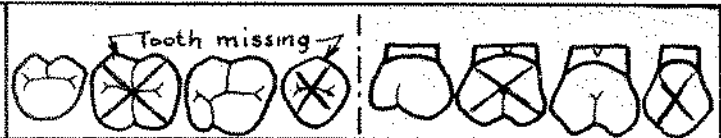


MISSING TEETH... All teeth missing through previous extraction (not those fractured or displaced by recent wounds) should be "X" 'd out and labeled, thus :



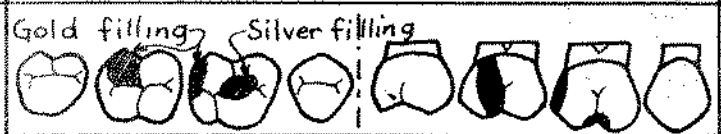
CROWNED TEETH... Block in solid the crown of tooth (label gold, porcelain, Silver or gold and porcelain), thus :

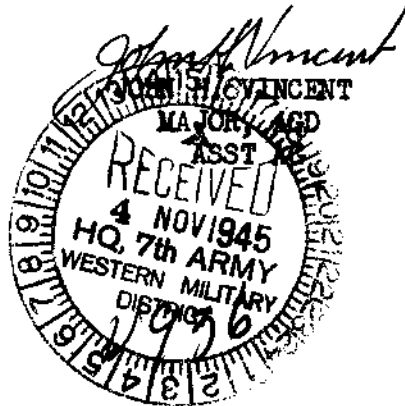
TO : Commanding General, Seventh Army, APO 758, U. S. Army.

1. Following receipt of a report from the Commanding General, 1st Armored Division on or about 24 October 1945, that remains of American dead were in the vicinity of Herrlisheim, France investigation by this command was made, results of which is contained in inclosure No. 1 hereof.

2. In view of the status of this Division and the almost 100 % change in personnel since the combat action occurred at Herrlisheim that evidently caused these casualties, it is recommended that proper steps be taken to identify these dead and effect burial.

SUBJECT: Remains of Tankers K.I.A. at Herrlesheim, France.

TO : Whitaker W. Shelton, Chaplain (Capt.), 12th. Armored Division,
23rd. Tank Bat.

1. Leaving Dischingen, Germany yesterday afternoon, I proceeded to Herrlesheim, France to see, report, and make a photographic record of reports coming to our attention from men who visited said area last week from the 23rd. Tank Bat. that bodies and parts of burned bodies still remained, of tank crewmen who were K.I.A. there last January, in knocked-out tanks.

2. Covering the complete battlefield near Herrlesheim, France I found the following conditions;

(a) Every American Tank had parts of the armor plating removed apparently by some type of melting torch. In most cases enough of the plating had been removed to make removal of bodies possible.

(b) Bodies had apparently been removed from most tanks and from all half-tracks.

(c) Some pieces of equipment had been removed from ~~most tanks~~ some of the tanks such as radios.

(d) The ground next to some overturned tanks indicates that the tanks were manually overturned for one reason or another.

(e) Tank No. 30100445 (A-16) of the 23rd. Tank Bat., Tank No. 3081594 (A-5, 1st. Plt.) of the 23rd. Tank Bat. and one other tank contained parts of burnt human bodies. One contained flesh, in one tank a larger burnt section of either hip or shoulder was visible, and in the third tank the complete burnt body of the second driver sits in its seat with the front of the tank completely open so that removal of the body would be an easy task.

(f) All tanks containing visible bodies are within one thousand yards from the main asphalt highway and can be easily reached by truck.

(g) In one tank where flesh is visible sand bags have been placed in the drivers seat and cut or ripped open so as to completely cover the seat.

3. With this report are photographs of many of the said vehicles, which clearly show most points mentioned in para. 2. of this report.

SUBJECT: Investigation of Herrlisheim, France Area for Missing Bodies.

TO : Commanding General, 12th Armored Division, APO 262, U. S. Army.

1. A thorough search of the Herrlisheim battle area was made and the following was found:

a. Human bones and decomposed flesh were found in front of one tank; also human bones were found to the right of the tank, facing east and one badly burned steel helmet containing parts of a skull and decomposed flesh. Parts of a human body badly burned were found in the bow gunner's seat.

Vehicle Number: 12 A.D. - 23 Tk Bn. - A-16
USA No. 30100 445

Location: Approximately 100 yards north of Stainwald Woods, 300 yards west of Gamsheim-Herrlisheim Road.

b. Parts of human body found badly burned. This tank had been turned over so it was impossible to determine what position this individual had occupied.

Location: 150 yards north of Stainwald Woods. 300 yards west of Gamsheim-Herrlisheim Road.

c. One badly burned body found in the bow gunner's seat.

Location: 200 yards north of Stainwald Woods. 2,500 yards west of Gamsheim-Herrlisheim Road.

2. The following information was obtained from French civilians. After the Americans had cleaned out the Herrlisheim area and moved on, seven dead Americans were found. All were buried in the Herrlisheim Cemetary. The locations are as follows:

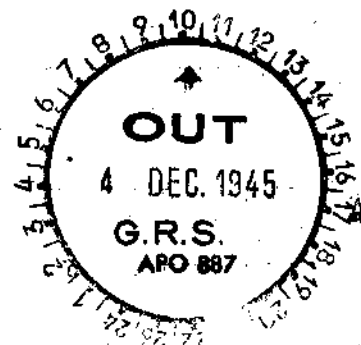

1. Thorough investigation in and around Harrihsheim revealed no more American graves in the village cemetery, other than the five already examined.
2. Further investigations disclosed the location of 11 isolated graves in the vicinity of Harrihsheim. Upon excavation, 8 of the 11 remains were identified. The deceased were buried in St. Amand at the following:

2. Further investigation of the battle area with particular reference to tankers' remains was not completed due to weather. An examination of French maps showed this battleground to be heavily mined and booby-trapped. It was deemed unwise to take unnecessary risks as mine detectors could not be used.

3. This case has been referred to the 535th QM Group as they are assigned the political sub-division of Bas Rhin for searching and evacuation. When conditions permit investigation and disinterment will be completed.

3. Two American soldiers believed to be members of the 56th Armored Infantry Battalion, 12th Armored Division, were found buried in the corner of the property belonging to Eugene Brezillian, House #11, Ponto Village Strasse in Herrlisheim. Mrs. Brezillian stated that she had found identification on both soldiers and had turned it over to the mayor. When the mayor was contacted, he refused to be of any assistance whatsoever, stating that he knew nothing of the matter. It is suggested that whoever removes these bodies should contact the French military authorities and demand that this mayor make a detailed report on the disposition of the identification belonging to these soldiers.

4. No maps were available, although any person having the number of the tanks concerned, can easily find the above mentioned remains.
