2. After comparing the tooth chart of the subject unknown decedent with all available dental data on unresolved casualties within the Germany M-49 Area, no reliable comparison could be made that could possibly result in the identification of the deceased.
3. Due to a lack of identifying data it is recommended that this case be declared unidentifiable.

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspid (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found.
