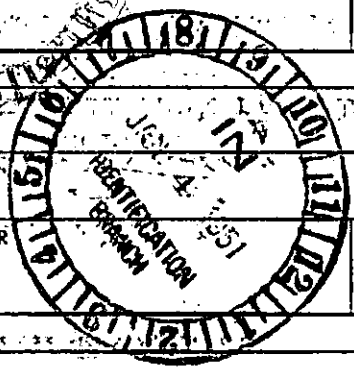
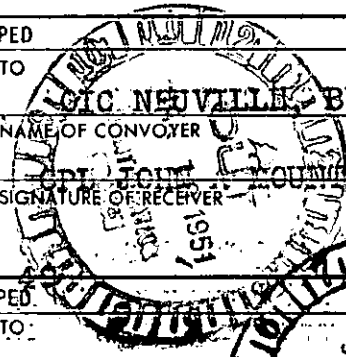

state the following :

I was evacuated during the fights in January 1945 and
came back in May 1945.

In May 1946 an American Command came over here to search Ame-
rican killed soldiers.

They found someone the EBERSBERG and took them away, where,
I don't know.

I was working in the forest on the 20 July 1946 and found
five (5) American bodies, they were not buried.

I informed the American Commanding Officer from the Search Command,
this Command was here in Reipertswiller on the 24.7.46.

I showed the Ebersberg and led the Command to the place.

At this time we found two (2) more bodies of American soldiers.

The bodies were shipped to Strasburg on the 25.7.46

I don't know of any other graves of bodies in the demined area.

I know nothing about the mined area.

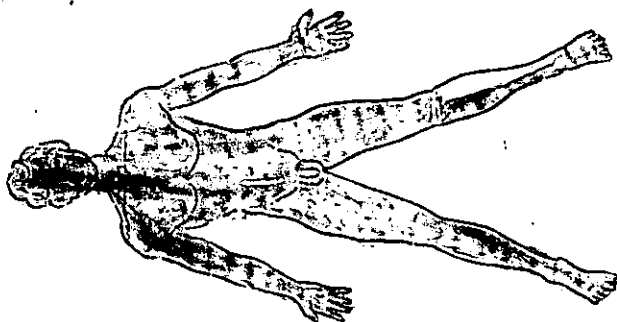

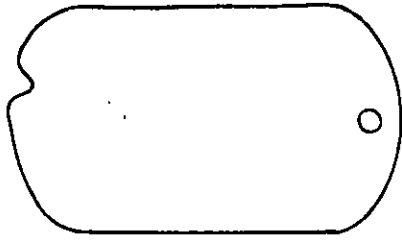


