On the 6th and 7th of September 1945 a mass exhumation of 241 bodies took place in the Jewish cemetery of STOD. It was found out that among these victims of the "Death March", there were nine (9) U.S. Soldiers from parachute regiments, who should have been caught in the district of STOD in April 1945, killed and buried in the common grave on the 15th of April 1945.


No identification was possible; no details about the circumstances of their death.

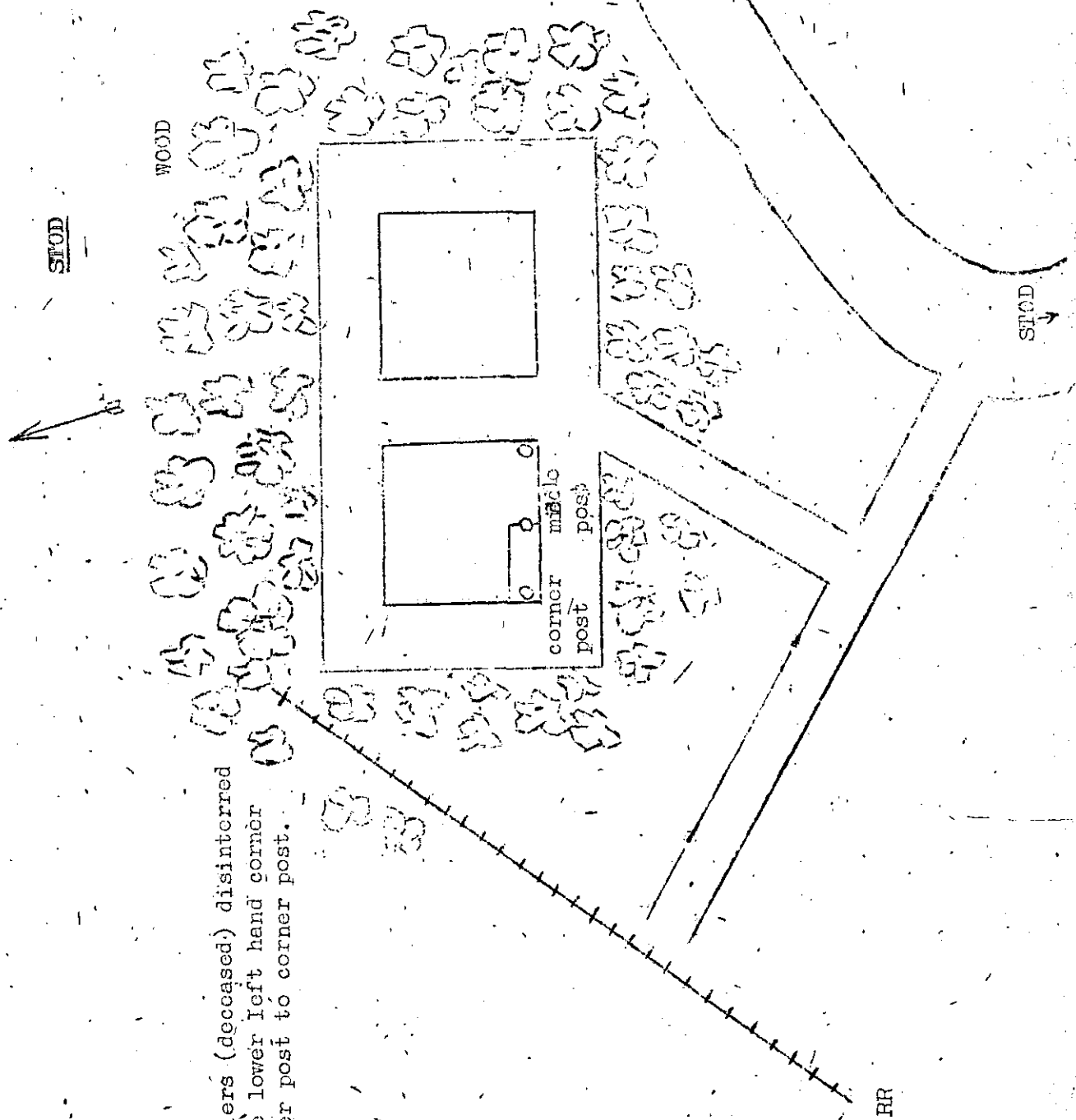
The American soldiers were buried on the 9th September 1945 into a common grave with the consent officer commanding the U.S. military unit at STOD, Captain Moor.

This grave is located in a small wooden area outside the town of STOD, on the left hand side of the road to PILSEN. The coffins with the remains of the U.S. soldiers are placed separately from the other bodies, on the left hand side of the common grave, on the northern side.

Est. height 5'2". This height cannot be any taller. It is possibly an inch shorter but no taller. Tooth #12 (lower left) has a white cement filling on mesial surface of this tooth. It is the opinion of Mr. Gallud, French Civilian, Dental Consultant, that this cement on this tooth is definitely European material. # 13, 14 and 16 lower left, have been extracted. # 13 lower right is extracted. # 12 has filled in the gap of # 13 (on right).

Upper jaw - # 4, 5 and 6 on left side have been extracted but in space for # 4 when this extraction was made a fragment of the root of this tooth remained in the socket and the bone has almost granulated over the root of this tooth.

On the right upper - # 2 has grown through the palate of the mouth. This tooth is missing since death. # 6 and 7 is extracted. # 8 has a badly decayed cavity. All these extractions are old ones.

Bullet wound in the right temple, just underneath the scalp. A bullet was removed, from underneath the scalp which had pierced the skull. Bone fragments show that bullet was fired from left side of head. The region of the right ear there is a smooth hole appears to be definitely a bullet hole. Skull shows several fractures. Examination of bullet shows it to be a steel jacketed. 32 ? cal, copper color. It is of foreign make. Bullet submitted as possible evidence.

Hair is brown, about $\frac{1}{2}$ in. in length. Pair of grey cloth pajama trousers, definitely foreign.

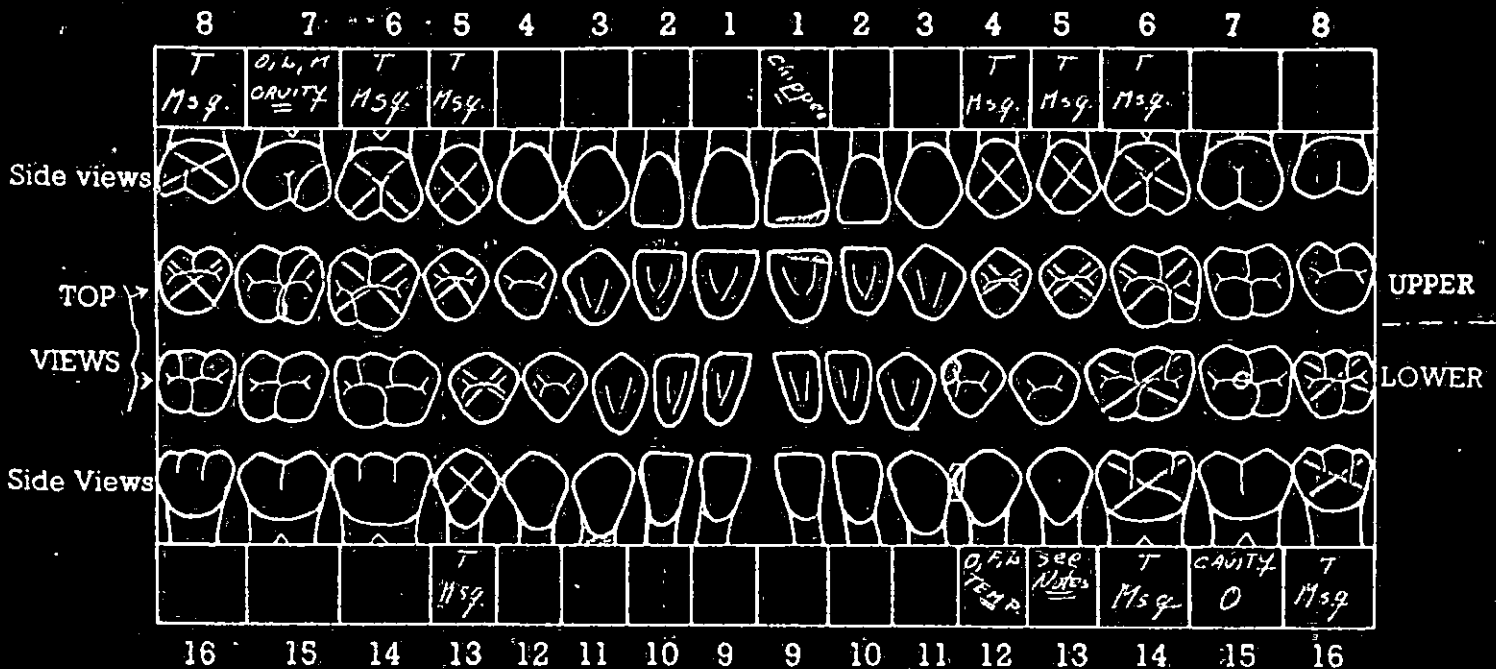

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspid (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. 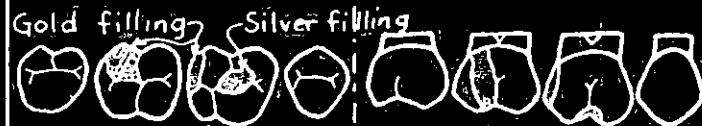
