3. FAULS:

a. That the plane B-24-N AF Ser. No. 41-14526, piloted by Lt. Charles Stiede was last sighted at the degrees $47^{\circ}56^{\circ}\text{N-}10^{\circ}47^{\circ}\text{E}$, as stated by LACR.

b. That the casualty status of the crew is the following:

4. FINDINGS:

- a. That the subject plane ditched in the Adriatic Sea, 2 miles from the village Fontana, near Porec (Parenzo), Istria, Yugo. Co-ords: 45°10'N 13°37'E.
- b. That all crew members perished in crash except one who was rescued by the local fishers and Germans.
- c. That seven (?) bodies were found after the crash and taken for burial to Fontana, as stated by the local fisherman Pasquale Ipsa.
- d. That this statement is corresponding to information given by a German officer to the only survivor of the crew, F/O Robert O. Levenson, who was captured.
- e. That upon exhumation only the remains of six (6) individuals were found, as stated by Ante Bilin. Four (4) remains were in a common grave, while two (2) other remains were buried in x separate graves each. They are of 2nd Lt. Norman F. Walker and Cpl. Cecil P. Roscoe, according to the information furnished by local authorities.
- f. That remains of Lt. Walker were washed by the sea on 2 August 1945 as stated in report of Ante Bilin. This date appears not to be correct as the remains of Lt. Walker were recovered on 10 August 1945 according to statement of District Committee on file in this office.
- g. That the remains of Cpl. Cecil P. Roscoe were recovered on 10 July 1945 as stated by Ante Bilin.
- h. That the remains of Lt. Walker were identified as "Believed to be"by means of laundry marks *5536" and officers insignia found on clothing. Head missing. Impossible to take a tooth-chart.
- j. That the remains of Cpl. Roscoe were identified as "Believed to be" based on the evidence given by the local authorities that he and Lt. Walker were buried in separate graves. No clothing. Complete skeleton. Tooth-chart taken.
- j. That four tooth-charts were taken for remains found in the common grave. They correspond favorably to the dental records of 2nd Lt. Charles Stiede, F/O Reece F. Davis Jr., Cpl. Vernon J. Collins and Cpl. Burl B. Price as given on QMC Form 37l on file in this office. Information furnished by local authorities indicates that the above four named individuals were buried in this common grave. Therefore these femains were identified as those of 2nd Lt. Charles Stiede, F/O Reece F. Davis Jr., Cpl. Vernon J. Collins and Cpl. Burl B. Price.
- k. That with regard of the evacuation of U.S. Military Cemetery these remains were not given our CIP attention and we did not try to segregate them in representative parts of individual skeletons and find out how many individuals these remains represent.
- 1. That Ante Bilin submitted in an enveloppe five identification tags of the following deceased crew members: 2nd Lt. Charles Stiede, F/O Reece F. Davis Jr., Cpl. Vernon J. Collins, Cpl. Burl B. Price and 2nd Lt. Norman F. Walker and an identification bracelet of Cpl. Vernon J. Collins, without stating whether these identification items were found on the remains during the disinterment or not.

5. COMMENTS:

- a. Investigation and disinterment was done by Ministry of Interior for Croatia.
- b. According to the statement of Pasquale Ipsa and information given by a German officer to F/O Levenson, seven bodies were found after the crash and buried at Fontana. Remains of two other crew members were found on 10 July 1945 and 10 August 1945. Therefore all nine deceased are supposed to be buried at Fontana.
- c. However, Bilin reported that seven Allied airmen were buried at Fontana: six Americans and one British. We are now not able to find out which information is correct. It might be that more then four individuals were buried in the common grave or, what appears more likely, that at Fontana should be another grave with three remains which were not disinterred by Yugoslav authorities.
- d. The identification tags and bracelet listed in Para 4 1, are enclosed herewith.

6. RECOMMENDATIONS:

- a. That the disinterred remains be accepted as those of six deceased crew members.
 - b. That tooth-charts taken be compared against their dental records.

7. CONCLUSIONS:

The witness Pasquale, son of Antun, born 7 April 1904, at Fontana, District Porec, Croatian, fisherman, married, father of three children, residing at Fontana, house No. 94, eyewitness of the crash of an Allied plane which took place on 16 February 1945, made the following statement:

STATSHENT

On 16 February 1945, about 1600 hrs., an Allied four engine bomber plane crashed. The weather was clear, the plane was flying alone from Porec in the direction of Pula. Thile the plane was flying above Porec, the Germans opened fire and hit the plane. That the plane was hit, I concluded from the fact that a first fire broke but of one engine and soon afterwards the whole plane was in flames. The burning plane flew for about two minutes and made crash landing on the sea, towards the middle of Fontana beach, and was floating for about 10 tD 15 minutes. All the time the Germans were firing from the light and heavy machine guns until the plane sunk. I watched this accident from the beach and had intention of going promptly out to the sea to the place of crash, with my brother Guerino Ipsa but the Germans prevented us of going alone and a German came along with us. hen we came to the place where the plane sunk we found an airman who was hard wwimming in the sea. We rescued him and took him in the boat. He had wounds on his head and back. He gave him the first aid, i.e. dressed his wound in so far as we could, but the German was after us to pick out of the sea the equipmend and soon afterwards we turned back to the mainland. This wounded airman had not lost the conscience and started to talk a little, first Englisa, then German, and at last Italian. In Italian we asked him where did he come from and he replied that they were on the way back from a bombing mission over Vienna. Further he went on and stated that they had with them two of the crew dead on board of the plane and the rest of the crew was alive. There were altogether 8 of them on board when the plane ditched into the sea and all died except himself who survived. The German ordered him to stop talking with us and for that reason we did not learn anything else from him. The papers and other personal effects were taken from him by the Germans. He was turned over to the German Command and on the following day ne was transferred to the higher command at Visujan. The name of the commanding officer at Visujan was Fidler. I did not know what happened with this airman afterwards. The second day following the crash we took off in four boats to go to the place where the plane sunk in order to see if some other bodies could be recovered. (The first day following the crash 4 bodies were recovered and brought to mainland.) This time we recovered another three bodies. The Germans were all the time with us and they took everthing. I managed only to take a jacket and two identification

tags which were born on the hand and contained their name and ASN. Nothing else I got in my possession. All the decdased were buried by Sime Krajicar.

This is true statement to the best of my knowledge.

Made on 27 December 1947, at Porec, in connection with the disinterment of remains of American airmen.

- Present: 1. Ciro Dropulic, representative of the Ministry of Interior of the Mational Republic of Crostia

After the examination of eyewitnesses the following was established:

An American four engine plane crashed into the sea on 16 February 1945, near the village Fontana as stated in the attached statement. All crew of eight men was killed except one who was wounded, captured by the Germans and taken to an unknown destination. His fate is not known.

The killed airmen were:

1) Collins, Vernon J. 36672870-T-43-44 BC 2) Price, Eurl B. 17127489-T-43-44 AP 3) Davis, Reece F.Jr. T-134885-T-43-44 OP 4) Stiede, Charles 0-2057449-T-43-44 OP

These four airmen were buried together in one day, i.e. 18 February 1945 in a common grave.

- 5) Walker, Norman F. 0-785536 (-B.324555) T43-44 OP 6) Roscoe, Cecil P: 34772882 T 43-44 O
- Ad 5. This body was buried on 2 August 1945, in a coffin in a separate grave. The head was missing and was not recovered. The body was washed out by the sea without the head and buried. His name was Norman F. Walker.

Ad 6. The body was placed in a coffin and buried on 10 July 1945, in a separate grave.

All above listed bodies were buried in the same cemetery at the village Fontana. The bodies of the above mentioned airmen were disinterred on 27 December 1947, placed in boxes, and taken over by Ante Bilin in order to be turned over to the American Graves Registration Service, Belgrade.

The statements and identification tags with ASE of the airmen are attached to this report. A photograph is also attached but we could not establish to which body it belongs. The statement of the Local Authorities is also attached.

RELAM: Pilot seargeant Edwards crashed into the sea. on 15 October 1944 with a two engine fighter plane. The plane was apparently of British origin, makked with R.A.F. No. 1601981 and was buried in the Fontana cemetery on 16 October 1944. The remains of this airman were taken over by the British team headed by Capt. Bonald Ford on 29 November 1947 and were removed to Belgrade by Capt. Ford.

After having been informed of the facts the commission with the a/n members went to the spot:

On the place shown by the civilians, a male corpse was lying on its back, dressed in uniform, the lower part of the body unclothed. The copps was without head and right fist: The age of the corpse could not be fixed because of the missing parts of the body and rottenness. The length of the corpse 160 cm, from the shoulders to the toes. The body was well nourished.

It is estimated that the man died 6 months ago. The reasons of the death cannot be found. It is believed that the death was caused by crash of the plane, or choking, as too airoplanes have been shot down in the immediate vicinity of this place, about 6 months ago.

According the statements made by the witnesses: ANDJELA IPSA IVANOV, SANTA IPSA IVANOV nad LODOVIC IPSA PASKIN, the corpse was found by them on the 10th of fugust 1945 at about 0700 hours in the sea. They pulled it out to the seaside.

The witness Pasquale Ipsa, son of Antun, born 7 April 1924, at Fontana, District Porec, Croatian, fisherman, married, father of three children, residing at Fontana, house No. 94, eyewitness of the crash of an Allied plane which took place on 16 February 1945, made the following statement:

STATEMENT

On 16 February 1945, about 1600 hrs., an Allied four engine bomber plane crashed. The weather was clear, the plane was flying alone from Porce in the direction of Pula. While the plane was flying above Porce, the Germans opened fire and hit the plane, That the plane was hit, I concluded from the fact that at first fire broke out of one engine and soon afterwards the whole plane was in flames. The burning plane flew for about two minutes and made crash landing on the sea, towards the middle of Fontana beach, and was floating for about 10 to 15 minutes. All the time the Germans were firing from the light and heavy machinemens until the plane sunk. I watched this accident from the beach and had intention of going promptly out to the sea to the place of crash, with my brother Guerino Ipsa but the Germans prevented us of going alone and a German came along with us. When we came to the place where the plane sunk we found an airman who was hard swimming in the sea. We rescued him and took him in the boat. He had wounds on his head and back. He gave him the first aid, i.e. dressed his wound in so far as we could, but the German was after us to pick out of the sea the equipment and soon afterwards we turned back to the mainland. This wounded airman had not lost the conscience and started to talk a little. first English, then German, and at last Italian. In Italian we asked him where did he come from and he replied that they were on the way back from a bombing mission over Visnas. Further he went on and stated that bhey had with them two of the crew dead on board of the plane and the rest of the crew was alive. There were altogether 8 of them on board when the plane disched into the see and all died except himself who survived. The German ordered him to stop talking with us and for that reason we did not learn anything else from him. The papers and other personal effects were taken from him by the Germans. He was turned over to the German Command and on the following day he was transferred to the higher command at Visujan. The name of the commanding officer at Visujan was Fidler. I did not know what happened with this airman afterwards. The second day following the crash we took off in foud boats to go to the place where the plane mank in order to see if some other bodies could be recovered. (The first day following the grash 4 bodies were recovered and brought to mainland.) This time we recovered another three bodies. The Germans were all the time with us and they took everything. I managed only to take a jacket and two identification

After the examination of eyewitnesses the following was established:

An American four engine plane crashed into the sea on 16 February 1945, near the village Fontana as stated in the attached statement. All crew of eight men was killed except one who was wounded, captured by the Germans and taken to an unknown destination. His fite is not known.

The killed airmen were:

1) Collins, Vernon J.	36672870-T-43-44 BC
2) Price, Burl B.	17127489-T-43-44 AP
3) Davis, Reece P.Jr.	T-134885-T-43-44 OP
4) Stiede, Charles	0-2057449-T-43-44 OP

These four airmen were buried together in one day, i.e. 18 February 1945 in a common grave.

- 5) Walker, Norman F. 0-785536 (-B.324555) T43-44 OP 6) Roscoe, Cecil P. 34772882 T 43-44 O
- Ad 5. This body was buried on 2 August 1945, in a coffin ina separate grave. The head was missing and was not recovered. The body was washed out by the sea without the head and buried. His name was Norman P. Walker.

Ad.6. The body was placed in a coffin and buried on 10 July 1945, in a separate grave.

All above listed bodies were buried in the same cemetery at the village Fontana. The bodies of the above-mentioned airmen were disinferred on 27 December 1947, placed in boxes, and taken over by Ante Bilin in order to be turned over to the American Greves Registration Service, Belgrade.

The statements and identification tags with ASN of the airmen are attached to this report. A photograph is also attached but we could not establish to which body it belongs. The statement of the Local Authorities is also attached.

REMARK: Pilot seargeant Edwards erashed into the sea on 15 October 1944 with a two engine fighter plane. The plane was apparently of British origin, marked with R.A.F. No. 1601981 and was buried in the Fontana cometery on 16 October 1944. The remains of this airman were taken over by the Brisith Seam headed by Capt. Donald Ford on 29 November 1947 and were removed to Belgrade by Capt. Ford.



In compliance with your resuccit, I quote below the text of Note No. 427125 dated December 30, 1947, from the kinistry of Foreign Affairs. This Note was delivered to the Emblasey on December 31, 1947.

- "The Ministry of Foreign Affairs presents its compliments to the Embassy of the United States of America and has the honour to make the following communications:
- "On December 2), 1947 the Yugoslav authorities handed over to the US Graves Registration Service the bodies of 13 American airmen, fallen in Yugoslavia.
- " According to the data available to the Yugoslav authorities there are in Yugoslavia no more bodies of personnel of the US Army, Navy or Air-Forces, fallen during the war, between 1941 and 1945 in the struggle against the Germans and their allies. The only exception is the one body interred in one of the 12 common German graves at Konjie, but its identification appears impossible.
- "After the bodies of the 15 faller US airmen had been transported to the Cometery at Kosutnjak the disinterment on the territory of the Federative People's Republic of Yugoslavia is terminated.
- "Inasmuch as at a later date some cases, up to now unknown both to the US Graves Registration Service and to the Jugoslav authorities, would be discovered by further investigation and inquiries which the Yugoslav authorities will continue with, the boodes will be disinterred and transported to the place determined by the Erbarsy. The same procedure would be applied to the body of the US airman at the Cometery at Konjie if its identification succeeded.
- "Since accordingly the activity of the US Graves Registration Service in Yugoslavia is terminated, the ministry of Foreign Affairs has the honour to request the Embassy to take action in accordance with the Agreement of May 10, 1947 in connection with the Note of the Digison Section of the Ministry of National Defense No. 786 of May 14, 1947 and the letter of the US Graves Registration Service of May 21, 1947.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the Embassy the assurance of its high consideration.







It is suggested that this case be disapproved and that the remains of BTB: Roscoe, Cecil P., buried in USMC Belgrade, Yugo. Plot-E, Row-21, Grave 673 be designated as "UNKNOWN".

This suggestion for disapproval is based on the following:

(a) Three separate tooth charts for subject remains are in conflict with each other, and none of which compares too favorably with dental records of Cpl. Gunter. In making comparison the Field Board has ignored the most recent tooth chart but accepted the earlier charts.

(b) CIL Reports of 10 Feb. 48 and 8 June 48 are in disagreement as to height estimate and bone measurements, neither of which compares favorably with Cpl. Gunter's height. The Field Board has ignored both height and age comparison

in their recommendation for identifying the remains as Cpl. Gunter.

(c) The remains in E=21-673 was originally identified as BTB: Roscoe, Cecil P. on the basis of a Report submitted by the Ministry of Interior for Crotia who did the investigation and disinterment. Since no substantiating evidence was presented, it is not known by what means they made the identification. There is no evidence as to where these remains were originally recovered. The Field has stated that these remains were disinterred from Fontana on 12 Jan. 48 whereas the Report from the Ministry of Interior states they were disinterred on 27 Dec. 47.

In connection with this case, it is suggested that new forms 371 be accomplished (based on additional information now available) on the remaining unidentified crew members and forwarded to the Field.

- (1) Three tooth charts for subject remains dated 12 Jan. 48, 10 Feb. 48 and 8 June 48 are in conflict with each other. Comparison of these charts with Army dental records of Cpl. Gunter are unfavorable.
- (2) CIL Reports dated 10 Feb.48 and 8 June 48 estimates the height of subject remain to be 5.83/4 and 5.75/8 respectively, neither of which compares favorably with Cpl. Gunter's Height of 5.11.
- (3) CIL Report of 10 Feb. 48 states that one heavy cowhide belt(possibly German) was found with remains. CIL Report of 8 June 48 states that a Garrison belt was found.
- (4) Statements of civilians and enemy records are favorable only in establishing the date and place of death and that other deceased crew members were recovered and buried in the cemetery at Fontano, Yugo.
- (5) Statement of F/O Levenson, the only surviving crew member, is favorable only in establishing date, place and cause of death.

The remains of Unknown X-81323 were originally identified as "BTB: Roscoe, Cecil P.", a crew member of A/C 41-28607, which crashed in the Adriatic Sea 16 Feb 45, near the Yugoslavian coast. These remains were subsequently identified by the Field Board as those of another crew member, Cpl. Gailon G. Gunter. These findings were disapproved by this Office and Board notified 29 Oct 48. See letter attached.

Subject Findings recommend X-81323 be declared Non-Identifiable and four crew members be declared Non-Recoverable. A/C 41-28607 had a crew of 10, of whom one is EUS, five have been postively identified. Copples of tooth charts of the five identified, attached, confirm the identification.

Tooth chart of X-81523 does not compare favorably with four crew members still unidentified or not recovered.

Exhibit "G" of Findings reports investigation of the crash in detail. German records, referred to on page 2, sub-paragraph (f) (l) and (2) evidently refer to ME 2866. ME 2866 appears in two sections, one reporting death of four crew members and one POW (now EUS) and the other repeats names of the four, the POW and adds 5 more names, four of whom were crew members of A/C 41-28607. The name "Cpl. Pearson" is also listed as dead but there is no such name on MACR for A/C 41-28607. This however may account for the fact that tooth chart of X-81323 does not compare with the four missing crew members. Records in this Office do not show recovery of a "Cpl. Pearson" in Yugoslavia either as a "BTB" or "Tent".

Tooth charts of other unknowns recovered in Yugoslavia, now listed as unidentifiable, do not compare favorably with 4 unrecovered crew members. It is suggested that a duplicate of SIP Report for X-81323 be retained in the Section files for possible future association with missing AAF personnel.
