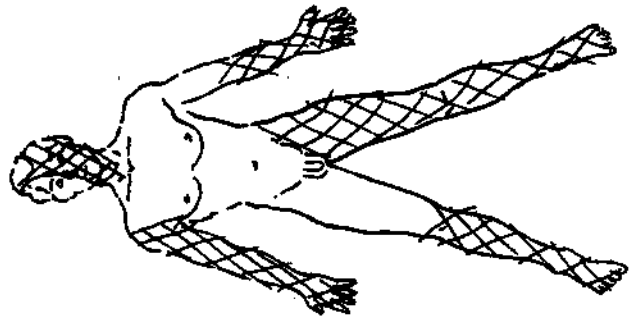

SUBJECT: Narrative Report of Investigation.

While conducting our search in the Commune of Guenange, Moselle, France, we found that some isolated graves had been found on the farm of Georges Joseph near the bridge of Guenange. When we arrived there we found that PoWs had already removed two Germans from the field to the side of the road. They had intended to move four more who were thought to be American because of the equipment thrown around. We told them to mark the spots with sticks and leave them where they were and we would remove the bodies.

We talked with the farmer who gave us a statement of all he knew but could find no one else who knew anything about the burials as the people of the town had evacuated during the battle. From a statement of the Mayor we estimated date of death and time of burial to be approximately 8th November 1944

Relating to the corpses found at the place called "Gensaker", I can say that during the occupation and the Liberation, I was not here as all the people of the Commune had left. When I began my actual functions again, I knew that just after the battle several bodies of American soldiers were found and that they were probably gathered by the American Authorities.

When the sweeping Services swept the village they found more bodies but according to informations received they are german bodies.

As for military equipments found near the bodies, it seems very likely that they were from American soldiers quartered here and are not a proof the remains are from American soldiers.

I can say that the battle took place on the 8th of November 1944.

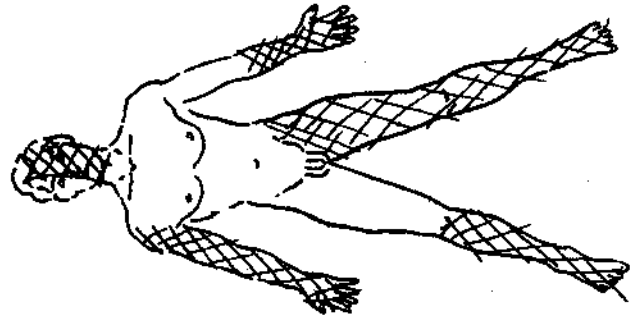

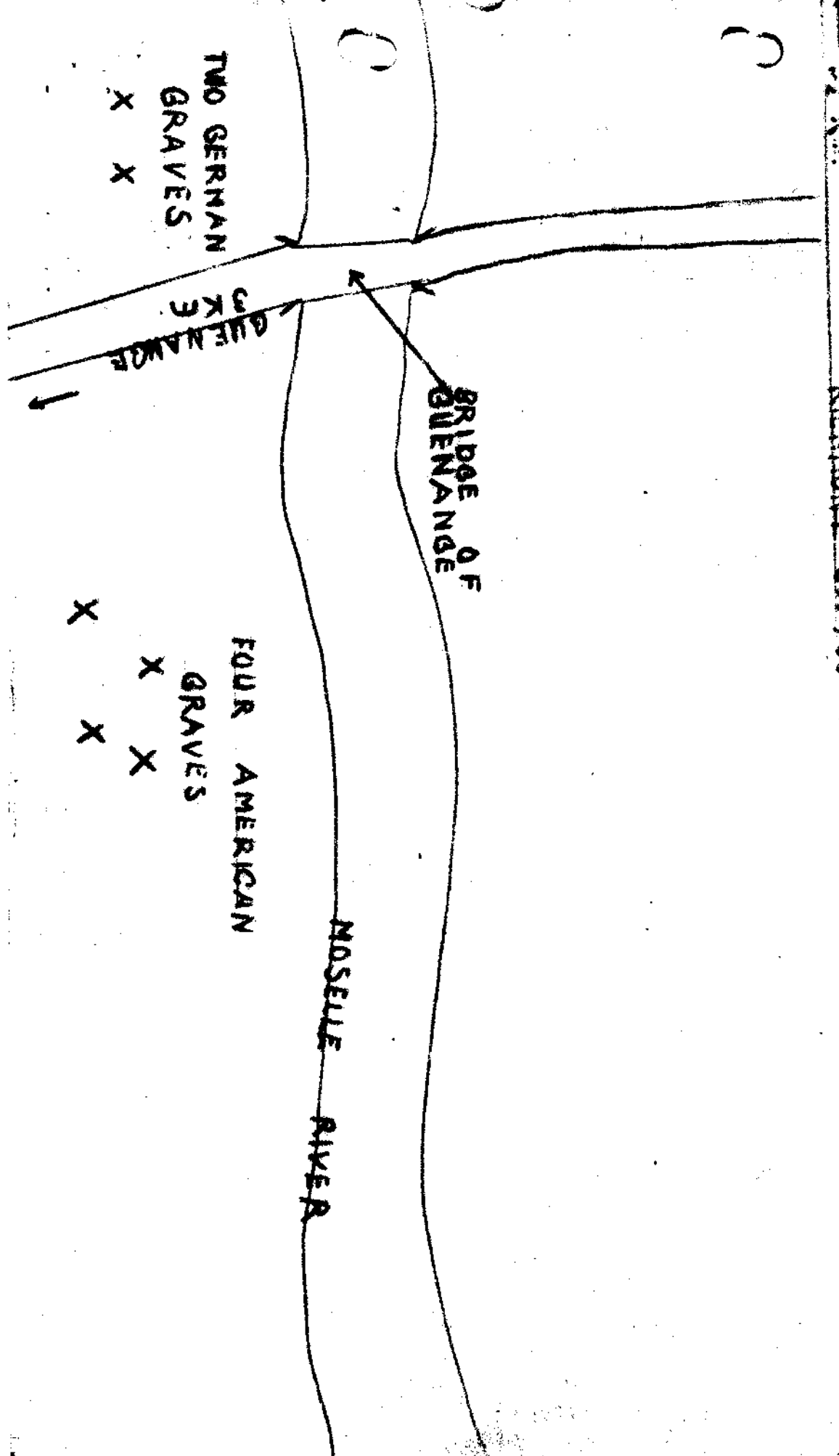

SUBJECT: Narrative Report of Investigation.

While conducting our search in the Commune of Guenange, Moselle, France, we found that some isolated graves had been found on the farm of Georges Joseph near the bridge of Guenange. When we arrived there we found that PoWs had already removed two Germans from the field to the side of the road. They had intended to move four more who were thought to be American because of the equipment thrown around. We told them to mark the spots with stakes and leave them where they were and we would remove the bodies.

We talked with the farmer who gave us a statement of all he knew but could find no one else who knew anything about the burials as the people of the town had evacuated during the battle. From a statement of the Mayor we estimated date of death and time of burial to be approximately 8th November 1944

Relating to the corpses found at the place called "Gensaker", I can say that during the occupation and the Liberation, I was not here as all the people of the Commune had left. When I began my actual functions again, I knew that just after the battle, several bodies of American soldiers were found and that they were probably gathered by the American Authorities.

When the sweeping Services swept the village they found more bodies but according to informations received they are german bodies.

As for military equipment found near the bodies, it seems very likely that they were from American soldiers quartered here and are not a proof the remains are from American soldiers.

I can say that the battle took place on the 8th of November 1944.

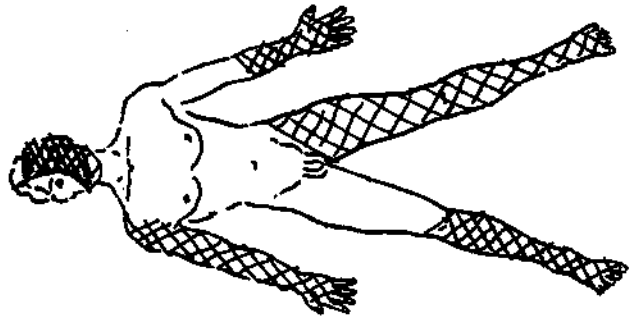




