1. Submitted herewith is the Report of Investigation by this office on Unknown American X-55, KIA on or about 21 September 1944, rank and organization unknown.

2. Following exhibits are attached:

a. Exhibit "A" Joint Statement of two local civilians

3. FACTS:

MACR concerning this case is not available on file in this office.

4. FINDINGS:

a. That an American fighter plane crashed on the hill at the village Nadgradhe near Bryar, Yugo. Co-ords: 44°22'N - 16°23'E.

b. That the plane was identified as a P 38 by means of the engine plate V 1710-91 A-047489 found in the debris. In addition, four machine guns # 1190815, 1190382, 120206, 1294465, were found.

c. That the date of crash is about 21 September 1944 and the time 1200 as stated by the civilians.

d. That the body of the pilot was found in the wreckage badly burned.

e. That the villagers buried the remains near the wreckage.

f. That upon exhumation the charred and broken remains were found. No clothing. No head. Only the following bones recovered: both scapulae, both hips incomplete, sacrum, ulna, radius, upper part of left femur, fragments of left and right tibia and fibula, left tarsal and metatarsal, fragments of ribs and vertebrae. Impossible to take a tooth-chart.

- g. That a golden ring without initials was found.
- h. That individual identification was impossible.
- i. That check list of Unknowns was filled out.

5. COMMENTS:

We are not able to tie up this case with any of MACR available on file in this office.

6. RECOMMENDATIONS:

- a. That the disinterred remains be accepted as those of an Unknown American airman.
- b. That his identification be accomplished by means of engine and machine gun numbers.

7. CONCLUSIONS:

- a. That we have buried the above remains in the U.S. Military Cemetery Belgrade in the following way:

Unknown American X-55 in Plot D Row 22 Grave 544.

- b. That Report of Interment has been prepared and is attached herewith.

of Mamjan Maric, farmer from the village Sipovljani

The plane was flying from North to South. We think it was a fighter, as it was not very big. It caught fire above our village. No parachutists were seen. The plane while flying hit the hill "Jankovic" and scattered around. No other planes were seen. It was probably damaged before, as it started to burn here and crashed. A shoe was found with a foot, than one hand with a ring and some clothing. All this was buried near the plane.

That happened about 21 September 1944 about 12 o'clock. The day was clear. It was said that the plane was American. Some debris are still at the scene of crash, some are taken.
