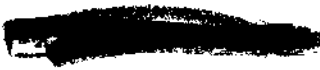

Fearing the mines still being in that forest, the population did not yet bury them.

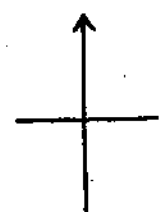
