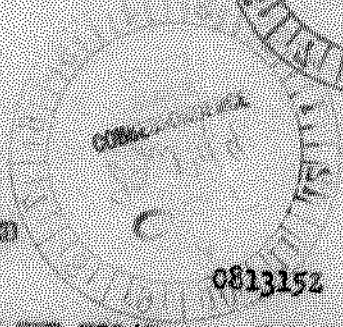
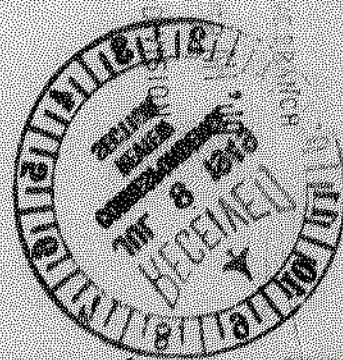
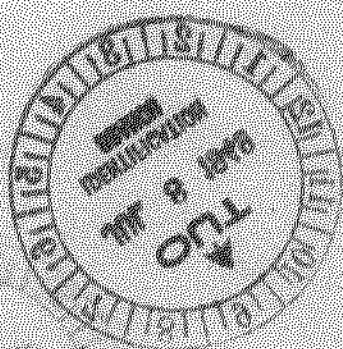

Subject remains were originally recovered from an isolated grave in the vicinity of Outwasser (Q-17) Czechoslovakia and designated as Unknown I-58 when interred in USMC Nurnberg, Germany, on 13 June 1945. Date of death was established as 4 May 1945 by information received from Matilda Verhofen, a resident of Outwasser.

Subsequently, the subject remains were redesignated as Unknown I-239 for reburial in USMC St. Avoird, France on 13 August 1945.

Report of burial, dated 30 August 1945, established Unknown I-239 as the remains of Pfc. Fred W. ASHLEY 39 907 750. Remarks on report of burial indicate the identification was based on similarity of place, date of death and physical characteristics. Also the fact that a clothing mark (M-2777) found on the remains was in agreement with another member, Pfc. Joel E. MATTSO, 36842777, of the same platoon as Pfc. Ashley, further substantiated the identification.

However, reprocessing of the subject remains (Ashley) on 30 June 1949, revealed the tooth chart obtained was not favorable with Army dental records of Pfc. Ashley. Therefore, upon the recommendation of OQMG, the remains identified as Pfc. Ashley were redesignated to Unknown (I-239).

Inasmuch as the tooth chart obtained for I-239 compared negatively with remaining ground force casualties still to be accounted for in Czechoslovakia, it is recommended that the subject Unknown be classified as Unidentifiable.
