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EYEWITNESS ACCOUNT

I, Reinhold W. Vergen, 0-826035, was flying as pilot of Aircraft No. 42-107124 on a mission to Sterkrade, Germany on 22 January 1945. Just after the target, Lt Goldsborough, who was flying on my left, suddenly veered to the left, flew level for a few minutes, and then went into a steep climb. Then he leveled out and went off on a west heading which should have brought him to Belgium. His plane was under control after he leveled off from the climb. I saw no parachutes and heard nothing over VHF. It is impossible to say what the reason for his leaving the formation was, since there were no visible signs of damage to his ship. Flak was heavy in the area, however, and damage may have been done internally somewhere.

I was flying waist gunner on this day, when the pilot gave the order to bail out we were directly above the canadian - German front, and I immediately went to the waist door and pulled the emergency release and ticked the door out. I looked back and san the radiooperator behind me and the ball-turnet guller was leaving his turnet and securing his parachute. Everyone in the year of the aircraft were uninjured and failed out. After we all assembled as berneau prisoners that night, we knew nothing of Sgt. Shirts excepting that he was the last one to leave the aircraft (if he did leave) and that the next to last one to leave said that skirts was concious and also nodded approva! to kail out after he saw the others leave. According to a letter received by the land dians, they stated that nine parachutes were seen in the air, and that no bodies were found in the ureckage of the aircraft. Therefore, it is quite probable that shirts did bail out.

Any hearsay information: Yes. Canadian soldiers that were captured trying to rescue me and my co-pilot said that they saw nine chutes come out of the pishe. There ere two Canadian soldiers. Also German soldiers said that they saw nine chutes open.

Any explanation of his fate based in part or wholly on supposition: I don't believe
he bailed out because I watched the plane from the time my chute opened until the
plane crashed into the ground and I saw no chutes above me nor did I see any after I wax hit the ground. I lended in a trench in no-man's land between the German army and the Canadian army and was injured. At approximately fifteen or twenty minutes later I was captured and at no time did I see any more parachutes coming down.
Total number of missions of above crew member: I think about fifteen or sixteen.
