2. The above group identification cannot be approved by this Office for the following reasons:

a. Unknowns X-192 and X-193 have not been processed since 1946.

b. Item 2, corrected Reports of Burial, states, "Identified casualty crew members of the 2 aircraft were recovered from the same civilian cemetery as the five (5) listed Unknowns". Missing Air Crew Report for aircraft 42-97954 shows only Daranek, Donigan, Callahan and North were killed in this crash.

c. Date of death as shown on the original Report of Burial for X-182 is 8 March 1945.

3. In view of the facts outlined above, it is requested that the following action be completed:

a. Unknowns X-182 A and B, X-192, X-193 and X-249, St. Avoird, be simultaneously reprocessed by an accredited anthropologist to determine articulation of remains.

The remains of X-193 received without teeth and only a small portion of skull. Articulation is impossible due to missing portions. Age estimation was taken from the pubic symphysis only. The age, height and weight is favorable with the Form 371 for NORTH.

Case X-249 - No teeth were recovered with the remains of X-249. Only one small portion of the skull was found. Articulation between skull and vertebral column is impossible due to missing portions. A large amount of flesh was recovered with the remains. The age estimation was taken from the epiphysis of clavicle and the pubic symphysis. It is believed that this remains does not belong to any individual in this group due to the estimated age which is approx. 27 and is some what older than the ages of the remaining casualties.

Case X-182 B - The remains of X-182 B consist of only a shattered right humerus and a shattered right ulna and radius. The right middle shaft of a humerus found with this remains was removed and placed with X-182 where it was in agreement with left humerus of that case. Due to the skeletal characteristics no other consolidation was possible.

Cause of death - It is believed that plane crash was the cause of death for this group.

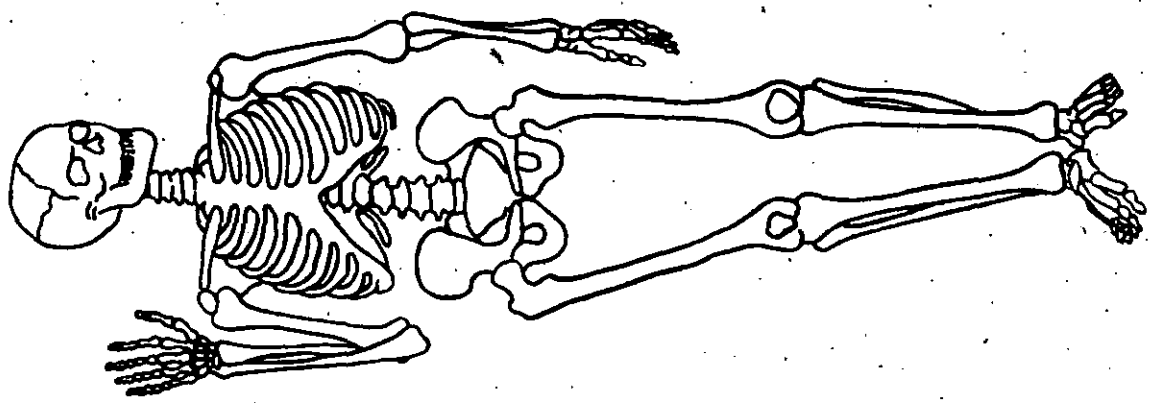

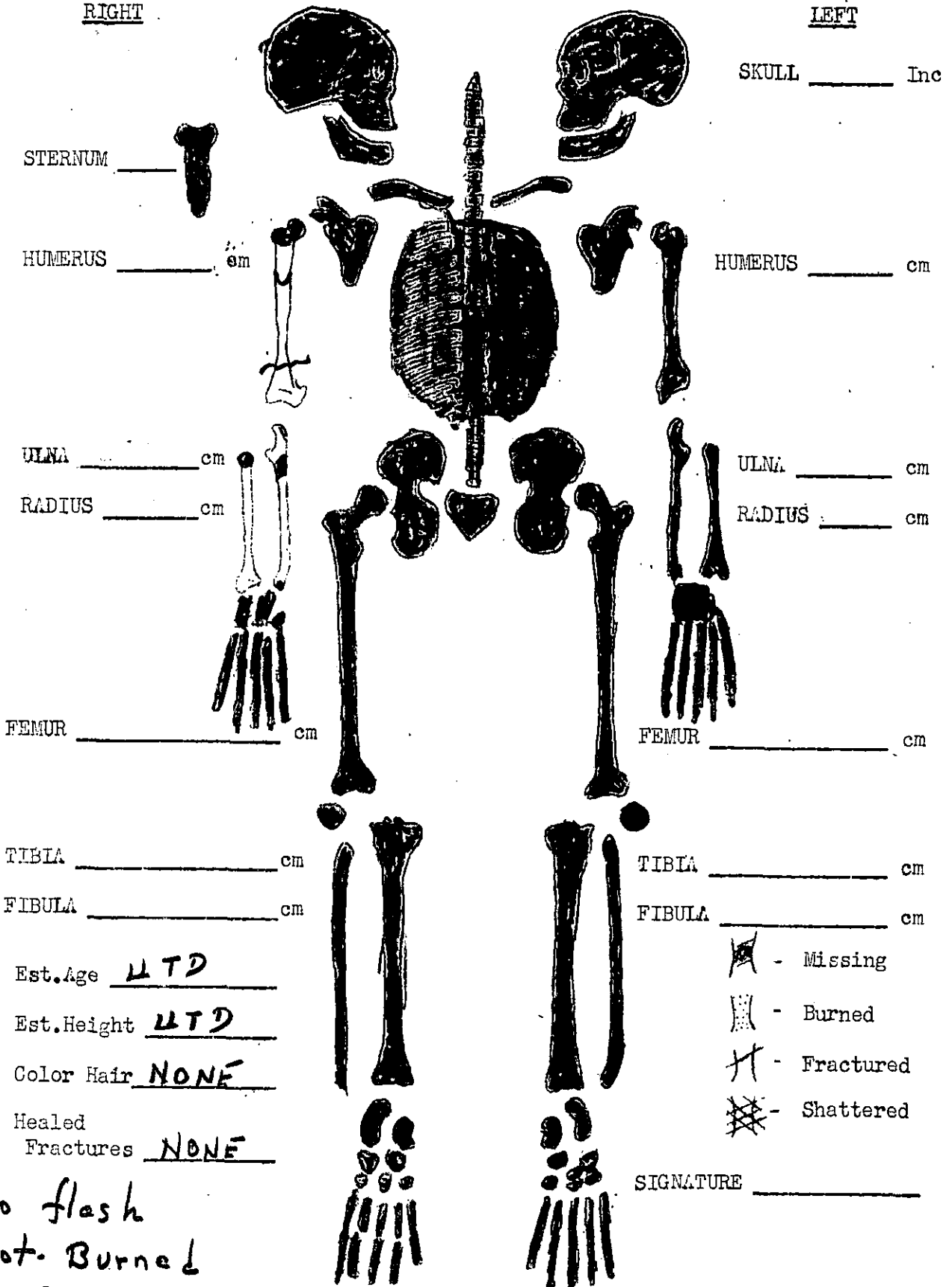

NARRATIVE

1. Comparisons have been made between the associated cases and Forms 371 submitted. Due to the lack of teeth in every case and the small amount of remains in each case it is felt that there is insufficient evidence available to establish individual identifications.

2. Some evidence is present to indicate a possible association between X-182A and WALSH based on estimated age, height, weight of bone structure and the presence of black hair. None of the other crew members appears to have had black hair except WALSH.

3. A fair association of X-193 with NORTH could be made on height alone but the age of this remains appears a little older than 23.

4. From the evidence available the following comparisons have been made.
