knowns. Tooth chart good, height good, for X-888-A. Extra ID tag of Johnson, Martin L. 6273044 was found with remains originally identified as Edison.

Per basic letter from DOTA, OQMG, Wash., 25, D.C., file QMGMU 293, UNKs X-422 thru X-427 (Manila #2, P.I.), dated 3 Dec 47, Subj: "Burial Information".

Remains of six (6) unknowns previously disinterred from San Fernando Municipal Cemetery, Luzon (Grave, Plot or Row not designated) and reinterred in Manila Cemetery #2, in Plot 2, Row 14, Grave #1797, 1801, 1802, 1803, 1804, and 1805 were processed by the CIP Laboratory. In processing these remains on 22 Oct 47, it was determined that there were portions of ten (10) remains. Segregation was made in Manila Mausoleum, UNK Nos. X-888-A, X-888-B, X-888-C, X-889-A, X-889-B, X-890, X-891, X-892, X-893-A and X-893-B were assigned.

Upon request to reprocess these remains in conjunction with known remains of Eugene L Specht, Deenah Rue McCurry, Wendell E. Swanson, Alexander E Keegan, UNK X-3575 (Formerly Lloyd E Wagner), Lt Col Dwight D Edison, Gleris, S C Raymond and William F Glaab, it was determined that these were minor bone discrepancies in all cases and that cases X-888-C and X-893-B were portions of these known and unknown remains. After careful analysis of bone structure, therefore X-888-C and X-893-B were segregated into these remains without changing any major bone structure.

Per letter from Headquarters, 3 Mar 48 instructed to reprocess Manila Mausoleum, UNK X-1335 and X-1336 in conjunction with all the knowns and unknowns of this group. Upon reprocessing it was determined that the small portion of skeletal remains of UNK X-1335 could be consolidated with UNK X-888-B and X-1336 and consolidation was performed.

One extra I.D. tag of "MARTIN L JOHNSON, 6273044 BX" was found with the remains of "EDISON, DWIGHT D". It is suggested that Martin L Johnson could possibly be one of the unknowns in this group.

CONCLUSION: Cancellation of Unknown cases X-888-C, X-893-B and X-1335. Corrected forms 1042, 1044, 1044-A and 1044-B on all the formerly processed unknowns. Instead of a total of fifteen (15) remains as stated in ltr DOTA, OQMG, Washington 25, D.C., dated 3 Dec 47, file QMGMU 293, or seventeen (17) remains as stated in attached copy of Report of Investigation Division, Legal Section, GHQ, SCAP dtd 16 Sept 46; there are eighteen (18) remains; eight (8) knowns and ten (10) unknowns.

This statement shall be a cross reference to each known and unknown in this group. Any identification discrepancies on individuals are noted on their particular case papers.

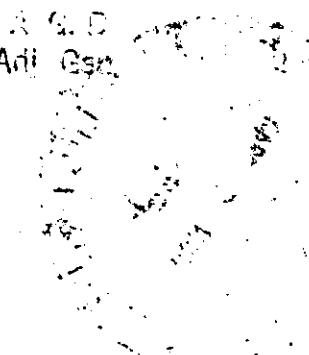
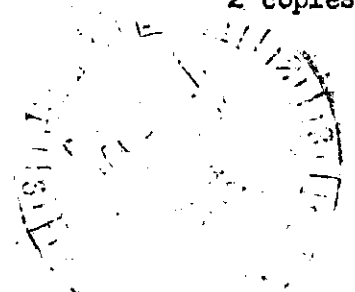

1. QMC Form 1045, Identification Dental Chart, submitted for Unknown X-889A, Hanger 812, Bay B, Crypt 512, AGRS Mausoleum, Manila, P. I. has been compared with the navy dental record of LtCol. Samuel W. Freeny, 0311, USMC. Comparison of the mandible is favorable; however, there is a discrepancy in the maxilla. QMC Form 1045 for Unknown X-889A states under remarks "Upper denture, full, with rubber base", while the navy dental record of LtCol. Freeny shows a partial upper denture with right 3, 4 and 6 and left 3 and 4 present. This examination was made at Corregidor, P. I. on 7 January 1942. Request Unknown X-889A be reprocessed for identification with the inclosed navy dental record of LtCol. Freeny.

2. QMC Form 1045 submitted for Unknown X-890, Hanger 812, Bay B, Crypt 509, AGRS Mausoleum, Manila, P. I., has been compared with the navy dental record of Ensign John W. ELLIOTT, 109180, USNR. Samuel W. Freeny, O311, USMC. Comparison of the mandible is favorable; however, there is a discrepancy in the maxilla. QMC Form 1045 for Unknown X-889A states under remarks "Upper denture, full, with rubber base", while the navy dental record of LtCol. Freeny shows a partial upper denture with right 3, 4 and 6 and left 3 and 4 present. This examination was made at Corregidor, P. I. on 7 January 1942. Request Unknown X-889A be reprocessed for identification with the inclosed navy dental record of LtCol. Freeny.

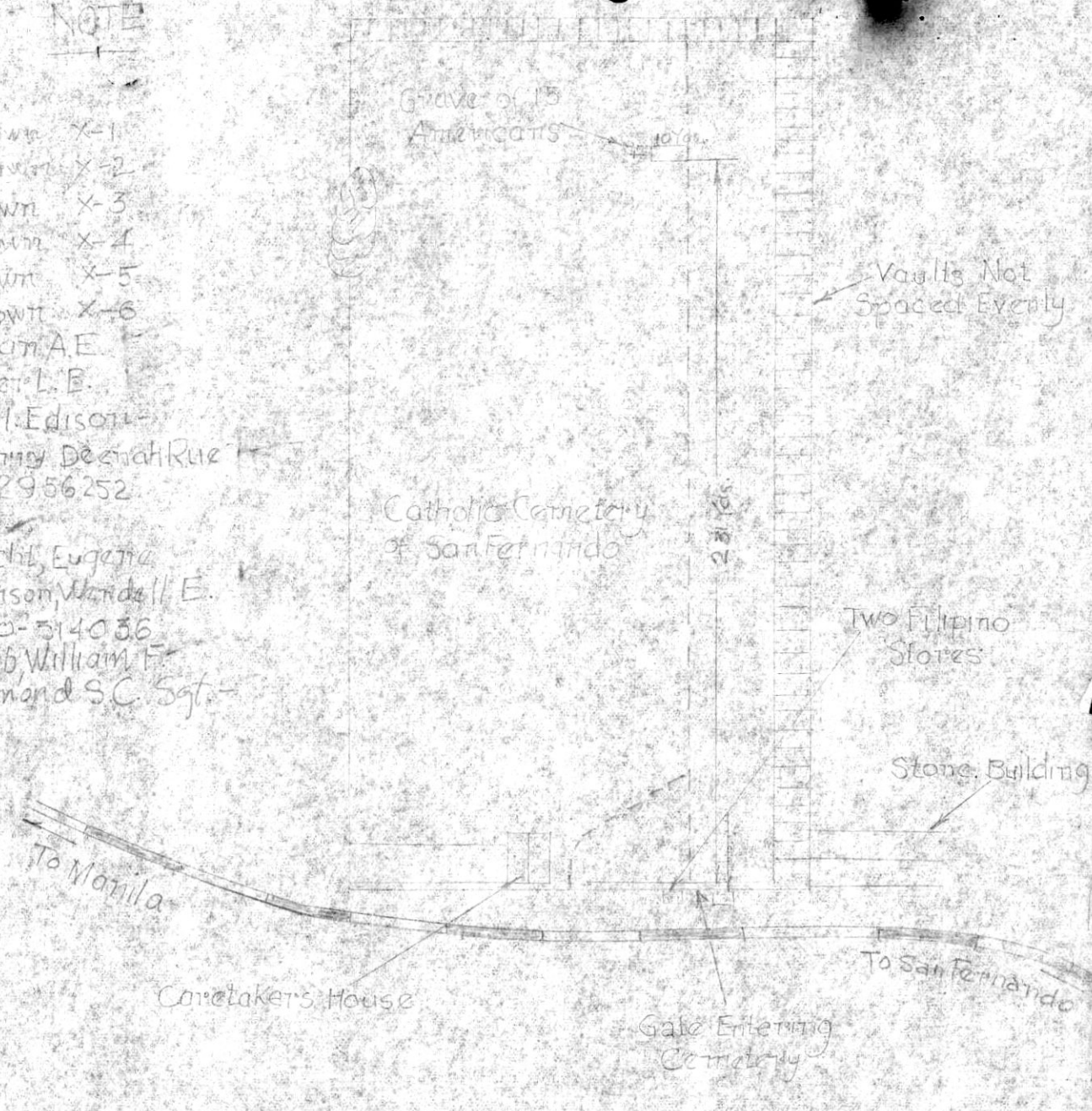

The Japanese prison ship "Oryoku Maru" carrying Prisoners of War from Bilibid Internment Camp, Philippines, left the harbor at Manila at 4:00 14 December 1944, and between 0800 and 1700; between 0800 and 1200 the following day, 15 December, 320 American planes raided this ship and she received approximately 30 hits. At 1230 on 15 December 1944 she sank off Olongapo Subic Bay. At the accident 400 POWs were dead. The survivors who came ashore were taken by cars from Olongapo to South Fernandos, two days later they were sent to North Fernando by train. On the 27 December 1944 at 0700 the ENOURA MARU left the harbor of Pollo, carrying POWs. Then she entered the harbor at Takao, Formosa on 1 Jan 1945. On 9 January 1945 she was air-raided by five American Planes. Approximately 300 POWs were dead with bomb explosion. On 14 January 1945 at 1200 hours, the BURAJIRU MARU left Takao carrying the survivors and arrived at Moji harbor, Japan on 31 January 1945. The surviving POWs, 580, were all transported to Fukuoka POW Camp on January 30, 1945. In addition to those killed in the two ship incidents, many others died of illness or other causes aboard the ships. Shortly after the sinking in Subic Bay of the Oryoku Maru, a list of names was compiled at Bilibid Prison by prisoners in the record office from a list of names brought in by the Japanese. This list is believed to represent those who became casualties in the first sinking. Another list, believed to represent those who were killed in the Takao disaster, was prepared from Japanese Prison records. Other reports indicate the Japanese Prison ship, "Brazil Maru", was sunk enroute from Takao, Formosa to Moji, Kyushu, Japan.

1. Reference is made to Board Proceedings, your headquarters, dated 8 May 1948, 3 June 1948, and 10 December 1948, recommending the following individual identifications:

2. Reference is also made to findings of Unidentifiability, dated 6 May 1949, for Unknown X-1335, AGNS Mausoleum Manila.

3. Board Proceedings have been disapproved. The documentary evidence presented in this case is not considered conclusive. No actual proof exists that the subject decedents were buried in San Fernando Cemetery. Dental comparisons are not sufficiently conclusive to prove the recommendations.

4. The findings of Unidentifiability for Unknown X-1335 are dated 3 May 1949, however the roster of recoveries from San Fernando Cemetery, dated 7 September 1949, indicates that Unknown X-1335 was eliminated thru consolidation.

5. Board Proceedings and findings of Unidentifiability are returned herewith.

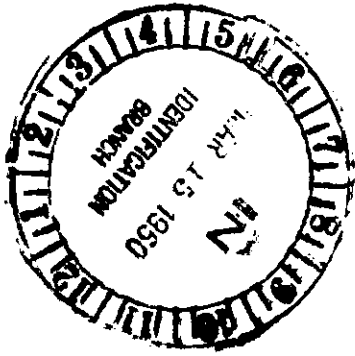

S T A T E M E N T

Per basic letter from DOTA, OQMG, Wash., 25, D.C., file QMGMU 293, UNKs X-422 thru X-427 (Manila #2, P.I.), dated 3 Dec 47, Subj: "Burial Information".

Remains of six (6) unknowns previously disinterred from San Fernando Municipal Cemetery, Luzon (Grave, Plot or Row not designated) and reinterred in Manila Cemetery #2, in Plot 2, Row 14, Grave # 1797, 1801, 1802, 1803, 1804, and 1805 were processed by the CIP Laboratory. In processing these remains on Oct 47, it was determined that there were portions of ten (10) remains. Segregation was made in Manila Mausoleum, UNK Nos. X-888-A, X-888-B, X-888-C, X-889-A, X-889-B, X-890, X-891, X-892, X-893-A and X-893-B were assigned.

Upon request to reprocess these remains in conjunction with known remains of Eugene L Specht, Deenah Rue McCurry, Wendell E Swanson, Alexander E Keegan, UNK X-3575, (Formerly Lloyd E Wagner), Lt Col Dwight D Edison, Cleris S C Raymond and William F Glaab, it was determined that these were minor bone discrepancies in all cases and that cases X-888-C and X-893-B were portions of these known and unknown remains. After careful analysis of bone structure, therefore X-888-C and X-893-B were segregated into these remains without changing any major bone structure.

Per letter from Headquarters, 3 Mar 48 instructed to reprocess Manila Mausoleum, UNK X-1335 and X-1336 in conjunction with all the knowns and unknowns of this group. Upon reprocessing, it was determined that the small portion of skeletal remains of UNK X-1335 could be consolidated with UNK X-888-B and X-1336 and consolidation was performed.

One extra I.D. tag of "MARTIN L JOHNSON, 6273044 BX" was found with the remains of "EDISON, DWIGHT D". It is suggested that Martin L Johnson could possibly be one of the unknowns in this group.

CONCLUSION: Cancellation of Unknown cases X-888-C, X-893-B and X-1335. Corrected forms 1042, 1044, 1044-A and 1044-B on all the formerly processed unknowns. Instead of a total of fifteen (15) remains as stated in ltr DOTA, OQMG, Washington 25, D.C., dated 3 Dec 47, file QMGMU 293, or seventeen (17) remains as stated in attached copy of Report of Investigation Division, Legal Section, GHQ, SACAF dtd 16 Sept 46; there are eighteen (18) remains; eight (8) knowns and ten (10) unknowns.

REPORT: re - Recovery of Two Bodies, presumably American, in the grave in the Municipal Cemetery, San Fernando, Pampanga, Luzon, from which the bodies of Wendell F. SWANSON and fourteen others were recovered in December 1945.

1. Junsaburo TOSHINO, a former Japanese officer now confined in the Sugamo Prison, Tokyo, Japan, has admitted witnessing the execution of fifteen American Prisoners of War in the San Fernando Municipal Cemetery in December 1944. He has drawn a map to indicate the position of the spot where the execution took place in the cemetery and where the Prisoners of War were buried.
2. Federico SALES, caretaker of the Municipal Cemetery, San Fernando, Pampanga, has pointed out the grave described by TOSHINO, SALES states that four Americans were buried in the grave in December 1944 but that some fifteen bodies were recovered from this grave in December 1945.
3. On the basis of the details related in the above paragraphs it seems possible that the above-mentioned grave might contain a total of some nineteen bodies.
4. According to the Report of Interment of Wendell F. SWANSON, only fifteen bodies were recovered from this grave.
5. Therefore, on 13 September 1946, this grave was reopened by a gravedigging detail under the supervision of a Master Sergeant from the Graves Recovery Team Field Headquarters at Bacolor, Pampanga, and this officer.
6. The grave yielded one complete skeletal remains and one skeletal remains less the skull. These remains are not those of a Filipino and are therefore believed to be those of an American. No means of positive identification of the bodies was located.
7. It is most possible that there are not more remains to be recovered from the above-mentioned grave.



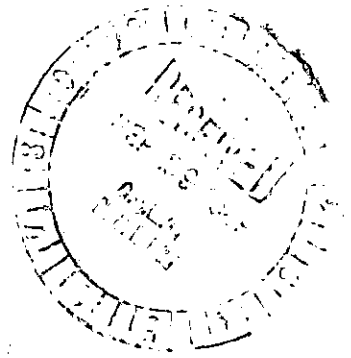

STATEMENT CONCERNING DETERMINATION OF DEATH

A complete investigation of available records covering the loss of the above named officers and enlisted men has been made and discloses the following:

At approximately 1115 on 13 December, 1944, 1619 American, British and Dutch prisoners departed from Bilibid Prison and were put on board a ship at Pier 7, Manila, to be transported to Japan.

The prisoners were put below in three holds. There they were in such crowded quarters that they could neither stand nor lie down. No ventilation or lights were provided, other than from the hatches. Lt. George Karl PETRITZ, 97128, USNR, a survivor of the disaster, has reported that many prisoners in the after-hold, in which he himself was carried, suffocated due to lack of ventilation.

At approximately 0730 on 14 December, 1944, the ship was bombed by American planes when located in the China Sea at approximately 120°15'E longitude, 14°60'N latitude. Two additional bombing attacks followed at intervals of about three hours on the same day. These bombings resulted in slight damage to the ship and no casualties among the American prisoners.

Proceeding to Olongapo, Subic Bay, Philippine Islands, the ship was bombed for the last time on the morning of 15 December, 1944. During this attack, serious damage was inflicted upon the ship. Numerous fires started. As the ship began to settle, all Japanese abandoned her. A near-hit on the afterhold caused a beam to fall down the hatchway on prisoners who were in the hold directly below. During the bombing attacks, some prisoners attempted to escape and in each instance ten prisoners were shot in the arm for each one who tried to escape. Lieut. PETRITZ has estimated that this final bombing killed about thirty prisoners.

It has been estimated by survivors that approximately 1200 Americans escaped from the ship into the water. Life jackets, boats and rafts were used in the attempt to reach shore which was 100 yards away. Japanese on the beach fired at the men in the water.

As fast as the prisoners reached shore, they were recaptured by the Japanese. Information was obtained from Japanese sentries by KENTNER, Robert William, 234-06-01, PhMlc, USN, (reference (b),) serving at that time in a clerical capacity in the office of Bilibid Prison, that the recaptured prisoners were taken to San Fernando, La Union, on the Bataan Coast whence they were shipped to Japan. The sentries further informed KENTNER that this shipment was again bombed by United States planes off the coast of Formosa and many casualties ensued.

On 31 December, 1944, the Japanese authorities turned in to the office at Bilibid Prison where KENTNER was serving, the original list of the draft of 13 December, 1944, for retyping. This list indicated that 76 personnel were missing and 231 were dead. Of these KENTNER obtained the names of six Marine Corps personnel listed as "dead" who appear on the records of this Headquarters as follows:

KENTNER also obtained the names of five Marine Corps personnel listed as "missing" who appear on the records of this Headquarters as follows:

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A list of United States Naval personnel was obtained surreptitiously from Japanese records at Bilibid Prison by Naval personnel who were serving in the office at Bilibid and has been furnished by Commander A. R. McCracken, 57658, USN, formerly a prisoner of war. The names of those dead and missing coincide with the names set out above as appearing in the list obtained by KENTNER.

In addition to an undetermined number of survivors of the disaster of 15 December, 1944, who were recaptured by the Japanese, there were two survivors, Lt. PETRITZ, and KADOLPH, Darnell, W., PFC, U.S.A. who have returned to military jurisdiction of the United States. The latter two swam to a beach in the opposite direction from the above-mentioned one and hid out with guerrilla forces.

It is the opinion of Lt. PETRITZ that all prisoners other than KADOLPH and himself were recaptured or killed. Searches by guerrilla forces in the area revealed no trace of any other successful escape by a surviving prisoner. Reoccupation by the United States forces in the Subic Bay Area, was begun on 29-30 January, 1945. No additional survivors have been reported.

In view of the above circumstances and of the fact that, although six months have elapsed since the sinking and the surrounding territory has for some time been in possession of American forces, nothing further has been heard of any of the above named personnel, the conclusion is inescapable that all of them, including those listed by the Japanese as missing, are dead.

It is recommended that the above named personnel be determined to have been killed in action on 15 December, 1944. It is further recommended that the date of this determination be fixed as of 11 June, 1945, the date on which evidence conclusively establishing their deaths was received in the Casualty Division, Personnel Department, U. S. Marine Corps.

1. Remains have been found in the Phillipine Islands which are believed to be those of the late Lieutenant Colonel Freeney. The location where the remains were found agrees closely with the last known movements of Lieutenant Colonel Freeney.

2. There is on file in the Navy Department a dental record dated 7 January, 1942 which was made on the occasion of Lieutenant Colonel Freeney's examination for promotion. The upper jaw on this chart shows a partial denture. Only teeth No. 3, 5, 6, 11 and 12 (Navy nomenclature numbering from right to left) remain. The dental chart of the lower jaw of the body in question compares closely with that which we have recorded for Lieutenant Colonel Freeney. However, the upper jaw shows a complete denture.

3. Inquiry of Comaander Claud K. Fraleigh, Dental Corps, U. S. Navy, who was also a prisoner at Cabanatuan, has elicited the information that several of the personnel at that prison camp were permitted to go into the town of Cabanatuan for prosthetic dental treatment. He has stated that you were the camp dental surgeon at that time and it is believed possible you may have some recollection of the circumstances. It is requested that you advise this Headquarters at the earliest practicable date whether you have any record or recollection of the late Lieutenant Colonel Freeney's having had a complete upper denture made in replacement of the partial denture we have recorded.

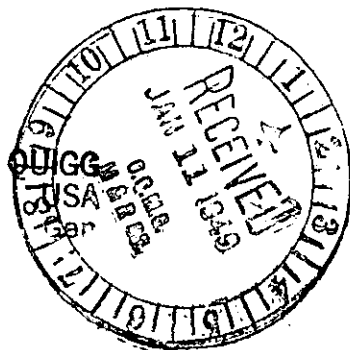

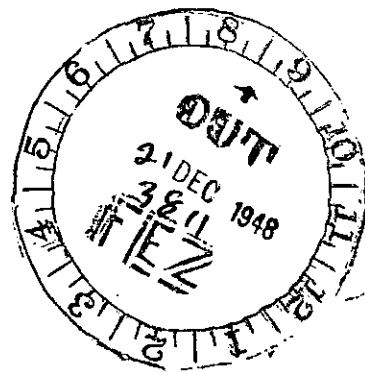



FOREWORD

The attached death lists of Prisoners of War of Allied nationalities who died en route during transfer from the Philippines to Japan Proper aboard the Japanese Prisoner of War Transport ships, the Oryoku Maru, the Enoura Maru, and the Brazil Maru, December 1944 - January 1945, were prepared from, and are based solely upon, official records of the Japanese Government Prisoner of War Information Bureau, Tokyo. (Hereafter referred to as the Bureau).

A thorough investigation of the Japanese records and a conference with the wartime employees of the Bureau indicate that the information reported by the Bureau during World War II through the International Red Cross Committee to the various Allied governments concerned, pertaining to the casualties incurred during this transfer, was incomplete and misleading, particularly with reference to the dates and causes of death. The scanty Japanese reports dispatched during the war would lead to the assumption that over 900 prisoners of war died in the bombing and sinking of the Oryoku Maru on 15 December 1944 in Subic Bay, Olongapo, Luzon, P. I. This, however, was discovered to be erroneous as evidenced by the affidavits executed by surviving prisoners of war and by Japanese records themselves, indicating that many of the deaths actually took place aboard the Enoura Maru and the Brazil Maru as well and that the dates of death ranged from December 1944 through January 1945.

Attention is invited to the death certificates of American Prisoners of War who died during this voyage, translated copies of which were previously forwarded to The Adjutant General, to the Commanding General, United States Army Forces, Western Pacific, and to the Commanding General, United States Army Forces, Middle Pacific. According to the Japanese officials of the Bureau, these death certificates were ostensibly prepared from information contained in a roster delivered to the Bureau by Japanese Army Lieutenant Junsaburo Toshino, who was the Prisoner of War Guard Commander during this transfer. Although discrepancies have been noted in the death certificates, it is believed that the attached lists, together with the death certificates, represent the best information available from Japanese sources. A "List of Discrepancies" is attached to each list for reference.

1. Forwarded, concurring in the remarks of Lieutenant Colonel KEENE.

2. The late Captain Lloyd E. WAGNER, (04450), USMC was transferred from Manila on 13 December, 1944, the ship was bombed and sunk in Subic Bay on 15 December, 1944. Captain WAGNER survived that sinking, was re-embarked on another ship from northern Luzon for Japan. That ship was attacked in Takao Harbor, Formosa on 9 January, 1945 and Captain WAGNER was killed or died that day. His remains were transferred ashore on 13 January, 1945 and turned over to the Formosians there. While in San Fernando, Pampanga about 22 December, 1945 (enroute to northern Luzon) fifteen (15) American POW's injured in the bombing in Subic on 15 December were loaded on a truck to be taken to a hospital (so stated Lieutenant Toshino of the Japanese army). None of the fifteen (15) have been heard from since. Lieutenant Colonel S. W. FREEMAN, USMC was in that group and if the remains are those of a Marine Officer they are undoubtedly his.

3. There were several deaths among the POW's there but none were Marine Officers. However Corporal SPECHT, Company "M", 4th Marines was one of them, his left arm had just been amputated at the elbow.

4. It must be remembered the most POW's that swam ashore were without clothing, the few that did have clothing shared it with others and if identification were made by clothing or its contents it could not be considered accurate.



The records of this Headquarters indicate that Captain Wagner was transferred from Manila on 13 December, 1944; that the ship was bombed and sunk in Subic Bay; and that the surviving prisoners of war were reembarked on another ship for Japan. A subsequent report from the International Red Cross stated that Captain Wagner, among others, was killed in an air attack "during transport by ship from the Philippines to Japan". A report has now been received of the recovery in San Fernando Municipal Cemetery of remains presumed to be those of Captain Wagner and an attempt is being made to confirm the identification of these remains.
