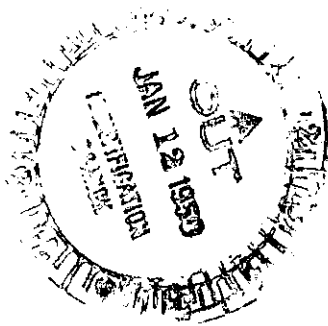

The remains of Unknown X-1088 (USMC Saint Avold) was recovered from either Mulhouse or Uhrwiller, France. Laundry marking "9388" found on clothing of X-1088 was checked and found to agree with last four digits of ASN for a Pfc Adams. And although Pfc Adams was missing in the area these remains are definitely not those of Pfc Adams as tooth chart and physical characteristics of X-1088 are contradictory to those of Pfc Adams. * As Pfc Adams was a member of the 157th Infantry Regiment it was thought that possibly this case could be that of a unresolved casualty of that organization. All Form 371's for casualties of that organization were compared with data for X-1088 without favorable results. Furthermore as all Form 371's for unresolved casualties on Map Sheet K-49 were compared against X-1088 without an association being made, these remains are being declared U N I D E N T I F I A B L E.

TO : Commanding General, AGRC, APO 887, U.S. Army.

1. Because of the unusual circumstances involved in the recovery of the remains of UNK-X-1087, 1088, 1089 and 1091 it is felt at this office that a letter of explanation is necessary to clarify the reports of interment of these remains.

2. The remains were brought to St. Avold Cemetery by a French mine clearing unit in burlap sacks unlabeled as to the location from which they came.

3. An investigation team was sent out by this office which determined by consultation with the minesclearing unit where the four remains were found but it was impossible to find out which remain came from which locations. The GR # 1 forms therefore list two possible places from which the remains were removed.
