1. Reference is made to Burial Reports for Unknowns X-175, 190, X-7384, X-7391 and X-7428 USMC St. Avoild, France and X-5913 USMC Neuville-en-Condroz, Belgium. These are the only remains recovered from Gertrauden Cemetery, Halle, Germany as yet unidentified, or for whom a tentative association does not exist.

2. Previous investigation has resulted in the tentative association of all known dead resulting from the Halle bombing, with the exception of the following seven (7) men:

Krashen, Sidney H.	36647713
Langendorf, Earl E.	36819182
MacCrae, William P.	31368054

3. Inclosed are Forms 371 covering all available identification data for these deceased. Efforts of this Office to associate any of the men referred to in paragraph 2 with the Unknowns listed in paragraph 1, above, have been unsuccessful to date; however, there is no record of a recent reprocessing of Unknowns X-175, X-190, X-7391 St. Avoild, or X-5913 Neuville.

4. It is requested that an investigation, to include reprocessing if necessary, be conducted by your Headquarters and if any identifications can be established that the facts be presented to a Field Board of Review and the findings forwarded this Office.

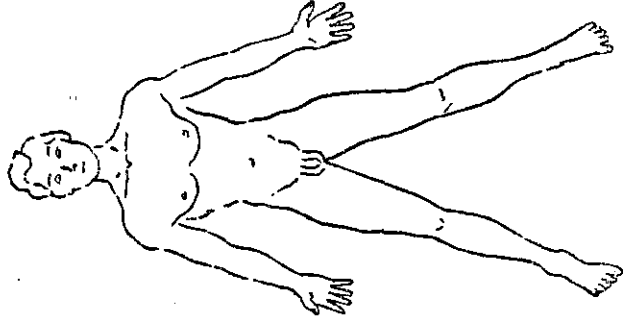

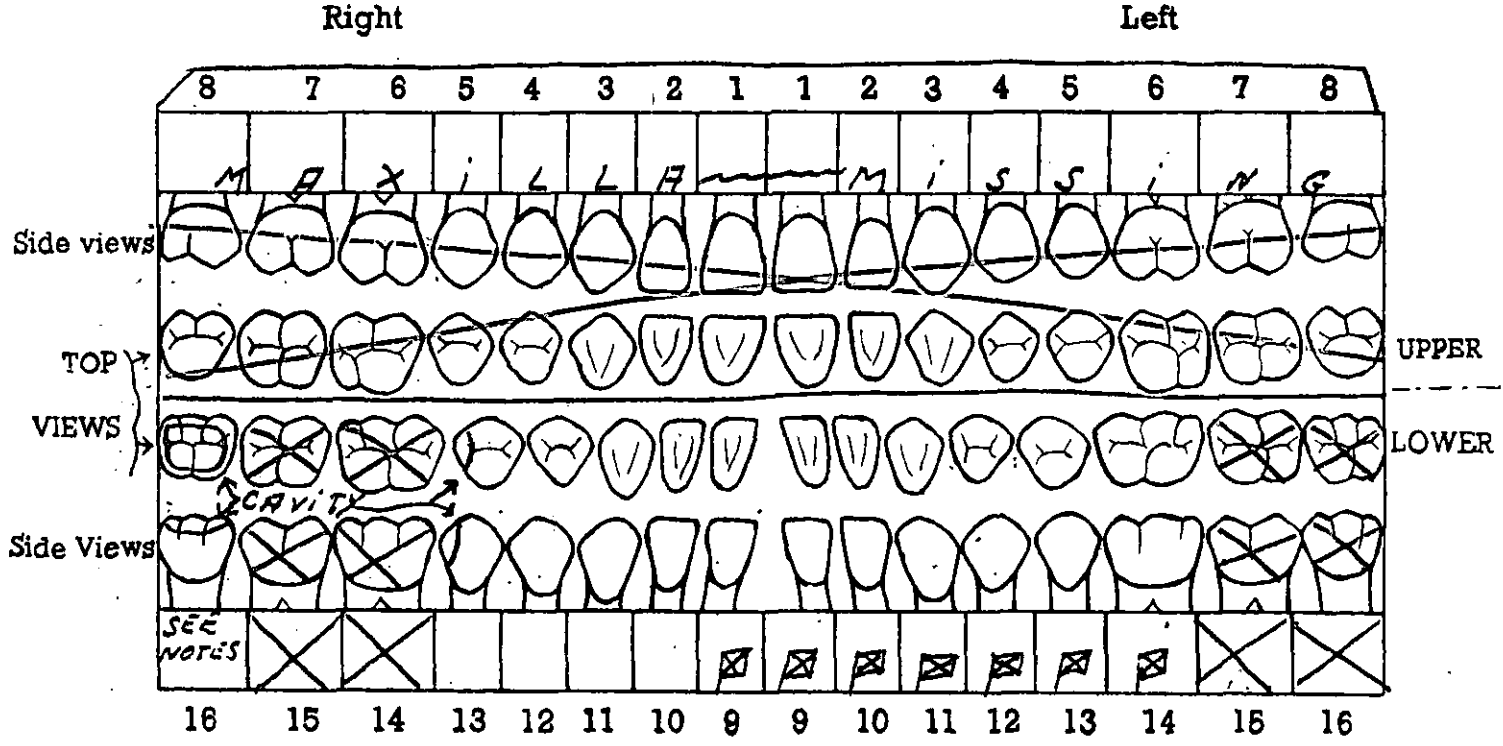

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspid (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. See reverse side for illustrations.

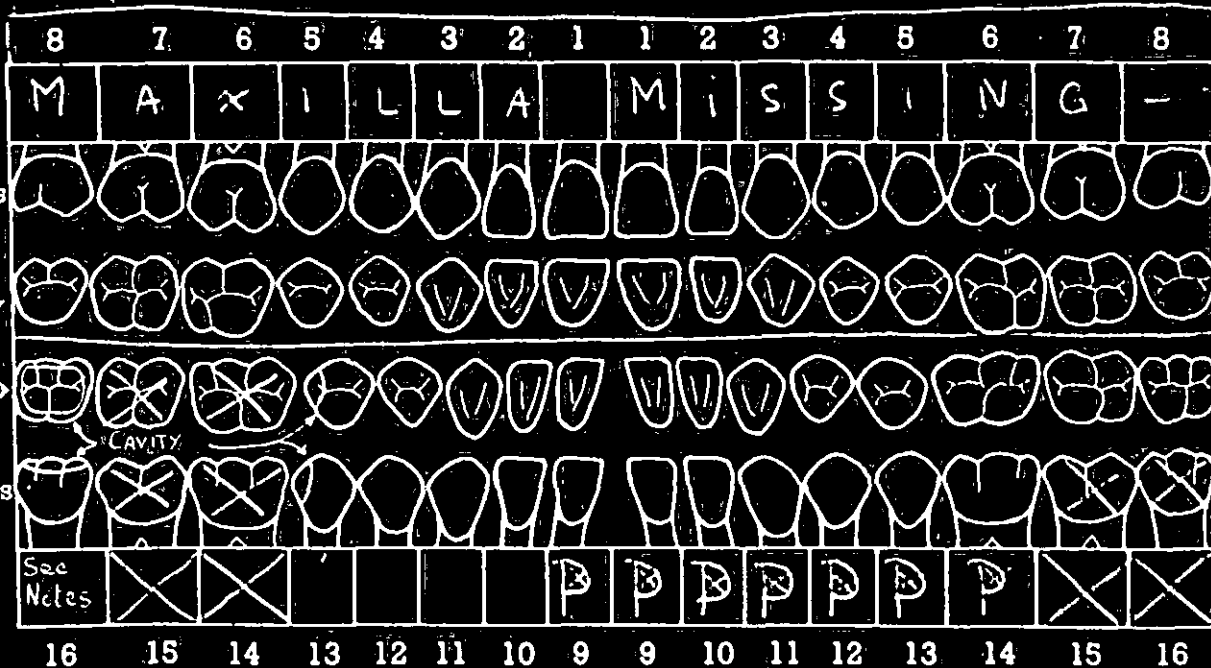

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. 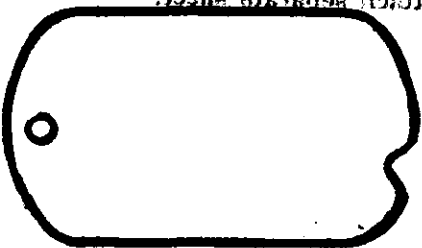

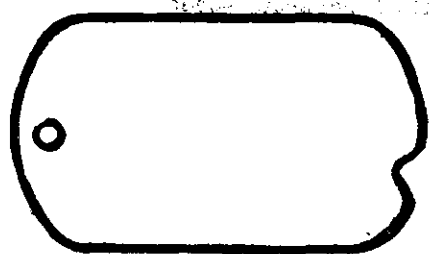
