- 1. Submitted herewith is the Report of Investigation by this office on Unknown American X-76, KIA in March 1945, renk an dergandsetica unknown.
 - 2. Pollowing exhibits are attached:
 - a. Exhibit "A" Joint Statement of two local civilians
 - b. Rehibit "B" Report of Dr. Voja Jovanovic, Civ. Investigator
 - c. Exhibit "C" Letter of British Graves Service Belgrade
 3. FACTS:
- a. MACR concerning this case is not available on file in this office.
 - A. FINDINGS:
- a. That an American fighter plane was shot down by German fighters near the village Possessies, Lebenik, Yugo. Co-orde: 45032'H - 16005'E.
- b. That the crash occurred between 20 and 30 March 1945 at about 1400 hre. as stated by the civilians. They are not able to inform if the plane was a single or double engine one.
- c. That the body of the pilot was found in the wreckage and buried
- by the villagers in the cenetery at Personica.

 d. That the statement of the civilians that the engine from the subject plane had been removed to the reilmay station Pessenies was found not tobe correct as this engine was identified by the British Greros Service as of a British fighter plane which erashed in the vicinity in December 1944 and remains of the deceased British airman were found.
- e. That a civilian verbelly declared having seen the bedy of the deceased American airmen before the burial and remembering that he had an overlapping front tooth in the upper jaw.

- f. That identity papers of the deceased airman were taken by a Partisan efficer who died seen after.
- g. That upon exhumation the remains of an airman were found. According to fragments of elething found on remains it appears to be of an American airman. Complete body, except fingues and toos.
 - h. That a tooth-chart was taken.
 - 1. That individual identification was impossible.
 - j. That Check list of Unknowns was filled out.
- k. That it was impossible to identify the plane as nearly all debris had been removed after the erash.

5. COMMINTS:

- a. There is no MACR on file in this office which sould be associated with this case.
- b. We have contacted British Graves Service at Belgrade conserning the possible identification of the above remains and a statement was secured from them to the effect that these remains do not appear to British.
- e. Records on file in this office indicate that the following airmon flown on fighter places were lost ever Yugoslavia in March 1945:

on 5 March 1945: let It. Albert C. Mathies 0-720095 on 19 March 1945: let Lt. Wilburn R. Brooken 0-711936 on 18 March 1945: Capt. John C. Meidinger 0-743471 Investigation conducted to recover their remains resulted in negative reports. It might be the disinterred remains are of one of them.

d. The eyewitnesses remember the date of erash as their commander was killed ocen after.

6. RECOMMENSATIONS:

- a. That the disinterred remains be accepted as those of an Unknown American airmen.
- b. Tooth-chart taken be compared against the dental records of the above named men, as well as against the others who, were lost in Yugoslavia in March 1945.

7. CONCLUSIONS:

- e. That we have buried the above remains in the U.S. Military Comptony Belgrade as:
 - Unknown American X-76 in Plot E Row 19 Grave 659
- b. That Report of Interment has been prepared and is attached herewith.

STATEMENT

Between 20 and 30 March 1945 we were with the Partisans and our unit was stationed at Pescenica. About 1400 hrs two American planes were flying from South to Borth persued by five German fighters. The fighting, engaged while above Petrinja, continued to Pescenica so that an American shet down a German plane and later the Germans shot down an American plane which crashed near the village. The pilot was killed but the plane was not burning. On the plane we saw the white star. The body was buried by the III Batallion of the Turopoljski Posavski Detachment of 34 Division. The identity papers of the deceased airman were taken by the commanding officer who was killed in action after a few days.

The body was placed in a coffin and buried in the cemetery at Pescenica. We can not recall the exact date but remember that the weather

was nice and clear.

Some parts of the plane are at the station.

The witness Ivan Lomota and Nikola Viljevac made the following statement:

Retween 20 and 30 March 1945, about 1400 hrs. two american planes were flying from South to North above the village Peacenics pursued by five German planes. They were engaged in fighting chove Pescenica and the Germans shot down an American plane, the engine and propellers of which are still today stored at the railway station Pescenica.

That the pilot of the plane was killed and buried by Partisans in the cemetery at Pescenica without a coffin. ...

That Josip Zebic stated that the airmen had an overlapping tooth in the upper jaw.

That the same witness had shown the grave where this airman, was buried.

The engine was found at the railway station and the plate with engine serial number and the number of the propeller was taken off.

In the grave shown by eye-witnesses a body was found without coffin and clothing, only in undershirt and pents. The thigh bone broken, complete head, all teeth preserved, one overlapping tooth in the upper jaw. This body was placed in mattress cover 106 and taken over by the representatives of the American Graves Pagistration Service, Palgrade.

This work begun at 0800 hrs., completed at 1200 hrs.

On, or about the 6th of November 1947, I examined two bodies brought in by A.G.H.U. sea. cher parties.

The first of these bodies was brought from near MARIBOR, date of easualty being 6th of April 1944, and the second, fouth of ZAGREB, date of casualty 20-30th of March 1945.

There were no means of identifying these bodies as British.

By examining our records, we could not tie up any of our casualties with these two unknowns.



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
