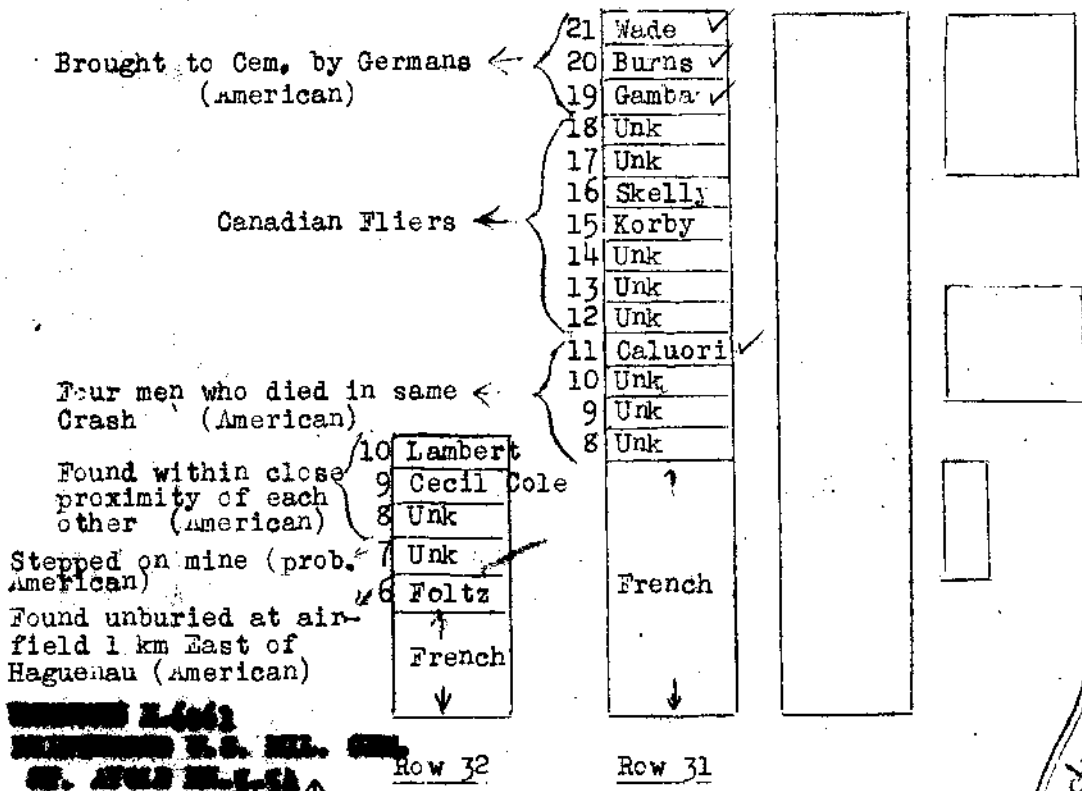

TO : Commanding Officer, American Graves Registration Command
European Theater Area, APO 887, US Army.

1. A report was received at this headquarters from Lt. Johnson at the C.I.P. at Strasbourg relative to the discovery of remains, presumed to be those of three (3) American soldiers, in the civilian cemetery at Haguenau (Bas Rhin).
2. Attention is invited to two letters from 4444 QM Service Co. dated 3 Dec 46 and 29 Jan 47 and five (5) statements revealing two separate investigations were made, with negative results on both.
3. It would appear that Lt. Johnson's source of information, in an effort to help, inadvertently gave outdated information.
4. Recommend this case be considered closed.

1. In order to eliminate all possible doubts on this case that was turned in to your Hqs previously on 4 December 1946, several more persons in the town of Haguenau were contacted. However no new aspects on the case were found and everybody persisted in the negative statements which were obtained during the first investigation.

2. Also contacted was Lt. Johnson who reported the case originally and whose statement is inclosed herewith. The source of Lt. Johnson's information appears to be Mr. Stanley Pickering at Haguenau. He states now that his information dated from before April 1940 in which month 11 or 12 American remains were disinterred at Haguenau.

3. Attention is invited to attached statements.



1. Pursuing a report received thru Lt. Johnson, C.I.P. Strasbourg, a close investigation was held in the cemetery and town of Haguenau, where three American bodies were supposed to be buried.

2. Various persons in cemetery and town were contacted but all stated that no more Americans were buried in or near Haguenau.

3. It is presumed that the information received by Lt. Johnson dated from before 13 and 14 April 1946, on which dates 11 or 12 Americans were disinterred from the cemetery of St. Georges at Haguenau and evacuated to St. Avold, American Military Cemetery.

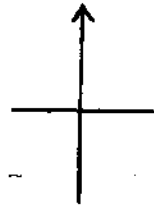
