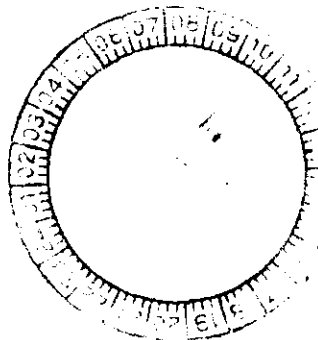

1. Reference is made to Report of Burial for Unknown X-91, in U.S. Military Cemetery, Foy #1, Belgium, Plot I, Row 11, Grave 275, place and date of death shown as vicinity of Fraiture, Belgium, (est) December 1944. One vehicle, found twenty-five feet to the left of the remains bore no serial number or any other possible identification markings. A second vehicle to the right of the remains was an Armored Car, serial number 6037066-S. The third vehicle, sixty-four feet due north across the road from the remains was a destroyed Sherman Tank, marked as follows:

A sign, presumably a divisional advance sign, located thirty feet from the remains bore the code phrase "POWERHOUSE ADVANCE".

2. It is requested that your office attempt to determine from the organizations known to have been in the vicinity of Fraiture, Belgium during December 1944, the names of personnel reported to have been missing or killed in action and for whom no reports of burial have been received. In the event that organizations known to have been in that vicinity during December 1944 have been returned to the Zone of the Interior, it is requested that your office furnish whatever information may be available to you that will be of assistance to this office in resolving the identity of Unknown X-91.



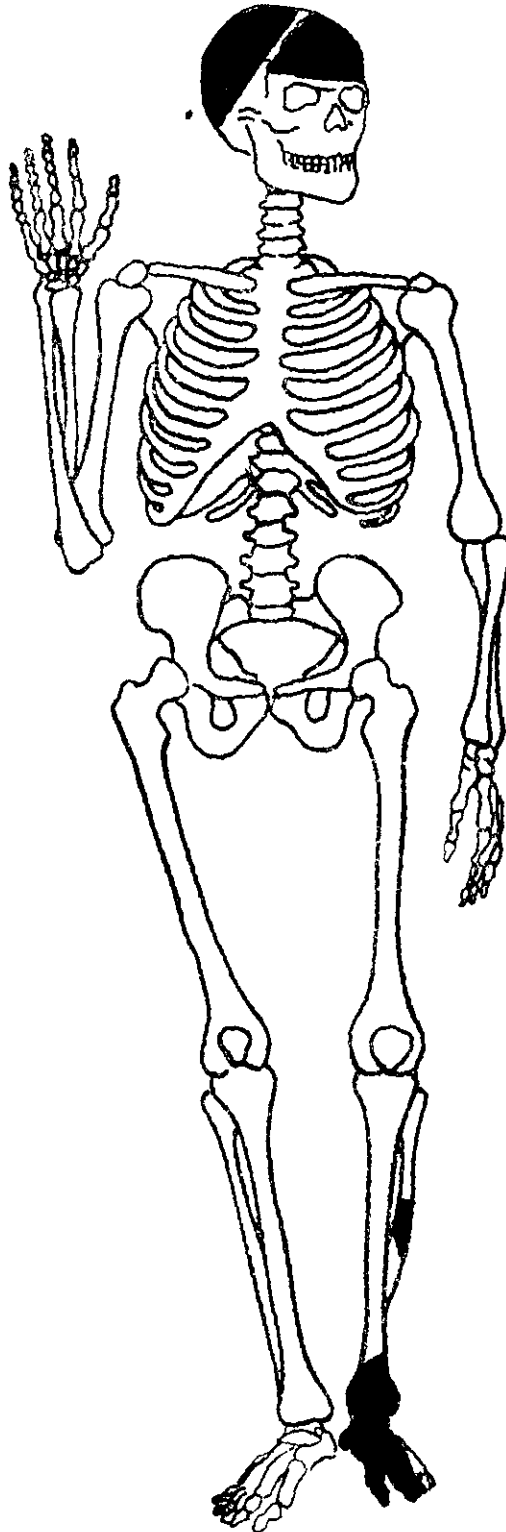

INFORMATION GATHERED PERTINENT TO THE BURIAL OF UNIDENTIFIED X-9I in PLOT I
ROW 11, GRAVE 275: U.S. MIL. CEMETERY #1, FOY, BELGIUM, 10 APRIL 45.

The remains consisted of the cranium with a small amount of brown hair still clinging and a left foot still intact within a Parabout Size 7. No other parts of the skull were found, making it impossible to take tooth charts. Estimated date of death is December, 1944.

Further investigation of the area revealed in the immediate vicinity three destroyed vehicles, American, that may have some relation to the remains. One vehicle twenty-five feet to the left of the remains (see attached sketch) bore no Serial No. or any other possible identification markings. However, an American Steel Helmet, with the Serial No. "H-6277" was taken from within the destroyed vehicle. A second vehicle to the right of the remains was identified as an armored car, Ser. No. 6037066-S. No other pertinent clues were located in its vicinity. The third vehicle was a destroyed Sherman Tank, due north across the road, (see attached sketch), a distance of sixty-four feet. The interior of this tank was destroyed by fire. A charred shoe fitting a left foot Size 8 1/2-C with USA manufacture #85 was found near the vehicle. A pair of partially destroyed unburned O.D. Trousers bearing EM SERIAL # G-8097 was picked up a distance of five feet from the tank. The destroyed vehicle carried the following identification marks:

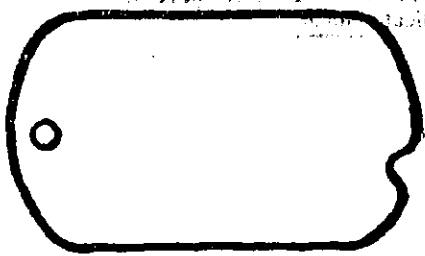
